

LOVE AS GOD LOVES

Our Gospel today continues Jesus' Sermon on the Plain, in which we heard Luke's version of the Beatitudes. This week, Jesus gives us new "commandments," telling us how to live and act in the world as his disciples, rooted in the radical love of God for humanity. It reminds us of his later speech about loving one another as he loves us, in other words with a God-like love, the kind we see in today's psalm about God's mercy. How else could we do as Jesus tells us by loving our enemies, which seems impossible, until we remember that God gave us the example of Jesus, who is like God but also like us? David understands this merciful love when he spares the life of his enemy in the first reading. Finally, Paul tells us that we will become like Jesus if we act as he did, as God does.

COME ENCOUNTER JESUS AT ST. JOHN!

Eucharistic Adoration is held every Thursday from 6:00 p.m.-9:00 p.m. in the Chapel. Beginning Thursday, March 3rd, Adoration hours will be expanded to 12 hours, from 7:30 am, following the 7:00 am Mass, to 8:00 pm.

WHAT IS EUCHARISTIC ADORATION?

Eucharistic adoration is the act of worshipping God as He is present in the consecrated Eucharist. Since the Last Supper, when Jesus broke the bread and distributed the wine, saying, "This is my Body" and "This is my Blood", Catholics have believed that the bread and wine are no longer merely baked wheat and fermented grape juice, but the actual living presence of the Second Person of the Trinity. Spending time before the Blessed Sacrament, in prayer and devotion, is exactly the same as spending time before the living God. Adoration occurs whenever someone kneels in front of a tabernacle that contains the Blessed Sacrament, genuflects towards a tabernacle, bows before receiving the Blessed Sacrament at Mass, or, in a more focused way, when the Blessed Sacrament is exposed for adoration. 



Baptisms

BISHOP BLANCHETTE SCHOLARSHIP SPONSORED BY JDCCW THROUGH CCW AT ST. JOHN'S

Dear Parents of 8th-11th Graders planning to attend a Joliet Diocesan Catholic High School for the 2022-2023 School Year:

Each year, our Joliet Diocese CCW offers a scholarship to a student who will be attending one of the following Catholic High Schools next school year: Benet Academy, Lisle; Bishop McNamara High School, Kankakee; IC Catholic Prep, Elmhurst; Joliet Catholic Academy, Joliet; Montini Catholic High School, Lombard; Providence Catholic High School, New Lenox; St. Francis High School, Wheaton. The students must:

- Have a financial need:
- Student must actively attend a Catholic Parish in the Diocese of Joliet with an active Council of Catholic Women (St. John's has an active CCW);
- The scholarship includes a one-time stipend to be paid directly to the student's high school based on funds available for the calendar year.

Applications for the JDCCW Bishop Blanchette Scholarship are now available to be completed; contact the St. John's Parish Office, 630-668-0918, ext 600 or email, jenniferk@stjohnwinfield.org. The deadline for the completed application is Thurs, March 17, 2022 to the parish office. (Please request an application as soon as possible; part of the application required a pastor letter and a signed statement from the principal or Director of Religious Education.)

FACTS must be applied for online at: https://online.factsmgt.com/signin/4FV06. Request to be added to the Joliet Diocesan Council of Catholic Women-BBSF FACTS ID#32463. If the family has already submitted a FACTS application for the upcoming year for another award, they are still eligible for the JDCCW-BBSF scholarship. Only one application needs to be submitted to FACTS at their online site. If you have any questions regarding FACTS, call: 1-866-412-4637. DO NOT SEND the FACTS application to the JDCCW office. There is a \$35.00 fee for the FACTS application that needs to be submitted to FACTS at the time of application, along with a copy of the family's 2020 Income Tax report. The JDCCW does not see any of your financial information.


