

#### FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Dear Friends in Christ.

I'm sorry to have had to share the news with you last weekend at Masses that Fr. Michael Groth is no longer assigned to our parish and that we will not be having a second priest assigned to us. Believe me, I was very much looking forward to having Fr. Michael be part of our community, but the Diocese decided another parish had a greater need than us for a second priest. I wish Fr. Michael all the best at his new assignment at St. Joseph Parish in Downers Grove, IL. They are lucky to have him!

Obviously this was hard news to receive, and it really impacts how we function as a parish. Only having one priest I've tried my best this past year to keep things in terms of the Sacraments as similar as possible to when we had two priests. If you recall the only Masses we stopped were the 1:30pm Spanish Mass due to my inability to speak Spanish, and the Saturday morning Mass at 8:30am due to having an evening Mass already scheduled and leaving room on the calendar for funerals and weddings on Saturday.

I'm so happy things have opened up and are getting back to normal. It's great to see how much truly goes on at our parish and how many ministries exist. If you recall, I was assigned during the height of COVID, so I'm really getting my first taste at how much really goes on here, and I know there are more activities that eventually will be resumed.

I really think St. John's is in a good spot, and I pray Our Blessed Mother continues to wrap her mantle of love, care, and protection around us, and keeps interceding for us to her Son.

Having so much going on at St. John's and being one priest, there is a reality that comes with all of this. I'm about to be very transparent with all of you. I can't keep at the level I've been going. In fact, when I spoke with Bishop Hicks and told him some of the details on what I've been doing at St. John's as the only priest, he himself said you can't continue at that pace.

I know my own personal health has suffered in the past year, and I NEED to take better care of myself so I can continue to function as your priest and be in it for the long run.

That being said, beginning Monday, June 6, I'm introducing a summer Mass schedule at St. John's. The daily Masses will be as follows:

#### Monday 5:30pm Tuesday 8:15am Wednesday 5:30pm Thursday 8:15am Friday 12:00pm

The weekend Mass schedule will remain the same as it currently is.

I know this is not the "perfect" schedule. I know this schedule is going to upset some. I know it'll also make some happy who maybe haven't been able to go to Daily Mass previously.

The Mass times are based on the parishes around us. We have a number of morning Masses at the parishes surrounding us; however, there are not any local evening Masses.

The hope is that this schedule will meet a need of all our parishioners for at least two days out of the week since the times cover morning, afternoon, and evening. For those who need an early Mass before work, the hope is the inconvenience isn't too great due to the number of surrounding parishes offering a number of morning Mass times and the opportunity a number of days out of the week to go to Mass after work.

I realize this is a big change. I'm hopeful this new schedule will allow me to recharge and get the proper sleep, prayer, and exercise that I need to best serve you, while still making sure the Mass is offered and made available each day for you, my beloved parishioners of St. John's.

Please pray for me, and be assured of my prayers for you. May all of our souls continue to be led to Heaven, our Mission and our Goal!



#### **NEWS FROM OUR SCHOOL**

To update you on the tax credit scholarships program, I am happy to let you know that we have awarded 25 tax credit scholarships for the 2022-2023 school year and the 26th scholarship will be awarded in the next few days. So far this year, thanks to the generosity of 20 donors, \$128, 697 has been donated for scholarships for St. John's students. Please know how grateful we are for these donations. They truly make a difference for our students and families. Thank you, thank you!

If you haven't made a contribution yet, please prayerfully consider making a contribution to the tax credit scholarship program and receive a tax credit on your 2022 state taxes while making it possible for eligible current and new students to attend our school. A tax credit of 75% of the donation is received on Illinois income taxes and until July 1, parents also receive 25% of the donation as a tuition credit on 2022-23 tuition. New donors, there is still time to double your impact with our matching donations to the program. Over \$10,000 in new donations have been received, and there is at least \$25,000 left in matching dollars. Let's not let this fabulous opportunity slip away. #### SOME DEMONS CAN ONLY BE CAST OUT BY PRAYER AND FASTING

With spring fully upon us and summer just around the corner, we need to focus our prayer efforts for the outcome of the Supreme Court decision of Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Organization. A decision expected this June could possibly overturn Roe v. Wade.

From National Catholic Register – April 4, 2022 – Lauretta Brown 'Pray for Dobbs': Bishops, Faith Leaders Emphasize the I mportance of Prayer and Fasting for the End of Roe in Ongoing Campaign

"We're at this pivotal moment," Archbishop Joseph Naumann of the Archdiocese of Kansas City, Kansas, stressed, regarding the imperative to pray and fast for a positive Supreme Court outcome. "It's really important for we Catholics to pray more, to intercede more for the judges, but also for ourselves, that we can be this society that really reverences the human person.'

Archbishop Naumann, who participated in the launch of "Pray for Dobbs" an ecumenical initiative, said it's important to remember that "prayer has to be the foundation of everything we do and that all of our efforts, important as they might be, are not going to be as fruitful if we're not praying and asking the Holy Spirit to guide us." He pointed to the example of Jesus in the Gospels "frequently going off to a place of solitude to be able to pray for his own fulfilling of the mission that the Father entrusted to him."

The Archbishop also cited Jesus telling the disciples in the Gospels that some demons can only be cast out by prayer and fasting. "Fasting is an important part of praying," he said. "When we fast, part of what we're doing is we're giving up something that's not necessarily a bad thing, but we're making this sacrifice, which in itself becomes an intercessory prayer. It also creates space in our life; and some of the things that we turn to for comfort instead of God, fasting opens up those spaces in our life to turn towards the Lord."

".... We don't judge anyone.
