

## CHURCH SCHEDULE UPDATE

*as of March 18, 2020*

**The church and chapel are open every day from 7 a.m. to 9 p.m. Feel free to stop in and pray before our Lord, present in the tabernacle.**

Out of concern for the health and well-being of all, and in light of the directives offered by the state of Illinois, **Bishop Pates, the apostolic administrator of the Diocese of Joliet, has dispensed the faithful of the Diocese from the obligation of Sunday Mass and has asked that Saturday evening and Sunday Masses be canceled until further notified.**

There will be no public Masses offered on Saturday evening and Sunday; they will be offered privately for the intentions that have been promised. Don't forget to make a spiritual communion:

"My Jesus, I believe that You are present in the Most Holy Sacrament. I love You above all things, and I desire to receive You into my soul. Since I cannot at this moment receive You sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart. I embrace You as if You were already there and unite myself wholly to You. Never permit me to be separated from You. Amen."

**Daily Mass** is celebrated in the church Monday through Friday at 7:00 a.m. and 7:50 a.m. and on Saturday at 8:30 a.m.

**Confessions** will be heard on Saturday afternoon from 3:30 to 4:30 p.m., but they will be cancelled on weekdays. Because the confessional is a small space, please be prudent.

**Cancelled:** All events that are not essential, would be a gathering of over fifty people, and are prayers and devotions that can be prayed privately. No Vespers, Stations, Adoration, etc.



## A letter from our pastor, Father Matt/Una carta de nuestro párroco, Padre Mateo

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

During this time when we are practicing social distancing and keeping gatherings to a minimum, I want you to know that I keep all of you close to my heart each day in prayer. It is difficult and strange not celebrating Sunday Mass with you, but even though the Mass may not be public, we are still offering the Mass for you. Fr. Tom and I are continuing to pray for you and offer worship to God by saying private Masses. God gives His grace to all of us in the parish through the holy Mass, whether or not we are physically present, and His grace is powerful and gives us hope and strength. Many of you have expressed the void that you feel by not having the devotions and Sunday Masses of the church. We are looking into the possibility of broadcasting our Masses and devotions online. If there is no Palm Sunday Mass, we will still bless palms as usual and have them available for pick-up. We are keeping the church and chapel open from 7 a.m. to 9 p.m. every day so that you can stop by and visit our Lord and pray before Him who is present in the tabernacle. I also ask that you continue with Lenten devotions, offering your prayers, Stations of the Cross, fasts, and Lenten sacrifices for your brothers and sisters in the parish, especially the sick, the vulnerable, and our healthcare workers. Please don't forget to make a spiritual communion, inviting our Eucharistic Lord into your heart. We can still stay close spiritually, and to keep updated with the parish, please follow us on our website, Facebook page, and bulletin. I know that many of you are feeling stress because of the circumstances, but I ask you to please remember our parish and consider financially supporting our parish through dropping off or mailing envelopes or online giving via the link on our webpage. Again, know that Fr. Tom and I are remembering you in prayer. May we continue to be drawn closer to our Lord during this season of Lent, and may His Passion, Death, and Resurrection preserve and increase in us hope and joy.

Mis queridos hermanos y hermanas de Diócesis de Joliet,

Muchas gracias por su cooperación con las acciones tomadas para minimizar, en la medida que sea posible, la propagación de COVID-19 (corona virus). Su salud, así como la salud del público en general, han sido mi más profunda preocupación. Es importante que todos cooperemos con los líderes oficiales para que nuestros esfuerzos sean lo más eficaces posibles para contener esta pandemia.

Entiendo completamente y siento junto a ustedes la dolorosa perdida que es la cancelación de las misas los fines de semanas. Debido a que la celebración de la misa es esencial a quienes somos, entiendo que su ausencia crea un vacío palpable. 2. Se deben tomar las precauciones para prevenir la propagación del virus.

Se están implementando las adaptaciones litúrgicas que incluimos con este mensaje y se les hace un llamado a las parroquias a reducir o cancelar otras reuniones no esenciales. Estas dos directivas finalizaran cuando sean prudentemente notificadas.

Deseo animar energéticamente a todos los fieles a continuar nuestras prácticas cuaresmales de oración, ayuno y limosna. La necesidad vivida por aquellos que atendemos en la Iglesia continúa, especialmente en este momento de crisis. Por favor considere ponerse en contacto con su parroquia local sobre las posibilidades de apoyar financieramente o con ayuda personal. My dear Sisters and Brothers in the Joliet Diocese,

Thank you very much for your cooperation with actions that have been taken to minimize, to the degree possible, the spread of COVID - 19 (coronavirus). Your health, as well as the health of the public at large, have been my deepest concern. It is important that all of us cooperate with public leadership to make our efforts as effective as possible in containing this pandemic.

