This Saturday, August 15, we celebrate the Assumption of Mary into Heaven. Usually this is a Holy Day of Obligation, but because the 15th falls on a Saturday, there is no obligation to attend Mass that day. Mass will be offered per usual at 8:30 AM in the Church, and signups will be necessary as we are anticipating a larger crowd than a typical morning Mass. So even though you are not obligated to attend Mass, we remember that love begins where obligation ends! So I encourage you to come to celebrate the Assumption with us as an act of love towards our Blessed Mother.

Also, starting next weekend and continuing through August, we will celebrate First Communion for our grade school and religious education students. While it is happening a few months later than expected, these will be wonderful celebrations where the children will receive Jesus in the Eucharist for the first time. Receiving the Eucharist is such a gift that we so often take for granted. The Living God, the Creator and Sustainer of the world, loves us so much that He desires to come and dwell in our heart. He doesn't want to just watch us from Heaven. He doesn't want to live merely among us. He wants to come live within us! We become living tabernacles! In the Church, we always have the red sanctuary lamp lit, which is the candle silently announcing to the world that Jesus is present there. After we receive the Eucharist, someone should follow us around with a sanctuary lamp, to announce that Jesus is living within us! St. Mother Teresa would say: "Jesus has made Himself the Bread of Life to give us life. Night and Day, He is there. If you really want to grow in love, come back to the Eucharist." Let us pray for our children, as they prepare for First Communion, that their hearts may be transformed by the Eucharist, the sacrament of love. And let us be great examples to the children of our parish so that they might see true love and reverence for Jesus in the Most Blessed Sacrament.

In Christ, Fr. Jim Este sábado 15 de agosto, celebramos la Asunción de María al Cielo. Por lo general, este es un Día Santo de Obligación, pero como el día 15 cae en sábado, no hay obligación de asistir a Misa ese día. También, comenzando el próximo fin de semana y continuando hasta agosto, celebraremos la Primera Comunión para nuestros estudiantes de educación primaria y educación religiosa. Mientras que está sucediendo unos meses más tarde de lo esperado, estas serán celebraciones maravillosas donde los niños recibirán a Jesús en la Eucaristía por primera vez. Recibir la Eucaristía es un regalo que a menudo damos por sentado. El Dios Viviente, el Creador y Sustentador del mundo, nos ama tanto que desea venir y morar en nuestro corazón. Él no solo quiere mirarnos desde el cielo. Él no quiere vivir simplemente entre nosotros. ¡Él quiere venir a vivir dentro de nosotros! Nos convertimos en tabernáculos vivientes! En la Iglesia, siempre tenemos encendida la lámpara roja del santuario, que es la vela que silenciosamente anuncia al mundo que Jesús está presente allí. ¡Después de recibir la Eucaristía, alguien debería seguirnos con una lámpara del santuario para anunciar que Jesús está viviendo dentro de nosotros! Santa Madre Teresa diría: "Jesús se ha hecho el pan de vida para darnos vida. Noche y día, Él está allí. Si realmente quieres crecer en el amor, vuelve a la Eucaristía ". Please know that we are working very hard to implement our plan for the safety and well-being of all, and we can't wait for school to start with in person learning on Wednesday, August 19, 2020." ~Joanne Policht, St. John's School Principal

Dear Pastors and Principals (Presidents) of our Catholic Schools:

I am very pleased to advise you that our plans are moving forward with full speed to open our Catholic Schools next month.

Our efforts are based on <u>SAFETY</u> and <u>ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE</u> in the context of <u>CATHOLIC IDENTITY</u>.

I. <u>SAFETY:</u> In keeping with our responsibility in opening our schools in the context of Coronavirus, the following will be required without compromise. As with our Churches, WE CANNOT fulfill our charge without providing the safest environment possible for our teachers, students, administrative personnel or other employees.

Thus, it will be required:

- 1) To utilize masks throughout the school
- 2) Maintaining six-foot social distancing
- 3) Regular hand washing and sanitizing the school daily
- 4) Temperature check each morning

It is recognized that some may have different opinions about these measures. Nonetheless, they are universally advocated by recognized experts and medical scientists. We want to protect all to the very best of our ability.

II. ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE IN THE CONTEXT OF CATHOLIC IDENTITY

As has been their practice, the schools will do all possible to retain the standards of Academic rigor, to enable the students to grow and achieve their intellectual capacity. Catholic culture and formation will continue to be the context in which the education is imparted.

I am very grateful to Dr. Michael Boyle, Superintendent of Schools, his team and the dedicated Principals, teachers, and volunteers who are spending enormous time in achieving this possibility of re-opening our schools. They enjoy my unwavering support.

WHY IS A TAX CREDIT BETTER THAN A DEDUCTION?

A tax credit is always better than a tax deduction because a credit lovers your tax bill directly. A deduction lowers your adjusted gross income on your IRS Form 1040, so the amount you get reduced off your tax bill is directly tied to your tax bracket.

Example: Tax Credit vs. Tax Deduction

For example, if you make a \$1,000 Tax Credit Scholarship donation you receive a \$750 tax credit which lowers your tax owed to Illinois by \$750. Simple as that. If your tax bill was going to be \$3,000, you just reduced it to \$2,250.

However, what would happen if that was a deduction on your IRS Form 1040 and not a tax credit? A \$1,000 deduction, if you are in the 22% tax bracket, will lower your adjusted gross income by \$1,000, thereby lowering your tax bill by about \$220. In this scenario, we also assume that the taxpayer is itemizing their deductions. If the taxpayer takes the standard deduction (\$12,400 if filing single or \$24,800 if married filing jointly), then the \$1,000 donation would not provide any tax

CATHOLICS FOR LIFE

Pioneer pro-life advocate Virginia Evers, the creator of the Precious Feet lapel pin, died July 17 at the age of 99. Virginia and her husband Evers also started Heritage House '76, proceeds from which supported a home for unwed mothers and a local crisis pregnancy service. It is now one of largest providers of Pro-Life material in the world. "Eternal rest grant unto to them Oh Lord and



let perpetual light shine upon them, may their souls and the souls of all the faithfully departed, through the mercy of God rest in peace."

The U.S. Supreme Court handed down several rulings on Life and Religious Freedom in July.

In the opinion of Our Lady of Guadalupe School v. Morrissey-Berru the court overturned a lower court ruling and ruled religious institutions should have the final word over their personnel and their operations.

In the opinion on June Medical Services v. Russo it struck down the Louisiana law that required doctors at abortion facilities to have admitting privileges at a local hospital within a 30-minute radius.

In the seven-year legal battle of the Little Sisters of the Poor to receive a religious exemption from the Affordable Care Act's contraception mandate the court affirmed 7-2 that the Trump administration did have the authority to exempt the sisters from being compelled to cover contraceptives for their employees. Unfortunately, the court's decision left the door open for continued litigation against the exemption, from the states, and Pennsylvania Attorney General Josh Shapiro and Democratic presidential candidate Joe Biden signaled that they would continue to fight the decision.


