

From the Chancellor, Diocese of Joliet LENTEN REGULATIONS

1. Everyone 14 years of age or over is bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent. 2. All from the age of 18 years up to the beginning of their 60th year are bound to fast on Ash Wednesday & Good Friday.

3. On these two days of fast and abstinence, only one full meatless meal is allowed. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted on these two days, but liquids, including milk and fruit juices are allowed. When health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige.

4. To disregard completely the law of fast and abstinence is seriously sinful.

5. Lent is the principal season of penance in the Church year. All of the faithful are strongly urged to develop and follow a program of voluntary self-denial (in addition to following the Lenten regulations), serious prayer, and a performance of works of charity and mercy.


6. Those who are sick, pregnant, nursing, or whose health would adversely be affected by fasting or abstinence, should not consider themselves bound by these norms.

WHAT IS EUCHARISTIC ADORATION?

Eucharistic adoration is the act of worshipping God as He is present in the consecrated Eucharist. Since the Last Supper, when Jesus broke the bread and distributed the wine, saying, "This is my Body" and "This is my Blood", Catholics have believed that the bread and wine are no longer merely baked wheat and fermented grape juice, but the actual living presence of the Second Person of the Trinity. Spending time before the Blessed Sacrament, in prayer and devotion, is exactly the same as spending time before the living God. Adoration occurs whenever someone kneels in front of a tabernacle that contains the Blessed Sacrament, genuflects towards a tabernacle, bows before receiving the Blessed Sacrament at Mass, or, in a more focused way, when the Blessed Sacrament is exposed for adoration. BLESSING OF THROATS FOR THE FEAST DAY OF ST. BLAISE

Pictured here are some of the Religious Education students receiving the St. Blaise blessing from Father Chris.

Here is a short explanation that might explain the connection of why we bless throats and the candles.

St. Blaise was born to rich and noble parents, and received a Christian education. He was a physician before being consecrated a bishop at a young age. At that time, the local community usually nominated a man to be a bishop based on his outstanding holiness and leadership qualities; he, in turn, was then examined and consecrated by other bishops with the approval of the Holy Father. Therefore, St. Blaise must have been a great witness of our faithful. St. Blaise, receiving a divine command, moved from the town and lived as a hermit in a cave. Wild animals visited, and he healed any that were sick and wounded. One day, a group of hunters gathering wild beasts for the amphitheater discovered St. Blaise and seized him. As he was being taken to the governor, Agricolaus, Blaise encountered a woman whose pig was being seized by a wolf; St. Blaise commanded the wolf to release the pig, and it was freed unhurt.

While in prison, he miraculously cured a small boy who was choking to death on a fishbone lodged in his throat. Also, the woman whose pig had been saved brought St. Blaise candles so that his cell would have light and he could read the sacred Scriptures.

One reason for St. Blaise's popularity was he was a physician who cured, even performed miraculous cures. Thus, those who were sick, especially with throat ailments, invoked his intercession. Eventually the custom of the blessing of throats arose, whereby the priest held two crossed candles over the heads of the faithful or touched their throats with them while he invoked the prayer of the saint and imparted God's blessing. In our present *Roman Ritual*, the priest prays, "Through the intercession of St. Blaise, bishop and martyr, may God deliver you from every disease of the throat and from every other illness, in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit." This practice continues in many parishes on St. Blaise's feast day. *~Catholic Education Resource Center*





Dear Parents of 8th-11th Graders planning to attend a Joliet Diocesan Catholic High School for the 2022-2023 School Year: Each year, our Joliet Diocese CCW offers a scholarship to a student who will be attending one of the following Catholic High Schools next school year: Benet Academy, Lisle; Bishop McNamara High School, Kankakee; IC Catholic Prep, Elmhurst; Joliet Catholic Academy, Joliet; Montini Catholic High School, Lombard; Providence Catholic High School, New Lenox; St. Francis High School, Wheaton. The students must have a financial need; student must actively attend a Catholic Parish in the Diocese of Joliet with an active Council of Catholic Women (St. John's has an active CCW); The scholarship includes a one-time stipend to be paid directly to the student's high school based on funds available for the calendar year. Only one application needs to be submitted to FACTS at their online site. If you have any questions regarding FACTS, call: 1-866-412-4637. DO NOT SEND the FACTS application to the JDCCW office. There is a \$35.00 fee for the FACTS application that needs to be submitted to FACTS at the time of application, along with a copy of the family's 2020 Income Tax report. The JDCCW does not see any of your financial information.