I fully realize and feel the painful loss along with you the cancellation of Masses on weekends. Because celebrating Mass is central to whom we are, I understand that its absence creates a palpable void. However, out of genuine concern for the welfare of everyone, I believe it is prudent to cancel weekend Masses for the time being.

Certain liturgical gatherings, namely daily Mass, funerals, and weddings are permitted provided that:

1. The service may not have an attendance in excess of 50 persons. This number is the current directive of Governor Pritzker. Going forward, our point of reference regarding numbers will be those issued by the Governor of Illinois.
2. Every precaution be taken to prevent the spread of the virus.

The attached liturgical accommodations are being implemented and parishes are called to curtail or cancel other non-essential gatherings. These two directives will be ended when it is prudently advisable.

I want to strongly encourage all of the faithful to continue our Lenten practices of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. Need experienced by those served by the Church continues, even especially so, at this time of crisis. Please consider reaching out to your local parish about the possibility of providing financial support or personal assistance.

Catholic Charities, which serves many of the poor and elderly in the Diocese of Joliet, has a special need for volunteers to serve those in vulnerable situations. Please visit <http://www.cc.doj.org> for more information.

During this extraordinary time, our efforts throughout the community are to the benefit of all and are very much in accord with our identity as Christians. Be assured your participation contributes significantly to the common good.

Once again, I am fully cognizant this is a time of severe uncertainty and fear. I promise my wholehearted prayer and support. Especially comforting is the realization that the Dear Lord accompanies us in our trials.

## **Liturgical Accommodations during the COVID – 19 Pandemic**

**Diocese of Joliet**

**Effective March 17, 2020 until prudently advisable to discontinue.**

1. Dispensation from the obligation of Sunday Mass is effective immediately.
2. The reception of Holy Communion should be by hand only...reception on tongue is temporarily suspended.
3. Reception of the Precious Blood is suspended.
4. The exchange of peace should be expressed verbally.
5. The Holy Water fonts should be emptied and not filled again. Our parishes could make the Holy Water available in containers by which parishioners could fill their own bottles.

Your cooperation with the foregoing is genuinely appreciated. While it is understood that the expected practices may be difficult for some, I assure you they are being undertaken for the common good and to significantly halt the spread of the virus.

Prayers are essential. You are encouraged to intensify the classical Lenten practice of prayer, fasting and almsgiving. Archbishop José Gomez, President of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops has composed the following, beautiful prayer to Our Lady of Guadalupe, Patroness of the Americas, for our use at this time.

3. La recepción de la Preciosa Sangre está suspendida.
4. El saludo de la paz se debe expresar verbalmente.
5. Las fuentes de Agua Bendita deben vaciarse y mantenerse así. Las parroquias pueden tener envases con Agua Bendita donde los feligreses pueden llenar sus propias botellas.

Su colaboración con todo lo propuesto es realmente apreciada. Entendemos que las prácticas esperadas pueden ser difíciles para algunos, les aseguro que se están llevando a cabo por el bienestar común y para detener la propagación del virus.

## The Triduum

The Triduum is a three-day special period that commemorates the final three days of Christ's life. It begins in the evening of Holy Thursday with the Mass of the Lord's Supper, continues with the celebration of the Passion of our Lord on Holy Friday, culminates with the Mass of the Easter Vigil after sundown on Holy Saturday, and ends the evening of Easter Sunday.

The days of the Triduum are central to our faith because they lead us into the heart of our identity as Catholics. Jesus' life, death, and resurrection are the foundation of our Christian life. The Triduum is more than just an historical reenactment. It is important to keep our minds and hearts focused on our own dying and rising in Jesus Christ. We are challenged, with the catechumens, as they are baptized into the life, death, and resurrection of Christ, to re-enter Christ's paschal mystery every year, renew our baptismal promises, and to die to ourselves so that we may experience new life in Christ. Our sharing in the paschal mystery characterizes what it means to be a Christian and a life-giving member of the Catholic community.

We hope you are able to attend at least part of this beautiful liturgy. ~Worship Commission

## From the Chancellor, Diocese of Joliet

### LENTE REGULATIONS

- Everyone 14 years of age or over is bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent.
- All from the age of 18 years up to the beginning of their 60<sup>th</sup> year are bound to fast on Ash Wednesday & Good Friday.
- On these two days of fast and abstinence, only one full meatless meal is allowed. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted on these two days, but liquids, including milk and fruit juices are allowed. When health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige.
- To disregard completely the law of fast and abstinence is seriously sinful.
- Lent is the principal season of penance in the Church year. All of the faithful are strongly urged to develop and follow a program of voluntary self-denial (in addition to following the Lenten regulations), serious prayer, and a performance of works of charity and mercy.
- Those who are sick, pregnant, nursing, or whose health would adversely be affected by fasting or abstinence, should not consider themselves bound by these norms.
