#### A letter from our pastor, Father Matt/Una carta de nuestro párroco, Padre Mateo

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

This Sunday, we begin Passiontide. There are only two more weeks until Easter. One of the aspects most noticeable about this time is the covering of the statues and crucifixes with purple veils. This recalls St. John's observation in

the eighth chapter of the Gospel that Jesus Himself hid during the last couple of weeks before His betrayal and crucifixion. During this time of the "Shelter in place" order, we can join ourselves to Jesus in His hiding. This time can help us to be more aware of the Passion, Death, and Resurrection of our Lord and enter into it. Every Good Friday since I was a kid, I have tried to remain silent from noon to three, because that is when our Lord hung upon the cross. Setting that time aside in a quiet and simple manner helps me to enter into it. During these next two weeks, I ask you to be intentional about praying, particular with our Lord's final days before the Resurrection. The Stations of the Cross, the Gospel accounts of the Passion of Christ, reflections on the Seven Last Words of Christ, the Sorrow Mysteries of the Rosary, prayers before the crucifix, and the daily Mass readings are all helpful ways to reflect upon and meditate on our Lord's final days. The story is full of drama, and the more we pray with it, the less we will see it simply as the Lord's story and more as our Lord entering into our story. He entered into the darkness and isolation of this world with us so that He would conquer it and give us hope. He also gave us someone to help us: the Blessed Mother. At the foot of the cross, the Beloved Disciple looked upon the cross, trying to make sense of the suffering and death of our Lord, and at that moment, our Lord gave Mary to the Beloved Disciple and to all disciples to be our mother. She shows us how to trust God and how to follow Him; she keeps us close to Jesus. If you haven't prayed the rosary in while, I encourage you to do so, particularly the Sorrowful mysteries. May our Blessed Mother keep you close to our Lord now and always.

Although we are apart, I keep you close to my heart, especially in my daily prayers and Masses. Please continue to pray for me and one another.

Queridos hermanos y hermanas en Cristo:

Este domingo, comenzamos las dos semanas antes de la Pascua. Uno de los aspectos más notables de esta época es la cobertura de las estatuas y crucifijos con velos morados. Esto recuerda la observación de San Juan en el

octavo capítulo del Evangelio que Jesús mismo se ocultó durante las últimas semanas antes de su traición v crucifixión. Durante este tiempo de la orden "Refugio en el lugar", podemos unirnos a Jesús. Esta vez puede ayudarnos a ser más conscientes de la Pasión, Muerte y Resurrección de nuestro Señor y entrar en ella. Todos los Viernes Santo desde que era niño, he tratado de estar en silencio desde el mediodía hasta las tres porque es cuando nuestro Señor estaba colgado en la cruz. Establecer ese tiempo en una manera tranquila y sencilla me ayuda a entrar en el momento. Durante las próximas dos semanas, les pido que estén intencionales sobre la oración, particularmente con los últimos días de nuestro Señor antes de la Resurrección. Las Estaciones del viacrucis, los relatos evangélicos de la Pasión de Cristo, las reflexiones sobre las siete últimas palabras de Cristo, los misterios de trieste del rosario, las oraciones antes del crucifijo y las lecturas diarias de la Misa son formas útiles de reflexionar y meditar. en los últimos días de nuestro Señor. La historia está llena de drama, y cuanto más oremos con ella, menos lo veremos simplemente como la historia del Señor y más como nuestro Señor entrando en nuestra historia. Entró en la oscuridad y el aislamiento de este mundo con nosotros para conquistarlo y darnos esperanza. También nos dio a alguien para ayudarnos: la Santísima Madre. Al pie de la cruz, el discípulo amado miró a la cruz, tratando de entender el sufrimiento y la muerte de nuestro Señor, y en ese momento nuestro Señor le dio a María al discípulo amado y a todos los discípulos para que sea nuestra madre. Ella nos enseña confiar en Dios y seguirlo; ella nos mantiene cerca de Jesús. Si no han rezado el rosario desde hace mucho tiempo, les animo a que lo hagan, especialmente los misterios de trieste. Que nuestra Santísima Madre les mantenga cerca de nuestro Señor ahora y siempre.

Aunque estamos separados, les mantengo cerca de mi corazón, especialmente en mis oraciones y misas diarias. Por favor sigan rezando por mí y por los demás.

#### The Sacred Triduum

*Holy Thursday — Easter Sunday* 

The Triduum is a three-day special period that commemorates Christ's Passion, Death, and Resurrection It begins in the evening of Holy Thursday with the Mass of the Lord's Supper, continues with the celebration of the Passion of our Lord on Holy Friday, culminates with the Mass of the Easter Vigil after sundown on Holy Saturday, and ends the evening of Easter Sunday.

