A letter from our pastor, Father Matt/Una carta de nuestro párroco, Padre Mateo

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

As we begin the season of Lent, we remember that its purpose is to prepare us for Easter. On Easter, we celebrate the great Feast when Christ conquered sin and death by rising from the dead. United with Christ in our sufferings, life, and death, we will be united

with Him in in His resurrection. This union, or friendship, with Christ began when you were baptized, when you received new life in Christ. St. Paul wrote that in baptism we die and rise with Christ. So on Easter we renew our baptismal promises so that we may live in union with him here on earth and forever in heaven.

The three disciplines of Lent are prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. I encourage you to do one of each during Lent. Fasting, when we give up some sort of food, reminds us that we are never completely satisfied by everything that we want. Sometimes, we create a lot of unnecessary noise in our lives that distract us from paying attention to God and those around us. Giving something up breaks the routine and reminds us to love God and neighbor. Don't forget that Fridays in Lent are obligatory days of abstinence from meat for anyone who is 14 years old and older. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstaining from meat for people between the ages of 18 and 60. Fasting allows for one modest meal with two smaller meals that, if combined, would not equal the larger meal. Of course, exceptions can be made for health. Friday is of particular importance since every Friday reminds us of Good Friday, when Jesus suffered and died on the cross for us. Prayer turns our attention to love and be loved by God, and it also helps us to grow in love of others when we pray for them. Almsgiving refers to works of charity. When we love others, we love Christ.

May this Lent be a blessed time to grow in love of God and neighbor as we prepare to celebrate the most loving act the world has ever seen: the sacrifice of God on behalf of us for the world's salvation. Let us continue to pray for one another during this sacred season.

Queridos hermanos y hermanas en Cristo:

Al comenzar la temporada de Cuaresma, recordamos que su propósito es prepararnos para la Pascua. En la Pascua, celebramos la gran fiesta cuando Cristo venció el pecado y la muerte por resucitar de entre los muertos.

Unidos a Cristo en nuestros sufrimientos, vida y muerte, nos uniremos con Él en su resurrección. Esta unión, o amistad, con Cristo comenzó para ustedes cuando fueron bautizados, recibiendo nueva vida en Cristo. San Pablo escribió que en el bautismo morimos y nos levantamos con Cristo. Así que en Pascua renovamos nuestras promesas bautismales para que vivamos con él aquí en este mundo y para siempre en el cielo.

Las tres disciplinas de la Cuaresma son la oración, el ayuno y la limosna. Les animo a hacer cada uno durante la Cuaresma. El ayuno, cuando renunciamos algún tipo de comida, nos recuerda que nunca estamos completamente satisfechos con todo lo que deseamos. A veces, creamos mucho ruido innecesario en nuestras vidas que nos distrae de prestar atención a Dios y a los que nos rodean. Renunciar algo rompe la rutina y nos recuerda amar a Dios y al prójimo. No olviden que los viernes de Cuaresma son días obligatorios de abstinencia de carne para personas que tienen 14 años o más. El Miércoles de Ceniza y el Viernes Santo son días obligatorios de ayuno y abstenerse de comer carne para personas entre las edades de 18 y 60 años. El ayuno permite una comida modesta con dos comidas más pequeñas que, si se combinan, no serían iguales a la comida modesta. Por supuesto, se pueden hacer excepciones para la salud. Viernes es un día de penitencia porque es el día cuando Jesús sufrió y murió en la cruz por nosotros. La oración centra nuestra atención en amar y ser amados por Dios, y también nos ayuda a crecer en el amor por los demás cuando oramos por ellos. La limosna se refiere a obras de caridad. Cuando amamos a los demás. amamos a Cristo.

Que esta Cuaresma sea un momento bendecido para crecer en el amor a Dios y al prójimo mientras nos preparamos para celebrar el acto más amoroso que el mundo haya visto: el sacrificio de Dios en nombre de nosotros por la salvación del mundo. Sigamos rezando unos por otros durante este tiempo sagrado.

Lenten Regulations

- 1. Everyone 14 years of age or over is bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent.
- 2. All from the age of 18 years up to the beginning of their 60th year are bound to fast on Ash Wednesday & Good Friday.
- 3. On these two days of fast and abstinence, only one full meatless meal is allowed. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted on these two days, but liquids, including milk and fruit juices are allowed. When health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige.

Join us this Lent as we examine Christ's own words to learn what it looks like when we die to ourselves. What impact does it have




on our daily lives? What do we leave behind? What do we lose, and what do we gain?



RE NEWS-\$\$ Change for Change

This past Wednesday, Ash Wednesday, all the children in our school and Religious Education Program, received a Ziploc freezer bag to collect their Lenten monies! As you may recall, in our Diocesan paper, **Christ is Our Hope**, there was an article about Catholic Charities. It shared the story of the numerous homeless children having to sleep on the floor, in sleeping bags, in the dining room in their Day Center in Joliet. Sleep on the floor-can you imagine that?

I challenged the kids to think of what it must feel like to have no bed, no soft mattress, no sheets or blankets to call their own. Maybe it is skip the pizza night, and have a "soup and bread" meal-give that money to Catholic Charities. Maybe it is stay home instead of going out to dinner, give that money to Catholic Charities. 




