As of August 30, in accordance with the Diocese of Joliet, parishioners do not have to sign up for Mass. Full capacity inside our Church and Chapel is allowed. There will be a section in Church (if you are facing the altar, the section is to the extreme right, along north wall) to sit if you feel more comfortable social distancing. We will continue to refrain from offering blood of Christ in a chalice at Communion for the time being. If you would like to receive Communion on the tongue, please wait until the end and please receive from the priest celebrant of the Mass in compliance with the Diocese of Joliet. The bishop's dispensation to attend Sunday Mass remains in place for the time being.







We have reached the end of January. A month filled with Masses, prayers, sacrifices, and marches for an end to abortion, and with high hopes that the Federal law allowing abortion may soon be reversed. The Mass for Life was held on Sunday 1/16 at the Cathedral of St. Raymond and Bishop Hicks was the presider. The Catholic bishops of the United States designated January 22 as a particular day of prayer and penance, called the "Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children." The annual Respect Life Novena was held from January 19 -27. Chicago's March for Life was held on Saturday January 9th. and thousands marched. And the march that started it all, the Washington D.C. march was held on January 21st. One of the last marches of the month was held yesterday 1/29 in Glen Ellyn and several parishioners from our parish joined it. Masses, penance, praying and marches, all for Life, a great way to spend the month.

We must have hope. We are told that the Word came into the world as light in the darkness and the darkness did not overcome it... The darkness of death, the darkness of abortion, will be overcome by hope and by faith – your hope, your faith. And we have reason for hope... look at you – there is our hope. Look at the wonder of you, so many of you, after years and years and years of marching, and praying, and sacrificing, at your own expense, freezing in the cold, walking in the snow, praying the rosary outside clinics...it is you who are the hope of the world, you who are the light of the world in today's darkness, so we must have hope – you are the reason for the hope."
