

REOPENING LETTER

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I am pleased to inform you that we have received certification from Bishop Pates to reopen our church, allowing for the celebration of baptisms, confessions, weddings, funerals, adoration for a short time, weekday Masses, and weekend Masses for groups depending on the number of households that can be seated with a distance of six feet between each household.

The process of reopening depended on developing a plan that prioritized the safety and wellbeing of all while maintaining due respect and reverence for the sacraments. I have assembled a Parish Reopening Leadership Team, who has begun to recruit and train volunteers. We are preparing the buildings as well as taking an inventory on and ordering cleaning and sanitation supplies and protective equipment. The first Sunday Masses will be this weekend, June 14th. We are still in need of healthy volunteers to be a part of one of the following teams:

- Set-up team: Ensures that all supplies needed for each sacramental celebration/gathering are ready for use, entrances and exits are marked and propped physically open prior to attendees' arrival/departure, windows are opened, etc.
- Greeting team: Assists in managing the flow of congregants as they enter the church, making sure attendees use hand sanitizer upon entering, are wearing a mask, and are reminded not to enter if ill; directing people to appropriate seating/waiting areas, etc.
- Cleaning team: Maintains and cleans essential and trafficked areas of the church before and after the church has been used.

Please send me a message at frmatt@stjohnwinfield.org to indicate your willingness and ability to volunteer.

Because we must limit the number of attendees to minimize the risk of the spread of disease, and in order to avoid turning people away at our doors, we have established an online registration system. We are encouraging parishioners to visit our webpage and sign up so that we know how many attendees to expect at Mass and avoid overcrowding. I also ask you to not sign up for everything at once but to allow for others to register. Please be patient as we establish this new system, and please be understanding as we try to make the Mass available to all who wish to attend under these limitations.

I ask you to be patient and flexible when we return to Mass. Not only will there be less people, but you will need to arrive early to check in (because you have registered) and you will be led to and from your pew. Masks or cloth face coverings must be worn, and there will be less singing and interaction with others. The bishop has extended the dispensation from the Sunday obligation during the pandemic, and so if you are not feeling well or are vulnerable, you may stay home. I know this may feel awkward, but I am happy that we will be able to return to the sacraments, to the font of grace. It is also important to remember that the guidelines and measures are designed to protect our wellbeing and that of our broader community. Please visit our website for more information and details about Masses, expectations, and registrations. May God grant you His peace during this time, and may He bless and protect you and your loved ones.

Si vivan con alguien que tiene COVID 19 o si tengan síntomas de gripa, como fiebre, tos o dificultades para respirar, por favor quédense en casa.

Durante esta pandemia, el obispo nos ha dispensado de la obligación de asistir en la misa los domingos.

HAVE MERCY

"Praise the LORD, for [God] has rescued the life of the poor from the power of the wicked!" (Jeremiah 20:13). After the great recession of 2008, the middle class shrank, and people who lost their jobs and often their homes sank into poverty. This is not the direction we should be heading. We should be lifting up the poor, helping them to stay afloat and build a sufficient life for themselves: own a home, feed and educate their children, have hope. For this is what God wills for us, to help our brothers and sisters, no matter their race, religion, national origin, or any other thing that makes them "different" from us. We must have mercy. Even those who have little are known to share what they have with those who have less. How much more should those who have much offer help to those who are stuck! As we sing in today's responsorial psalm, "For the LORD hears the poor, / and [God's] own who are in bonds [God] spurns not" (Psalm 69:33).

WITH YOUR CONSTANT HELP, O LORD

"I hear the whisperings of many: 'Terror on every side!' " (Jeremiah 20:10). Of what are we afraid? Are we afraid of people speaking ill of us? Of those who seek our very lives? Are we afraid of falling into poverty? Of war on our own soil? It has been said that we are all just one hospitalization away from poverty; we should not be so confident in our material goods. We never know what may befall us. We must have mercy on those who have fallen into misfortune, and be ready to help our sisters and brothers just as God has mercy and helps us when we have tripped and fallen.

FEAR NO ONE

Poverty exists just as death exists. But we must not give up or lose hope! For God knows all our needs, and stands ready to help us. "For the LORD hears the poor, / and [God's] own who are in bonds [God] spurns not" (Psalm 69:33). We may or may not be materially poor, but we are victims of our own tendency toward sin.

