


DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY

Divine Mercy Sunday is the Sunday after Easter, April 24th. There will be a service at 3:00 pm in the Chapel.

The message and devotion to Jesus as The Divine Mercy, is based on the writings of Saint Faustina Kowalska, an uneducated Polish nun who, in obedience to her spiritual director, wrote a diary of about 600 pages recording the revelations she received about God's mercy. Even before her death in 1938, the devotion to The Divine Mercy had begun to spread

On June 29, 2002, the Apostolic Penitentiary of the Holy See promulgated a decree creating new indulgences that may be gained by the faithful in connection with the celebration of Divine Mercy Sunday. This decree grants a plenary indulgence to those who comply with all the conditions established, and a partial indulgence to those who incompletely fulfill the conditions. It is allowed for one to go to Confession up to 20 days, before or after Divine Mercy Sunday and still receive the indulgences.



First Eucharist Workshop!

If you happened to pass our complex on Saturday March 5th, you may have wondered "what is going on at SJB!"

It was our First Eucharist Workshop! It was a morning where the children/teens preparing to receive First Communion were able to spend the morning with their parents as they learned so many new things related to their upcoming celebration, April 30th!

The morning began with Fr. Chris explaining why we Catholics believe the consecrated host is the true Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus Christ, not just a symbol, as other denominations believe. And because we believe this to be true, we believe our Church is a holy place, a place where Jesus resides. And why when we pass in front of the tabernacle, we genuflect or bow to show our respect and love of Jesus!

The group was divided into four groups, where they visited five sites: (and the volunteers who helped out)

Bread making: the children were given a container to mix the ingredients for bread; mixed here to bring home to bake. If you see any of these children ask them about their personalized spoon! They then could share with family at their next meal, just like Jesus did at the Last Supper. (Meghan, Victoria, Viviana, Icela and Isabella)

Plate decorating: each child was given a plate to decorate, using stencils of the chalice, host, grapes, hearts and bible. These were baked and will become their keepsake of their special day. (Debbi, Elle, Alina and Victoria)

Chapel/church tour: Deacon Brian walked the families through the chapel and sacristy, explaining all the statues, vessels, vestments, windows, and everything used during Mass. Moms and dads very much enjoyed this part, maybe more than our kiddo's. (Deacon Brian and Heidi)

Video: families watched a portion of a video that described the hours leading to and the Last Supper. (Vincent and Mrs. Neumann)

Music: our last site was learning our music for First Eucharist! (Mrs Rose and Mrs. Stroner)

ALEX'S PROJECT-CARE BAGS FOR THE HOMELESS!

Born in a small town in Siberia, Alex McCall was adopted at seven years old and came to West Chicago in 2003 to live with his forever family. For the first seven years of his life he didn't have much and was thrilled to come to all the comforts of home. Alex became an active member in his church, St. John the Baptist, school, and Boy Scouts where he received his Eagle Scout award. He enjoyed participating in many service projects that benefited others. Since he knows how it feels to have nothing, he has always wanted to give back and pay forward. When he started working, he decided to take some of his pay and help stock the shelves of the Ronald McDonald House. That was the beginning of the "Alex Project". Each year there is a different beneficiary. His project has donated toys to Shriner's Hospital, Ronald McDonald, and Central DuPage Hospital. This is the sixth annual project – making Care Bags for the homeless. He did the same project in 2021 and there was such a need for help he decided to repeat the project. With everyone's help, each Care Bag is filled with new socks, gloves, hat, hand warmers, face mask, sanitizer, toothpaste and brush, and other toiletries. There are special bags made for the children with extra items just for kids. The students of St. John's Religious Education help decorate and fill these bags. Last year over 500 bags were distributed to organizations that help the needy. PADS, Hesed house, Midwest Veterans Shelter, Elmwood Park Veterans Shelter, Wayne Township, Milton Township, DuPage County Sherriff and various police departments.

With everyone's continued help and support, this project will be a great success and help many people who are having a difficult time. Larson House, which houses the homeless Vets.



a Vet has just picked up her supplies.


