THE PRIESTS' PAGE/LA PÁGINA DE LOS PADRES

On Thursday July 16, the Church celebrates Mary under the title of Our Lady of Mount Carmel. This is a unique feast day in the Church because usually, whenever we celebrate our Blessed Mother, we celebrate an important event in her life or one of her apparitions, like Lourdes or Fatima. But Our Lady of Mount Carmel is tied to the formal establishment of the Carmelite community in 1274. Mount Carmel is a mountain in northern Israel on the Mediterranean coast which was home to a group of hermits that grew into the Carmelite community. Carmelites are consecrated men and women dedicated to prayer and the communal life, and this community has produced some of the greatest saints in the history of the church, like St. Teresa of Avila, St. Therese of Lisieux, St. Teresa Benedicta of the Cross, and St. John of the Cross. These spiritual giants all attribute their holiness and virtue to the intercession and protection of Our Lady of Mount Carmel. Why is this the case? Every time we give ourselves to Mary, we are confident that she will lead us to Jesus. St. Louis de Montfort teaches us that Mary "is the safest, easiest, shortest and most perfect way of approaching Jesus." And through the intercession of Our Lady of Mount Carmel, many members of the Carmelite family have come to know Jesus in a more profound and life changing way through giving themselves to Mary. The brown scapular of the Carmelite community is a special way to live this devotion, where one is invested with this scapular as a sign of their dedication to Our Lady of Mount Carmel. It is a praiseworthy practice, and I want to definitely recommend you to look into it as it is a great reminder each day of Mary's presence in your life. I have been blessed to wear a scapular for about 10 years now, and it is a constant reminder to turn to my Mother in my own need. So let us ask Our Lady of Mount Carmel to pray for us and guide us to eternal life with her Son.

Todos estos gigantes espirituales atribuyen su santidad y virtud a la intercesión y protección de Nuestra Señora del Monte Carmelo. ¿Por qué es este el caso? Cada vez que nos entregamos a María, estamos seguros de que ella nos llevará a Jesús. San Luis de Montfort nos enseña que María "es la forma más segura, fácil, corta y perfecta de acercarse a Jesús". Y por intercesión de Nuestra Señora del Monte Carmelo, muchos miembros de la familia carmelita han llegado a conocer a Jesús de una manera más profunda y que cambia la vida al entregarse a María. El escapulario marrón de la comunidad carmelita es una forma especial de vivir esta devoción, donde se invierte con este escapulario como un signo de su dedicación a Nuestra Señora del Monte Carmelo. 

WHY IS A TAX CREDIT BETTER THAN A DEDUCTION?

A tax credit is always better than a tax deduction because a credit lovers your tax bill directly. A deduction lowers your adjusted gross income on your IRS Form 1040, so the amount you get reduced off your tax bill is directly tied to your tax bracket.

Example: Tax Credit vs. Tax Deduction


For example, if you make a \$1,000 Tax Credit Scholarship donation you receive a \$750 tax credit which lowers your tax owed to Illinois by \$750. Simple as that. If your tax bill was going to be \$3,000, you just reduced it to \$2,250.

However, what would happen if that was a deduction on your IRS Form 1040 and not a tax credit? A \$1,000 deduction, if you are in the 22% tax bracket, will lower your adjusted gross income by \$1,000, thereby lowering your tax bill by about \$220. In this scenario, we also assume that the taxpayer is itemizing their deductions. If the taxpayer takes the standard deduction (\$12,400 if filing single or \$24,800 if married filing jointly), then the \$1,000 donation would not provide any tax

CATHOLICS FOR LIFE

In July we celebrate the Precious Blood of Jesus which was shed for us. Unfortunately, the blood of Jesus' precious children is shed daily through abortion, euthanasia, war, etc. The Supreme Court ruled 5 to 4 to strike down the Louisiana law that requires abortion doctors to have hospital admitting privileges.



Again, they have failed to protect life, but rather to approve the possible destruction of Life. The abortion industry say they are for women's health, but their actions show the opposite. So again, they are permitted to shed innocent blood. You are probably familiar with one of the great Saints of our time, St. Marie Faustina Kowalska. She was canonized by St. John Paul II, and he declared the Sunday after Easter as Divine Mercy Sunday. Praying in gratitude for Jesus' sacrifice for us, recalls the Divine Mercy Chaplet which Jesus gave to St. Faustina and told her to pray for the dying. If possible, recite it during the hour of divine Mercy at 3p.m., but it can be said at any time. It only takes about 10 minutes to pray the chaplet and it is said on your rosary. This is how to pray it:

Make the Sign of the Cross.

Say the optional Opening Prayer.

Say the "Our Father."

Say the "Hail Mary."

Say the Apostles' Creed.

On the "Our Father" bead before each decade say; Eternal Father, I offer You the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Your dearly beloved Son, Our Lord Jesus Christ, in atonement for our sins and those of the whole world.


On the "Hail Mary" beads of each decade say; For the Sake of His sorrowful Passion, have mercy on us and on the whole world.

Repeat # 6 & 7 prayers for four more decades.

After 5 decades, say the concluding doxology (three times); Holy God, Holy Mighty One, Holy Immortal One, have mercy on us and the whole world.

Say the optional closing Prayer.

Bishop Pates Announces the Fall Re-Opening of Catholic Schools in the Diocese of Joliet

June 16, 2020

JOLIET, IL-- Bishop Richard Pates, Apostolic Administrator of the Diocese of Joliet, announced today that the 52 Catholic schools in the diocese will open this Fall.
