COME ENCOUNTER JESUS AT ST. JOHN!

Eucharistic Adoration is held every Thursday from 7:30 am, following the 7:00 am Mass, to 8:00 pm in the Chapel.

WHAT IS EUCHARISTIC ADORATION?

Eucharistic Adoration is the act of worshiping God as He is present in the consecrated Eucharist. Since the Last Supper, when Jesus broke the bread and distributed the wine, saying, "This is My Body" and "This is My Blood", Catholics have believed that the bread and wine are no longer merely baked wheat and fermented grape juice, but the actual living presence of the Second Person of the Trinity. Spending time before the Blessed Sacrament, in prayer and devotion, is exactly the same as spending time before the living God. Adoration occurs whenever someone kneels in front of a tabernacle that contains the Blessed Sacrament, genuflects towards a tabernacle, bows before receiving the Blessed Sacrament at Mass, or, in a more focused way, when the Blessed Sacrament is exposed for Adoration. 
FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK





Happy Mother's Day to all mothers, stepmothers, grandmothers, expectant mothers, and those women in our lives who have assumed the role of mother. While we honor mothers today, we should recognize that not all women who desire it are able to physically be mothers. There is however, a type of motherhood beyond the physical one — spiritual motherhood, which St. John Paul II wrote about in his apostolic letter Mulieris dignitatem.

"Spiritual motherhood takes on many different forms. In the life of consecrated women, for example, who live according to the charism and the rules of the various apostolic Institutes, it can express itself as concern for people, especially the most needy: the sick, the handicapped, the abandoned, orphans, the elderly, children, young people, the imprisoned and, in general, people on the edges of society..."

This type of motherhood does not only exist for religious women, but also for those who are single or married. Outside of physical motherhood, a woman can express her motherhood in this concern for "people on the edges of society."

Above all, John Paul II notes, a woman should look to the Virgin Mary for the supreme example of spiritual motherhood."

SACRAMENTAL INFORMATION

Baptisms

Baptisms are held on Saturdays. Parents need to be registered parishioners for at least six months and parents will need to attend a Baptism Preparation Class prior to the Baptism. 
