INSTALLATION MASS OF REV. CHRISTOPHER LANKFORD, 11TH PASTOR OF ST. JOHN THE BAPTIST CATHOLIC CHURCH

At the 5:00 p.m. Mass on Saturday, October 31, 2020, Rev. Christopher Lankford will be installed as St. John the Baptist Catholic Church's 11th Pastor. Our new bishop, The Most Reverend Ronald A. Hicks, will install Fr Chris here at St. John's.

Fr Chris grew up in Notre Dame Parish in Clarendon Hills. He went to Notre Dame Catholic grade school through 8th grade, and then attended and graduated from Hinsdale Central High School. He attended Saint John Vianney College Seminary, then went onto Mundelein Seminary to study theology.

Fr Chris began thinking about the priesthood when he was only four years old. He loved altar serving at his parish, and served throughout grade school and high school. Attending a priesthood ordination on June 7, 2008 at the Cathedral of St. Raymond is where Fr Chris felt a strong call to lay down his life as a priest. Fr Chris was ordained a priest on May 21, 2016 and has served as parochial vicar at Immaculate Conception Parish in Elmhurst and Sts. Peter and Paul Parish in Naperville before coming to St. John's.

THE PRIESTS' PAGE/LA PÁGINA DE LOS PADRES

This weekend, on Saturday, October 31, a monumental event in the history of the American Church will take place: Fr. Michael J. McGivney will be beatified! This means that he will be Blessed Michael J. McGivney and is one step closer to being canonized a saint. When a person is beatified, the Church is declaring that this person lived a life of holiness and virtue and is now in Heaven, demonstrated by a miracle attributed to their intercession. They are held up to the local Church as models of holiness worthy of imitation. And because Fr. McGivney served in the United States, we should know about him and ask for his intercession.

Fr. McGivney was born in 1852 to Irish immigrants in Connecticut. He saw first hand how difficult family life was, especially as he experienced poverty, the loss of his father, and anti-Catholic bigotry. He would go on to be ordained a priest and serve in New Haven, Connecticut. His parishioners held Fr. McGivney in high esteem for the way that he faithfully served them. Seeing the need to encourage Catholic men and support families when they experienced the loss of their breadwinner, he created the Knights of Columbus. Starting with just 24 members, this group of men was dedicated to unity and charity within the Church, providing community and insurance benefits for their members. From such humble beginnings, the Knights have grown exponentially, with over 2 million members and over 15,000 local councils, all due to the vision and dedication of Fr. McGivney. We can definitely see the impact the Knights have had in our community in Winfield! Fr. McGivney died in 1890 at the age of 38 and is buried in St Mary's Church in New Haven.

Whenever there is a new beatification or canonization, especially from the US, we should be filled with hope and zeal. Hope that the Lord is alive and doing great things among His people. And zeal for holiness, as we recognize the impact that a single saint can have on the history of the Church.

Blessed Fr. Michael J. McGivney – Pray for us!

Este fin de semana, el sábado 31 de octubre, tendrá un evento monumental en la historia de la Iglesia americana: el Padre Michael J. McGivney será beatificado. Esto significa que será el Beato Michael J. McGivney y está un paso más cerca de ser canonizado como santo. Cuando una persona es beatificada, la Iglesia declara que esta persona vivió una vida de santidad y virtud y ahora está en el cielo, demostrado por un milagro debido a su intercesión. Se presentan a la Iglesia local como modelos de santidad dignos de imitación. Y porque el Padre McGivney sirvió en los Estados Unidos, debemos aprender sobre él y pedir su intercesión.

