

#### A letter from our pastor, Father Matt/Una carta de nuestro párroco, Padre Mateo

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

On this Pentecost Sunday, we remember the Holy Spirit descending upon the Apostles, uniting peoples from many nations and giving life to the Church. The paragraph below is the beginning of Pope Francis' Pentecost homily last year. May the Holy Spirit continue to draw us together in

Christ and give us faith, hope, and love. As we make plans and prepare the church to be gradually and safely reopened, please email me if you are healthy and willing to serve on one of the teams: set-up, greeters, and cleaning. I appreciate all of the kind notes and prayers as well as your generous support of our parish. I am praying for you and your loved ones too.

In Christ, Fr. Matt

Pentecost arrived, for the disciples, after fifty days of uncertainty. True, Jesus had risen. Overjoyed, they had seen him, listened to his words and even shared a meal with him. Yet they had not overcome their doubts and fears: they met behind closed doors (cf. Jn 20:19.26), uncertain about the future and not ready to proclaim the risen Lord. Then the Holy Spirit comes and their worries disappear. Now the apostles show themselves fearless, even before those sent to arrest them. Previously, they had been worried about saving their lives; now they are unafraid of dying. Earlier, they had huddled in the Upper Room; now they go forth to preach to every nation. Before the ascension of Jesus, they waited for God's kingdom to come to them (cf. Acts 1:6); now they are filled with zeal to travel to unknown lands. Before, they had almost never spoken in public, and when they did, they had often blundered, as when Peter denied Jesus; now they speak with parrhesia to everyone. The disciples' journey seemed to have reached the end of the line, when suddenly they were rejuvenated by the Spirit. Overwhelmed with uncertainty, when they thought everything was over, they were transformed by a joy that gave them a new birth. The Holy Spirit did this. The Spirit is far from being an abstract reality: he is the Person who is most concrete and close, the one who changes our lives. How does he do this? Let us consider the Apostles. The Holy Spirit did not make things easier for them, he didn't work spectacular miracles, he didn't take away their difficulties and their opponents. Rather, the Spirit brought into the lives of the disciples a harmony that had been lacking, his own harmony, for he is *harmony*.

En Cristo, Padre Mateo

Después de cincuenta días de incertidumbre para los discípulos, llegó Pentecostés. Por una parte, Jesús había resucitado, lo habían visto y escuchado llenos de alegría, y también habían comido con Él. Por otro lado, aún no habían superado las dudas y los temores: estaban con las puertas cerradas (cf. Jn 20,19.26), con pocas perspectivas, incapaces de anunciar al que está Vivo. Luego, llega el Espíritu Santo y preocupaciones se desvanecen: ahora los apóstoles ya no tienen miedo ni siquiera ante quien los arresta; antes estaban preocupados por salvar sus vidas, ahora ya no tienen miedo de morir; antes permanecían encerrados en el Cenáculo, ahora salen a anunciar a todas las gentes. Hasta la Ascensión de Jesús, esperaban un Reino de Dios para ellos (cf. Hch 1,6), ahora están ansiosos por llegar hasta los confines desconocidos. Antes no habían hablado casi nunca en público y, cuando lo habían hecho, a menudo habían causado problemas, como Pedro negando a Jesús; ahora hablan con parresia a todos. La historia de los discípulos, que parecía haber llegado a su final, es en definitiva renovada por la juventud del Espíritu: aquellos jóvenes que poseídos por la incertidumbre pensaban que habían llegado al final, fueron transformados por una alegría que los hizo renacer. El Espíritu Santo hizo esto. El Espíritu no es, como podría parecer, algo abstracto; es la persona más concreta, más cercana, que nos cambia la vida. ¿Cómo lo hace? Fijémonos en los apóstoles. El Espíritu no les facilitó la vida, no realizó milagros espectaculares, no eliminó problemas y adversarios, pero el Espíritu trajo a la vida de los discípulos una armonía que les faltaba, porque Él es armonía.

# Diocese of Joliet Phased Re-opening of Our Churches

Subject: Reopening Plan for St. John the Baptist Catholic Church amid COVID-19

Dear St. John the Baptist Catholic Parish:

I pray that you and your loved ones are healthy. As you may have seen, Bishop Pates recently shared our multi-phased plan for reopening churches in the Diocese of Joliet.

- <u>Phase I</u> allows for parishes to reopen for Baptism, Reconciliation, Weddings and Funerals with a limit of TEN attendees
- Phase IA allows for parishes to reopen for private prayer and adoration with a limit of TEN attendees.
- <u>Phase II</u> allows for reopening for weekday and weekend Masses for larger groups depending on the guidelines which will be issued by the State of Illinois at a later date, and the capacity of the church building

#### Our Reopening Plan

First and foremost, it is important for everyone to understand that our efforts will prioritize the safety and wellbeing of all while maintaining due respect and reverence for the sacraments and liturgical norms of our faith. I am assembling a Parish Reopening Leadership Team with parishioner cocaptains to lead our efforts. Together, we will participate in required training from the Diocese to ensure that our parish reopening plan conforms to the guidelines developed by the Diocese in collaboration with civil and healthcare authorities. We will also obtain protective and cleaning supplies, as well as guidance on purchasing/maintaining supplies ongoing.

#### Volunteers Needed

We will need volunteers to assist with various aspects of our parish reopening plan. Importantly, leadership team members and volunteers must not be part of a "vulnerable population" nor have underlying medical conditions such as diabetes, lung disease, undergoing cancer treatment, etc. Those over the age of 60 should consult the Parish Leadership Team about possibly serving as a volunteer. I ask all who are younger than 60 and healthy with no underlying health conditions to consider assisting with one of three reopening teams. I especially encourage high school and college students as well as young adults to serve and volunteer for teams.

