

### FROM THE DEACON'S DESK/DESDE EL ESCRITORIO DEL DIÁCONO

Hello St. John's!

We're already at the middle of July, but I wanted to jump back to the end of June. In my previous two articles, I talked about Sts. John Fisher and Thomas More, and also our patron, St. John the Baptist. On June 29<sup>th</sup>, the Church also celebrated the feast of the great Saints Peter and Paul. These two Saints are giants of the faith. We cannot understand the Catholic faith without them!

St. Peter, as many of us know, was a Jewish fisherman, who began following the Lord Jesus after a powerful miracle. Jesus appointed him head of the Apostles, famously telling him, "I will give you the keys to the kingdom of heaven." Today, we honor St. Peter as our first Pope. St. Peter, of course, is famous for denying Jesus three times. Yet, in spite of this, Jesus forgives and restores him. Peter later goes to Rome, where, tradition tells us, he was executed upside down, considering himself unworthy to die in the same manner as Jesus. Today, St. Peter's Basilica stands over the grave of St. Peter.

St. Paul on the other hand, has a much different story. He never encountered Jesus during his earthly life. As a Pharisee, St. Paul was very zealous for the Jewish faith, and saw Christians as a threat. He persecuted them, and was even responsible for some of their executions. One day as Paul was traveling to Damascus to persecute the growing Church, Jesus appeared to him. Paul had a powerful conversion experience, and became one of the greatest evangelists in the Church. He made four famous missionary journeys, planting the seeds of the Church all throughout the Mediterranean world. Because of this, he is sometimes called the Apostle to the Gentiles. Like St. Peter, St. Paul eventually found himself in Rome, and was imprisoned. He too was sentenced to be executed. Because St. Paul was born a Roman citizen, the law held that he could not be executed within the city of Rome. He was beheaded outside the city walls. Today, the Church of St. Paul Outside the Walls marks the spot of his tomb.

The Roman Empire could not have predicted that the death of these two great Apostles would nourish the faith of the early Christians, rather than extinguish it. We can be grateful for their witness. We rightly call them the pillars of the Roman Church.

Saints Peter and Paul, pray for us!

¡Hola, San Juan!

Ya estamos a mediados de julio, pero quería volver a finales de junio. En mis dos artículos anteriores, hablé de San Juan Fisher y Thomas More, y también nuestro patrón, San Juan Bautista. El 29th de junio, la Iglesia celebró también la fiesta de los grandes santos Pedro y Pablo. Estos dos santos son gigantes de la fe. ¡No podemos entender la fe católica sin ellos!

San Pedro, como muchos de nosotros sabemos, era un pescador judío, que comenzó a seguir al Señor Jesús después de un poderoso milagro. Jesús lo nombró cabeza de los Apóstoles, diciéndole famosamente: "Te daré las llaves del reino de los cielo". Hoy honramos a San Pedro como nuestro primer Papa. San Pedro, por supuesto, es famoso por negar a Jesús tres veces. Sin embargo, a pesar de esto, Jesús lo perdona y restaura. Pedro luego va a Roma, donde, según la tradición, fue ejecutado al revés, considerándose indigno de morir de la misma manera que Jesús. Hoy, la Basílica de San Pedro se encuentra sobre la tumba de San Pedro.

San Pablo, por otro lado, tiene una historia muy diferente. Nunca se encontró con Jesús durante su vida terrenal. Como fariseo, San Pablo era muy celoso de la fe judía y veía a los cristianos como una amenaza. Los persiguió e incluso fue responsable de algunas de sus ejecuciones. Un día, mientras Pablo viajaba a Damasco para perseguir a la Iglesia en crecimiento, se le apareció Jesús. Pablo tuvo una poderosa experiencia de conversión y se convirtió a uno de los más grandes evangelistas de la Iglesia. Hizo cuatro famosos viajes misioneros, plantando las semillas de la Iglesia en todo el mundo mediterráneo. Debido a esto, a veces se le llama el Apóstol de los gentiles. Como San Pedro, San Pablo finalmente se encontró en Roma y fue encarcelado. Él también fue condenado a ser ejecutado. Debido a que San Pablo nació como ciudadano romano, la ley sostenía que no podía ser ejecutado dentro de la ciudad de Roma. Fue decapitado fuera de las paredes de la ciudad. Hoy, la Iglesia de San Pablo fuera de las paredes marca el lugar de su tumba.

El Imperio Romano no podría haber predicho que la muerte de estos dos grandes Apóstoles alimentaría la fe de los primeros cristianos, en lugar de extinguirla. Podemos estar agradecidos por su testimonio. Con razón los llamamos los pilares de la Iglesia Romana.



### SIGNING UP FOR MASSES-UPDATE

### **COME ENCOUNTER JESUS AT ST. JOHN!**

**Eucharistic Adoration** is held every Thursday from 6-9pm in the Chapel. There is no signup required.

### WHAT IS EUCHARISTIC ADORATION?

Eucharistic adoration is the act of worshipping God as He is present in the consecrated Eucharist. Since the Last Supper, when Jesus broke the bread and distributed the wine, saying, "This is my Body" and "This is my Blood", Catholics have believed that the bread and wine are no longer merely baked wheat and fermented grape juice, but the actual living presence of the Second Person of the Trinity.

Spending time before the Blessed Sacra-

ment, in prayer and devotion, is exactly the same as spending time before the living God. Adoration occurs whenever someone kneels in front of a tabernacle that contains the Blessed Sacrament, genuflects towards a tabernacle, bows before receiving the Blessed Sacrament at Mass, or, in a more focused way, when the Blessed Sacrament is exposed for adoration.