As in Adam all died, in Christ all remain alive. "But the gift is not like the transgression. For if by the transgression of the one the many died, how much more did the grace of God and the gracious gift of the one man Jesus Christ overflow for the many" (Romans 5:15). We look to God for mercy and comfort in our need. God hears our prayer, and in the secret recesses of our hurting hearts, God comforts us and offers us salvation. "Fear no one. Nothing is concealed that will not be revealed, nor secret that will not be known. What I say to you in the darkness, speak in the light; what you hear whispered, proclaim on the housetops" (Matthew 10:26–27).

We may be poor in material ways, or fear such poverty. We are all poor in our transgressions, large and small, but we need not fear, for God is with us in mercy and love. "[D]o not be afraid of those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul" (Matthew 10:28). God can be trusted.

TODAY'S READINGS

I hope that this short note finds all of you doing well, especially considering the recent Coronavirus scare. As with many things, the presence and fear of the virus affected some things relating to my closing months as a seminarian. Back in March, Mundelein Semi-



nary, like so many other schools and universities, was closed. This closure forced us seminarians to continue our formation via online classes. Praise God, this "online seminary" accomplished its task in some measure, as my deacon classmates and I completed our time at Mundelein. Many of us now have been ordained priests, or await ordination in the near future.

With regard to ordination, this too was delayed for many of us seminarians around the country. Here in Joliet, our ordination was originally scheduled for the 23rd of May. But, considering the still active stay-athome order in place through the end of May, our ordination was postponed to June 20th. Though at first glance, such delay may seem frustrating, in God's Providence, my classmates and I were blessed to be ordained on the feast of the Immaculate Heart of Mary, the Saturday following the feast of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. This feast of the Sacred Heart is most cherished by priests, as it is in the Sacred Heart of Jesus that we as priests find our model and source of grace for the sacrificial love and service that the priestly ministry demands. Also, in the Immaculate Heart of Mary, the priest, and all of Christ's faithful find a Heart that is always utterly given to God in humble devotion and love, and therefore provides a motherly example and source of aid to all who seek to follow Christ. Holding both the Sacred Hearts of Jesus and Mary in focus, it is my hope that I can truly be a priest after the Sacred Heart of Jesus, with a lively devotion to the Immaculate Heart of our Dear Mother. Please pray that I may be such a priest.

In closing, I would like to thank God for the vocation that He has given to me and the help and the patience that He has shown to me, a man who is unworthy of God's call and has been most hard-headed, at times. I would next like to thank my family, for all of their support, understanding, and love over these past six years. Without them, I would not be the man that I am today and I very much doubt, that without their support, I would have reached God's sacred altar. I would also like to thank the priests of St. John's. I have been blessed to have learned so much and to have received so much support from Fr. Matt, Fr. Tom, and Fr. Keith. I very much look forward to serving as a priest beside these most worthy priests of God. I would also be remiss, if I did not thank Deacon Dave, who in many ways served as a model for me in my diaconal ministry at St. John's. Finally, I would like to thank all of you, the parishioners of St. John the Baptist. From all of the parish groups and organizations, to all of you individually, I am so glad to have served at a parish where there are so many kind people. May God bless you all and be assured of my prayers, and as I begin the priestly ministry, I would ask that you continue to pray for me. St. John the Baptist, pray for us.

Father's Day Special Collection for Diocesan Priests' Care & Support-This Weekend







Help a child receive a Catholic education at St. John the Baptist, and you can receive a 75% tax credit on your state income taxes.

WHY IS A TAX CREDIT BETTER THAN A DEDUCTION?

A tax credit is always better than a tax deduction because a credit lovers your tax bill directly. A deduction lowers your adjusted gross income on your IRS Form 1040, so the amount you get reduced off your tax bill is directly tied to your tax bracket.

Example: Tax Credit vs. Tax Deduction

For example, if you make a \$1,000 Tax Credit Scholarship donation you receive a \$750 tax credit which lowers your tax owed to Illinois by \$750. Simple as that. If your tax bill was going to be \$3,000, you just reduced it to \$2,250.

However, what would happen if that was a deduction on your IRS Form 1040 and not a tax credit? A \$1,000 deduction, if you are in the 22% tax bracket, will lower your adjusted gross income by \$1,000, thereby lowering your tax bill by about \$220. In this scenario, we also assume that the taxpayer is itemizing their deductions. If the taxpayer takes the standard deduction (\$12,400 if filing single or \$24,800 if married filing jointly), then the \$1,000 donation would not provide any tax benefit.

Donate through Empower Illinois (empowerillinois.org), designating St. John the Baptist Catholic School as the recipient of the scholarship. Contact the school office or the parish business manager for more information.


