FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Dear Friends in Christ,

I can't believe that I will have been your pastor for two years come July 1st! Time has flown by, and it is such an honor to serve this amazing and generous community.

We have been living in a COVID-19 world for approximately two years now, and, God willing, it seems like it is starting to become a thing of the past. In this time, as you know, we have had to endure capacity limits on Masses, guidelines on hymnals and holy water, a mask mandate... (Just to name a few of the many guidelines.) Thanks be to God, however, practically all COVID-19 guidelines have been lifted by the diocese and we are well on our way back to normal.

For me it has been a tremendous blessing to have so many parishioners and families return over the past weeks and I want to make sure to invite back **ALL** of our parishioners for Mass and in- person Sacraments. The volunteers and the staff of St. John's have worked so hard to insure our church is a safe environment to worship God, and we miss having everyone here.

In a separate letter also in this week's bulletin we hear from Bishop Hicks about the lifting of the dispensation for Sunday Mass beginning this Palm Sunday, April 10, 2022. As pastor, I wish to welcome everyone back for that amazing celebration as we kick off Holy Week, and I make a promise to you that we will keep St. John's as safe as possible for our parishioners as our doors are fully open for you!

With the Grace of God and your generosity, we have been financially stable in spite of the pandemic. I want to publicly say **THANK YOU** to each of you who have been so generous to our parish family! You have helped keep St. John's open through some difficult times, and I'm truly grateful for your generosity and continued support.

Just like many of you, we are feeling the effects of inflation and supply chain issues at St. John's. As well, like any household or family, we can experience unplanned expenses. I would like to briefly share a few examples:

Our Church boiler dampers are in need of replacement. The equipment has been judged obsolete making replacement costlier, and unfortunately getting those specific parts has been a challenge due to supply chain issues. Another upcoming expense is our School water main; it is leaking and the old equipment needs to be replaced, meaning the piping and valves. Also, our roof is in need of repair at the main entrance of the church; this damage has been caused by winter weather.

These are just a few brief examples of some upcoming repairs that must be addressed. It is always much more cost effective to get ahead of these repairs than to wait for failure and replacement. We are blessed with a decent savings as a parish, but a few big ticket items could deplete that quickly, and two personal goals of mine are to not leave us financially exposed, and to have the best facilities possible!

As a way of trying to help offset these expenses I feel the Lord prompting me to ask you to help supplement our contributions and donations and ask for your prayerful participation in the St. John the Baptist "53rd Sunday" collection this weekend. Can you double your normal Sunday collection amount? For example, if you normally give \$20, can you make it \$40? Or if you give \$50, can you contribute \$100? **Any additional amount is a blessing.** The hope is that with the extra funds we could offset our expenses as if we had an additional Sunday of Collections, hence the name "53rd Sunday".

We ask if you are able to contribute, to please use our special "53rd Sunday" envelopes from Church, or to send in to the parish office any contributions marked "53rd Sunday." There is also an option to donate on our parish website through "We Share". Simply go to www.stjohnwinfield.org. On our website, please click the image that says "Online Giving with We Share," then donate through the special "53rd Sunday" link. There also is the option to make recurring Sunday contributions on the same page if online giving is a more convenient option for you.

I understand that some parishioners may not be able to increase a donation at this time and that is understandable. However, there is a way still to give, and that is by your prayers! I ask everyone, whether you can contribute or not, please pray for the intention of a successful 53rd Sunday! I thank you in advance for your prayers and also for any financial support you are able to give. With your generous spiritual support and prayers, I know this 53rd Sunday endeavor will be successful and bear fruit.

When I arrived at St. John's, I shared in my first Sunday homily that my goal was to help everyone get to Heaven. While my role as pastor necessitates being the financial steward of our parish home, my chief mission and goal to this day will continue to be praying for all of our souls! May God reward each of you for your spiritual and financial generosity, as we continue on our journey to Heaven.

Dear Friends,

With the onset of the coronavirus pandemic more than two years ago, our goal in the Diocese of Joliet has been to ensure the safety and well-being of all clergy, religious, lay ministers, parishioners, employees and volunteers while providing access to worship and the Eucharist. We have adjusted our safety protocols as COVID-19 cases and hospitalizations increased and then decreased. I want to personally thank you for your diligence in safeguarding the health of our brothers and sisters in Christ.

When the state of Illinois lifted its mask mandate for indoor public places on February 28, we followed suit for all church and office activities. We also removed practically all other precautions, but left in place the dispensation from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass.

The time has come to remove that final provision, and we will do so on Palm Sunday. What better time for us all to come together again than Palm Sunday, which marks the triumphant entry of Jesus into Jerusalem and the beginning of Holy Week.

Of course, if individuals are ill or contagious to others, Canon law allows them to decide for themselves if they should attend Mass.

I am excited the Diocese of Joliet will fully reunite as one body in Christ for the liturgies leading up to Easter and beyond.

I am reminded of the words Pope Francis wrote in *Fratelli Tutti* during the initial months of the pandemic: "Let us dream, then, as a single human family, as fellow travelers sharing the same flesh, as children of the same earth which is our common home, each of us bringing the richness of his or her beliefs and convictions, each of us with his or her own voice, brothers and sisters all." (Paragraph 8)

Let us welcome home our family with joy and continue to pray for each other.

COME ENCOUNTER JESUS AT ST. JOHN!

Eucharistic Adoration is held every Thursday from from 7:30 am, following the 7:00 am Mass, to 8:00 pm in the Chapel.

WHAT IS EUCHARISTIC ADORATION?

Eucharistic adoration is the act of worshipping God as He is present in the consecrated Eucharist. Since the Last Supper, when Jesus broke the bread and distributed the wine, saying, "This is my Body" and "This is my Blood", Catholics have believed that the bread and wine are no longer merely baked wheat and fermented grape juice, but the actual living presence of the Second Person of the Trinity. Spending time before the Blessed Sacrament, in prayer and devotion, is exactly the same as spending time before the living God. Adoration occurs whenever someone kneels in front of a tabernacle that contains the Blessed Sacrament, genuflects towards a tabernacle, bows before receiving the Blessed Sacrament at Mass, or, in a more focused way, when the Blessed Sacrament is exposed for adoration. 

Born in a small town in Siberia, Alex McCall was adopted at seven years old and came to West Chicago in 2003 to live with his forever family. For the first seven years of his life he didn't have much and was thrilled to come to all the comforts of home. Alex became an active member in his church, St. John the Baptist, school, and Boy Scouts where he received his Eagle Scout award. He enjoyed participating in many service projects that benefited others. Since he knows how it feels to have nothing, he has always wanted to give back and pay forward. When he started working, he decided to take some of his pay and help stock the shelves of the Ronald McDonald House. That was the beginning of the "Alex Project". Each year there is a different beneficiary. His project has donated toys to Shriner's Hospital, Ronald McDonald, and Central DuPage Hospital. This is the sixth annual project – making Care Bags for the homeless. He did the same project in 2021 and there was such a need for help he decided to repeat the project. With everyone's help, each Care Bag is filled with new socks, gloves, hat, hand warmers, face mask, sanitizer, toothpaste and brush, and other toiletries. There are special bags made for the children with extra items just for kids. The students of St. John's Religious Education help decorate and fill these bags. Last year over 500 bags were distributed to organizations that help the needy. PADS, Hesed house, Midwest Veterans Shelter, Elmwood Park Veterans Shelter, Wayne Township, Milton Township, DuPage County Sherriff and various police departments.

With everyone's continued help and support, this project will be a great success and help many people who are having a difficult time. 


SERVICE PROJECT UPDATE-**BLANKETS**