- Set-up team. Sample duties include ensuring that all supplies needed for each sacramental
  celebration/gathering are ready for use, entrances and exits are marked and propped
  physically open prior to attendees' arrival/departure, windows are opened, etc.
- Greeting team. Sample duties include assisting in managing the flow of congregants as they
  enter the church, making sure attendees use hand sanitizer upon entering, are wearing a
  mask, and are reminded not to enter if ill; directing people to appropriate seating/waiting
  areas, etc.

 Cleaning team. Sample duties include maintaining and cleaning essential and trafficked areas of the church before and after the church has been used. Masks and gloves will be provided, if you do not have your own, in addition to approved cleaning/disinfecting supplies.

The Reopening Leadership Team and I will make sure that all volunteers are properly trained. Please send a message to frmatt@stjohnwinfield.org if you are willing to volunteer. From those that step forward, we also request that some act as volunteer captains to help lead each of the three teams.

#### Timing for Our Reopening

As I mentioned, the Parish Reopening Leadership Team members and I will need to complete required training, which took place the week of May 17. Once all of the team leaders complete the training, we will need to review and complete tasks assigned to all parishes as part of a reopening certification process to be approved by the Diocese. Therefore, at this point, the soonest that our parish could realistically open for sacramental celebrations, private prayer, or Eucharistic Adoration would be the weekend of May 30. However, our parish, like all others in the Diocese, will move forward at a pace and timing appropriate for our situation.

Following our training and certification approval, we will open our church once the Reopening Leadership Team and I feel confident that we have the right volunteers in place to make it possible to reopen. Once we can open our doors again, we will ensure that people have sufficient space between them as well as limit the number of attendees to minimize the risk of the spread of disease. In order to avoid "turning people away" at our doors, we will establish a registration system through our parish website and via telephone to the parish office.

The guidelines and measures required to reopen are designed to protect our wellbeing and that of our broader community. I know this time has been difficult, and not being able to spend a few minutes before our Lord in church has added to the challenge. I appreciate your patience and support and am grateful for those who have begun to volunteer. I look forward to gradually and safely coming together in church.

May God grant you hope and peace during this difficult time. If you have any questions, feel free to contact me.

#### Sunday Readings May 31, 2020 Pentecost Sunday – Mass During the Day

#### Reading 1 Acts 2:1–11

When the time for Pentecost was fulfilled, they were all in one place together. And suddenly there came from the sky a noise like a strong driving wind, and it filled the entire house in which they were. Then there appeared to them tongues as of fire, which parted and came to rest on each one of them. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in different tongues, as the Spirit enabled them to proclaim.

Now there were devout Jews from every nation under heaven staying in Jerusalem. At this sound, they gathered in a large crowd, but they were confused because each one heard them speaking in his own language. They were astounded, and in amazement they asked, "Are not all these people who are speaking Galileans? Then how does each of us hear them in his native language? We are Parthians, Medes, and Elamites, inhabitants of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the districts of Libya near Cyrene, as well as travelers from Rome, both Jews and converts to Judaism, Cretans and Arabs, yet we hear them speaking in our own tongues of the mighty acts of God."

#### Reading 2 1 Cor 12:3b-7, 12-13

Brothers and sisters: No one can say, "Jesus is Lord," except by the Holy Spirit. There are different kinds of spiritual gifts but the same Spirit; there are different forms of service but the same Lord; there are different workings but the same God who produces all of them in everyone. To each individual the manifestation of the Spirit is given for some benefit.

As a body is one though it has many parts, and all the parts of the body, though many, are one body, so also Christ. For in one Spirit we were all baptized into one body, whether Jews or Greeks, slaves or free persons, and we were all given to drink of one Spirit.

# Gospel Jn 20:19–23

On the evening of that first day of the week, when the doors were locked, where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood in their midst and said to them, "Peace be with you." When he had said this, he showed them his hands and his side. The disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you." And when he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained."

#### **NEWS FROM OUR ST. JOHN THE BAPTIST CATHOLIC SCHOOL**

During the quarantine, every school day our St. John's school principal shares an audio of a morning prayer and an afternoon prayer which students listen to at home while e-learning. 

# WHY IS A TAX CREDIT BETTER THAN A DEDUCTION?

A tax credit is always better than a tax deduction because a credit lovers your tax bill directly. A deduction lowers your adjusted gross income on your IRS Form 1040, so the amount you get reduced off your tax bill is directly tied to your tax bracket.

Example: Tax Credit vs. Tax Deduction

For example, if you make a \$1,000 Tax Credit Scholarship donation you receive a \$750 tax credit which lowers your tax owed to Illinois by \$750. Simple as that. If your tax bill was going to be \$3,000, you just reduced it to \$2,250.

However, what would happen if that was a deduction on your IRS Form 1040 and not a tax credit? A \$1,000 deduction, if you are in the 22% tax bracket, will lower your adjusted gross income by \$1,000, thereby lowering your tax bill by about \$220. In this scenario, we also assume that the taxpayer is itemizing their deductions. If the taxpayer takes the standard deduction (\$12,400 if filing single or \$24,800 if married filing jointly), then the \$1,000 donation would not provide any tax benefit

Donate through Empower Illinois (empowerillinois.org), designating St. John the Baptist Catholic School as the recipient of the scholarship. Contact the school office or the parish business manager for more information.
