

A letter from our pastor, Father Matt/Una carta de nuestro párroco, Padre Mateo

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

This past Thursday, we celebrated the graduation ceremony for our parish grade school, and the next day, we had the end of the year preschool celebration. This is the season of graduations; so let us remember in prayer all of our

graduates. May they remain close to our Lord, the source of life, happiness, and virtue, and may He fill them with wisdom and grace.

Tomorrow, Monday, May 27th, is Memorial Day. Mass will be at 8:30 a.m. at the outdoor altar in St. John's Cemetery in Winfield on Gary's Mill Road and Summit Drive. In the case of inclement weather, Mass will be in our chapel. I will also be celebrating Mass tomorrow morning at 9 a.m. in the chapel at Assumption Cemetery, and the scouts are hosting a pancake breakfast tomorrow morning here at St. John the Baptist in School Hall. Let us take time tomorrow to remember in a special way our fallen soldiers.

Next Saturday, June 1st, I am blessed to be confirming many young men and women from our parish. It is a powerful moment: when we call down the Holy Spirit upon them and ask God to confirm and strengthen them. In the Holy Eucharist, the Holy Spirit brings us the Body and Blood of Jesus, who gives Himself to us during Holy Communion. God desires for us to live in union with Him. We can be one with Him, because He has become one with us and gives Himself to us.

Let us stay close to our Lord, and let us continue to keep one another in prayer.






THE GIFT OF PEACE "There arose no little dissension and debate." Did that happen at work this week? Most of us can recall run-ins with coworkers, even with the boss. Did it happen while socializing with friends? Go easy on politics, religion . . . even sports. At home? Even the most peaceful household experiences a little "give and take" now and then. So where was it that "there arose no little dissension and debate"? That tumultuous conflict occurred among our first Christian ancestors, disrupting the community life of the early church. But today's Acts of the Apostles shows how beautifully the Holy Spirit, promised by Jesus in today's Gospel, helped the church achieve a grace-filled resolution. What evolved was that "reconciled diversity," often encouraged by Pope Francis and even envisioned in today's Revelation passage; and a wondrous experience of Jesus' promised Gospel gift: "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you."



Our parish Respect Life Committee invites you to continue the nine month commemoration of the gestation of the Child Jesus in Mary's womb, which began March 25, and to spiritually adopt a baby that is in danger of abortion, if you haven't already done so. Around the 25th of each month a bulletin article will explain the growth of the babies. News from St. John the Baptist School Physical Education

Grades 4-8 just completed a three-week fishing unit that



concluded with a fishing field trip to
Oakwood Park pond
in Winfield to put our
freshly learned skills
to use. The students
spent class time learning how to tie knots,
identify fish, set up a
fishing line and pole,



cast, bait a hook, remove fish and safely release fish.

On each class's field trip day, they spent three hours at Oakwood fishing for bluegill, crappie and bass. The caught fish totals this year reached a record high of 721 fish landed

and released. Eighth grade topped the tally board with a whopping 270 fish, followed by a combined trip of 5th and 7th grade girls catching 201 fish. Fourth grade followed with 151 fish

and sixth grade finished up the field trips with 93 fish. The biggest fish caught was by a 5th grade girl; the fish was a beautiful largemouth bass weighing approximately 2.8 lbs.

Mrs. Norton, the PE teacher, likes to teach the students a variety of different, lifelong sports. This year's units also included bowling and roller skating.


would you transform a vacant or underused space in your community? It welcomed submissions that explored


