

A letter from our pastor, Father Matt

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

The question asked in today's Gospel reading is, "Lord, to whom shall we go?". Because the crowds had a difficult time accepting Jesus' teaching that He Himself is the Bread of Life, "many of his disciples returned to their former way of life and no longer accompanied him. Jesus then said to the Twelve, 'Do you also want to leave?' Simon Peter answered him, 'Master, to whom shall we go? You have the



words of eternal life." To whom shall we go? Do we go to Jesus and listen to His words which bring everlasting life?

This leads us to ask: how can we hear Him? Jesus is not silent. He continues to speak and work. He speaks His words of mercy to us in the confessional. His offering on the cross out of love for us is spoken through the priest in every Mass and present in the Eucharist for our spiritual nourishment. He speaks to us through Sacred Scripture and Tradition. He even speaks to the depths of our hearts in prayer. His commandment to love one another can be heard echoing through the works of mercy and charity of every Christian in their daily lives. In a noisy world, with all of its distractions, Jesus is still speaking.

Every soul yearns for our Lord. However, it can be difficult to hear Him. To hear the words of Christ, they must be spoken, proclaimed. The proclamation of the Gospel is called evangelization (The Latin word for Gospel is evangelium, which means "the Good News".). It is the mission of every parish and every Christian to proclaim the Good News of Jesus Christ in words and actions. Our encounter with Christ ought to transform us, give us life, and bear great fruit—as Pope Francis has said, "Good always tends to spread" (Evangelii Gaudium, 9). Perhaps some of us are uncomfortable with the term evangelization because we associate it with knocking on doors and arguing. It is something much more than that; it is a sharing of the Good News, the Good News of our Lord who has given us grace and transformed our lives. Our mission is to proclaim the Good News of Jesus Christ and to help one another encounter Christ. We encounter Christ first through the sacraments and then through the Bible, prayer, catechesis, works of charity, and in the communal life of the Church. To help me discern ways we can continue to be brought closer to Christ and invite others to hear, know, and love Jesus through the Parish of St. John the Baptist, I have formed an Evangelization Committee. The committee and I have been meeting to assess where the parish is effective and how we can improve and strengthen the parish as a place where we can remain close to our Lord, listen to Him, and allow His words to transform us and echo through the words, activities, and actions of the parish. Feel free to speak with members of this committee after the Masses this weekend.

Know of my continued prayers for you, and please continue to remember me and one another in your prayers.

HOUSEHOLDS IN GOD'S SERVICE

In the ancient world, "household" was a widereaching concept. When Joshua today speaks of his household serving the Lord, he meant not just those people who lived inside his walls or those related to him by blood or marriage; he meant slaves or servants and their families, and anyone indebted to him in any way. Even his livestock and other possessions would be consecrated to service of God. In our world, we value allowing individuals their freedom to choose how they live, and wouldn't think of offering our pets to the service of God. But, as we discern our vocation as disciples baptized into Christ, we can come to realize how far-ranging the "households" of our lives still are: how we act toward our spouses, children, roommates or anyone we live with; our behavior with neighbors; or in public as we encounter many "strangers" every day in stores or traffic who suddenly are "next door" to us. How can we use our time, our resources, or gifts for selfless reasons rather than personal gain? No matter what life our witness to the Good News calls us to, we all have a "household" that must be consecrated to service of the Lord our God


54-Day Rosary Novena

Parish Collections

Abram tithed (giving at least 10%) as a symbol that he depended totally on God. Moses said tithing was holy and an act of worship. Yes, even Jesus talked about money because money is a necessary part of our lives and it is also a necessary part of the viability of the church. Our tithe is merely a way to recognize that. 