The days of the Triduum are central to our faith because they lead us into the heart of our identity as Catholics. Jesus' life, death, and resurrection are the foundation of our Christian life. The Triduum is more than a time to remember a historical event. It is a celebration of our salvation. Every Triduum, we enter into the mystery of God's mercy and redemption. It is important to keep our minds and hearts focused on our own dying and rising in Jesus Christ. We are challenged, with the catechumens, as they are baptized into the life, death, and resurrection of Christ, to re-enter Christ's paschal mystery every year, renew our baptismal promises, and to die to ourselves so that we may experience new life in Christ. Our sharing in the paschal mystery characterizes what it means to be a Christian and a life-giving member of the Catholic community.

#### **Prayer before the Crucifix**

Look down upon me, good and gentle Jesus while before Your face I humbly kneel and, with burning soul, pray and beseech You to fix deep in my heart lively sentiments of faith, hope, and charity; true contrition for my sins, and a firm purpose of amendment. While I contemplate, with great love and tender pity, Your five most precious wounds, pondering over them within me and calling to mind the words which David, Your prophet, said to You, my Jesus: "They have pierced My hands and My feet, they have numbered all My bones." Amen.

#### From the Chancellor of the Diocese of Joliet:

#### LENTEN REGULATIONS

- 1. Everyone 14 years of age or over is bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent.
- 2. All from the age of 18 years up to the beginning of their 60<sup>th</sup> year are bound to fast on Ash Wednesday & Good Friday.
- 3. On these two days of fast and abstinence, only one full meatless meal is allowed. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted on these two days, but liquids, including milk and fruit juices are allowed. When health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige.
- 4. To disregard completely the law of fast and abstinence is seriously sinful.
- 5. Lent is the principal season of penance in the Church year. All of the faithful are strongly urged to develop and follow a program of voluntary self-denial (in addition to following the Lenten regulations), serious prayer, and a performance of works of charity and mercy.
- 6. Those who are sick, pregnant, nursing, or whose health would adversely be affected by fasting or abstinence, should not consider themselves bound by these norms.

# Help a child receive a Catholic education at St. John the Baptist, and you can receive a 75% tax credit on your state income taxes.

WHY IS A TAX CREDIT BETTER THAN A DEDUCTION?

A tax credit is always better than a tax deduction because a credit lovers your tax bill directly. A deduction lowers your adjusted gross income on your IRS Form 1040, so the amount you get reduced off your tax bill is directly tied to your tax bracket.

Example: Tax Credit vs. Tax Deduction

For example, if you make a \$1,000 Tax Credit Scholarship donation you receive a \$750 tax credit which lowers your tax owed to Illinois by \$750. Simple as that. If your tax bill was going to be \$3,000, you just reduced it to \$2,250.

However, what would happen if that was a deduction on your IRS Form 1040 and not a tax credit? A \$1,000 deduction, if you are in the 22% tax bracket, will lower your adjusted gross income by \$1,000, thereby lowering your tax bill by about \$220. In this scenario, we also assume that the taxpayer is itemizing their deductions. If the taxpayer takes the standard deduction (\$12,400 if filing single or \$24,800 if married filing jointly), then the \$1,000 donation would not provide any tax benefit.


#### SPIRITUALLY ADOPT A BABY

Each year on December 25 we celebrate the birth of Jesus Christ. The Church also celebrates His conception on March 25, the feast of the Annunciation. Our parish Respect Life Committee invites you, starting on March 25. to begin a nine month commemoration of the gestation of the Child Jesus in Mary's womb and to spiritually adopt a baby that is in danger of abortion. On the weekend nearest the 25<sup>th</sup> of the month, there will be a bulletin article explaining the growth of babies. "Hail Mary, Full of Grace, the Lord is with thee..." With her acceptance of God's will, Mary's body prepares to carry Jesus in her womb. During this first month of pregnancy, the baby's heart is beating, and by the  $20^{th}$  day, the brain, spinal cord and nervous system are developed. He has arms, legs, eyes, ear, kidneys a liver, a mouth and an umbilical cord. A placenta forms as a barrier to keep his mother's blood separate, while allowing nourishment and oxygen to pass through. The awesome news that a mother is with child can be greeted with great joy or dread-filled sorrow. Each year in the U.S. some 1.7 million mothers and fathers choose to still those beating hearts and reject those budding lives. Pray for all mothers and fathers that they may choose life for their unborn children.


