

FROM THE DEACON'S DESK/DESDE EL ESCRITORIO DEL DIÁCONO

Last week we talked about the Mass as an "offering." That is, at every Mass, we remember how Jesus Christ offered himself up for our sins. He offered himself so that we could be freed from sin, and he ascended into Heaven, where he sits forever at the right hand of God the Father.

We know that, as members of Christ's body, the Church, we are called to imitate him. We imitate him in many different ways – through the way we treat others, acts of service, etc. But we also imitate Jesus when we attend Mass. At the Mass we learn to offer to God all of our sins, desires, and intentions. In this act of offering, we imitate Jesus, who made the ultimate offering on the cross.

Think about this phrase from the Mass: "Pray, brothers and sisters, that my sacrifice and yours might be acceptable to God the Almighty Father." In this moment, the priest stands before us, accepting everything we have to offer, and presents them before God the Father. We might say that the priest acts as "Christ the head" and we as "Christ the members." Each person then has a special role to play in the body of Christ, just like each part of our body has a special function. When we attend Mass, we form a united body, each with our own special role. Priests and Deacons have more visible roles during Mass, but the role of lay people is no less important. As members of the body of Christ, lay people are able to share the good news of Jesus Christ in places that priests cannot be – in their places of work, their families, etc. Fed by the Eucharist, we are all strengthened in the mission to which Christ has called us. That mission? To be members of his body, to share that good news during our lives on Earth, and ultimately to share in Eternal life in Heaven.

La semana pasada hablamos de la Misa como una "ofrenda". Es decir, en cada Misa, recordamos cómo Jesucristo se ofreció por nuestros pecados. Él se ofreció para que pudiéramos ser liberados del pecado, y ascendió al Cielo, donde Él se sienta para siempre a la diestra de Dios el Padre.

Sabemos que, como miembros del cuerpo de Cristo, la Iglesia, estamos llamados a imitarlo. Lo imitamos de muchas maneras diferentes — a través de la manera en que tratamos a otros, actos de servicio, etc. Pero también imitamos a Jesús cuando asistimos a la Misa. En la Misa aprendemos a ofrecer a Dios todos nuestros pecados, deseos e intenciones. En este acto de ofrenda, imitamos a Jesús, quien hizo la última ofrenda en la cruz.

Pensemos en esta frase de la Misa: "Ore, hermanos y hermanas, para que mi sacrificio y el tuyo sean aceptables para Dios el Padre Todopoderoso". En este momento, el sacerdote está ante nosotros, aceptando todo lo que tenemos que ofrecer, y los presenta ante Dios el Padre. Podríamos decir que el sacerdote actúa como "Cristo la cabeza" y nosotros como "Cristo los miembros". Entonces, cada persona tiene un papel especial que desempeñar en el cuerpo de Cristo, al igual que cada parte de nuestro cuerpo tiene una función especial. Cuando asistimos a misa, formamos un cuerpo unido, cada uno con nuestro propio papel especial. Los sacerdotes y diáconos tienen roles más visibles durante la Misa, pero el papel de los laicos no es menos importante. Como miembros del cuerpo de Cristo, los laicos pueden compartir las buenas nuevas de Jesucristo en lugares que los sacerdotes no pueden estar, en sus lugares de trabajo, sus familias, etc. Alimentados por la Eucaristía, todos somos fortalecidos en la misión a la que Cristo nos ha llamado. ¿Esa misión? Ser miembros de su cuerpo, compartir esas buenas nuevas durante nuestras vidas en la Tierra, y en última instancia, compartir la vida eterna en el Cielo.

POPE ESTABLISHES WORLD DAY FOR GRANDPARENTS AND THE ELDERLY, SUNDAY, JULY 25, 2021

"Pope Francis has decided to institute a Church-wide celebration of a World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly. Starting this year, it will be held on the fourth Sunday of July, close to the liturgical memorial of Saints Joachim and Anne, the grandparents of Jesus.