Padre McGivney nació en 1852 de inmigrantes irlandeses en Connecticut. Vio de primera mano las dificultades de la vida familiar, especialmente cuando experimentó la pobreza, la pérdida de su padre y el fanatismo anticatólico. Fue ordenado sacerdote y sirvió en New Haven, Connecticut. Sus feligreses pensaron mucho de Padre McGivney por la forma en que les sirvió fielmente. Al ver la necesidad de animar a los hombres católicos y apoyar a las familias cuando experimentaban la pérdida de su sostén de familia, creó los Caballeros de Colón. Comenzando con solo 24 miembros, este grupo de hombres se dedicó a la unidad y la caridad dentro de la Iglesia, proporcionando beneficios comunitarios y de seguro para sus miembros. Desde un comienzo humilde, los Caballeros han crecido exponencialmente, con más de 2 millones de miembros y más de 15,000 consejos locales, todo gracias a la visión y dedicación del Padre McGivney. Definitivamente podemos ver el impacto que los Caballeros han tenido en nuestra comunidad en Winfield. Padre McGivney murió en 1890 a la edad de 38 años y es enterrado en la Iglesia de Santa María en New Haven.

Cuando hay una nueva beatificación o canonización, especialmente de los Estados Unidos, debemos estar llenos de esperanza y celo. Esperanza que el Señor está vivo y hace grandes cosas entre su pueblo. Y celo por la santidad, ya que reconocemos el impacto que un solo santo puede tener en la historia de la Iglesia.

ALL SOULS' DAY NOVEMBER 2ND

On Monday, November 2, the Church celebrates the Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed, also known as All Souls' Day, when we pray for all who have died this year. As in the past, a special Mass will be said at 7:00 PM in the Church where we will remember in prayer those who have died this past year by reading their names and lighting candles in their memory during the Mass. Concurrently, there will be a Mass in the Chapel in Spanish. Names will not be read at the Mass in Spanish.

We encourage you to bring pictures of your loved ones who have died to the Mass. They will be placed on a table in the Church and remain there until November 25th. The picture should be framed and have your name and phone number on the back to ensure it is returned.

Everyone in attendance is asked to wear a mask at all times, and we ask that all participants social distance 6 feet from each other if not residing in the same household.



PRIORITIES AT THE POLLS

By Archbishop Naumann of Kansas City, KS. Chair of the USCCB Committee on Pro-Life Activities

As Catholics approach the polls, we are asked to weigh many important issues. The U.S. bishops have reaffirmed that "*the threat of abortion remains our preeminent priority because it directly attacks life itself, because it takes place within the sanctuary of the family, and because of the number of lives destroyed.*"¹ While they did warn us not to "*dismiss or ignore other serious threats to human life and dignity such as racism, the environmental crisis, poverty, and the death penalty,*" they did give priority to upholding and defending our brothers' and sister' most basic right-to live.

Abortion tragically ends someone's life when he or she is most vulnerable and most in need of loving protection. Abortion is an intrinsic evil, meaning that it is never permitted or morally justified, regardless of individual circumstances or intentions. The personal and societal consequences of attacks against human life, whether at its earliest stages or its final stages, are all the more serious because most often they are "*carried out in the very heart of and with the complicity of the family-the family which by its nature is called to be the 'sanctuary of life.'*"² This is the place where a person should be most loved, cherished, and protected.

Catholics are called to defend human life wherever it is threatened and stand up for human dignity wherever it is violated. The enormous number of lives destroyed by abortion is one factor that elevates its importance. The most recent available date indicates over 2,000 children per day die from abortion in the United States. Since abortion was legalized in 1973, over 61 million children have been killed-and untold numbers of women and men suffer in the aftermath.

The tragedy of abortion is also distinct in that it is currently legal to directly and intentionally take the life of an innocent human being. Current laws in our country fail to protect the lives of unborn children. Our highest Court does not recognize children in their mother's wombs as persons and claims that abortion is a constitutional right. Further, many political leaders work actively to increase access to abortion. Some falsely describe it as health care and even as a basic human right.

People of good will must boldly stand up against this intrinsic evil, especially when it is occurring on a massive scale, implemented in law and funded, in some instances, by the government. As believers and citizens inspired by the Gospel and guided by the shepherds of our Church, we must do what we can to end violence in the womb, to ensure that unborn children are fully recognized and protected by our laws, and to support mothers and fathers in embracing life.