Recalling the upcoming feast of the Presentation of Jesus in the Temple – when the elderly Simeon and Anna encountered the child Jesus and recognized Him as the Messiah – Pope Francis said, "the Holy Spirit even today stirs up thoughts and words of wisdom in the elderly." The voice of the elderly "is precious," he said, "because it sings the praises of God and preserves the roots of the peoples." The elderly, he continued, "remind us that old age is a gift and that grandparents are the link between the different generation, to pass on to the young the experience of life."

The Holy Father said he instituted the World Day of Grandparents and the Elderly because "grandparents are often forgotten, and we forget this wealth of preserving roots and passing on" what the elderly have received. He emphasized the importance of grandparents and grandchildren getting to know one another, because "as the prophet Joel says, grandparents seeing their grandchildren dream," while "young people, drawing strength from their grandparents, will go forward and prophesy."

Within the Dicastery for Laity, Family and Life, Vittorio Scelzo is involved with the pastoral care of the elderly. He notes that the celebration of the World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly is connected to the Days established by Pope Francis for the Word of God and for the Poor. In an interview with Vatican News, Scelzo emphasized that "the poor, the Bible and the elderly" are "three priorities" of Pope Francis' pontificate, priorities that are destined "to mark the future of the Church."

Eucharistic Adoration is held every Thursday from 6-9pm in the Chapel. There is no signup required.

WHAT IS EUCHARISTIC ADORATION?

Eucharistic adoration is the act of worshipping God as He is present in the consecrated Eucharist. Since the Last Supper, when Jesus broke the bread and distributed the wine, saying, "This is my Body" and "This is my Blood", Catholics have believed that the bread and wine are no longer merely baked wheat and fermented

grape juice, but the actual living presence of the Second Person of the Trinity. Spending time before the Blessed Sacrament, in prayer and devotion, is exactly the same as spending time before the living God. Adoration occurs whenever someone kneels in front of a tabernacle that contains the Blessed Sacrament, genuflects towards a tabernacle, bows before receiving the Blessed Sacrament at Mass, or, in a more focused way, when the Blessed Sacrament is exposed for adoration. Empower Illinois is proud to help hard-working, passionate, and loving parents provide their children with the education that they desire for them.

The Illinois Invest in Kids Program has already been a tremendous benefit to St. John the Baptist students. During the 2020-21 school year, 25 of our students were granted full or partial scholarships totaling just under \$100,000. We have set a goal of awarding 35 scholarships for the 2021-22 academic year which would require at least \$125,000 in donations. To date, 22 scholarships have been awarded for the coming school year and 26 eligible students remain on a wait list pending additional funding. We're working diligently to increase donations to the program to provide additional tuition assistance to more families to receive an education from St. John's. WHAT IS A CURSILLO?



Cursillo is a Spanish word meaning short course. A Cursillo therefore is a short course in Christianity. While Cursillo originated in Spain in the 1940s, today Cursillo Weekends are given in more than 50 nations on 5 Continents. It is estimated that more than 2 million men and women of various races and languages have partici-

pated. There are approximately 3,400 Cursillistas in the Joliet Diocese.

To explain a Cursillo to someone who has never experienced it is difficult and somewhat mystifying. The reason behind the mystery is God. No one can fully explain how God touches each person in His special/unique way throughout the movement. For some, it is a total turnabout in their lives; for others, it is a grand awakening; for yet others, it is an enrichment of what they have already known and have been living. We do not promise anything or judge anyone – we simply offer the program and rely on the grace of God and the openness of the individual to produce its benefits.

The Cursillo is an opportunity to form and live in community with other Catholics and clergy members. It is immersed in Catholic Doctrine and the Sacraments, most importantly it is an encounter with Christ.

We are excited to announce the return of Cursillo weekends this fall at the Carmelite Spiritual Center in Darien, Illinois. The schedule is as follows.




