Well, as I write this, it is Tuesday morning, about 11:15. You'll be reading this at the earliest on Friday afternoon. Has anything happened in the last few days? What's changed? What's stayed the same? Do we even have final results yet? As I have been walking and driving around Winfield the last few months, I see so many political signs in yards. I have seen countless ads telling me to vote and make my voice heard. I see long lines at the fairgrounds as people fulfill their civic duty. But in theory, all of this should be over by the time you're reading this, right? The thought of this week has consumed the minds of so many people for so long and yet here we are. It's over, and whatever happened has happened. But I want to pose an important question for all of us: Where do we go from here? Because no matter what has happened this past week, holiness is still possible. As a priest, I know that I can, and will, still pray, offer Mass, and serve the people of the parish to the best of my ability. Parents will still love and provide for their children, teaching them the ways of the Lord. Spouses will still love, serve, and forgive each other with the grace that comes from the sacrament of marriage. To put it simply, life will go on. As followers of Christ, we know that no matter what is happening in this world, it is always temporary. We fix our eyes on what is eternal, and that is the life of Heaven. And how we live and love each day in this life is a preparation for the next. So no matter if we are happy or sad, excited or disappointed with what has happened this week, holiness is still possible and Heaven is the goal. To quote St. Paul: "For I am convinced that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor principalities, nor present things, nor future things, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, nor any other creature will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord" (Romans 8:38-39).

EXPECTING THE UNEXPECTED

If it ever crossed your mind that Jesus was somewhat lacking in a sense of humor, today's Gospel should belie any such notion. Jesus' story of the five wise and five foolish bridesmaids is downright hilarious. The circumstances of the story were surely familiar to Jesus' listeners, just as they are—if we think about it—to us. Weddings never, ever start on time. There's always a delay. Buttons pop off at the last minute. Flowers wilt. Cars full of wedding guests get caught in traffic. Soloists contract laryngitis. Brides or grooms or priests show up late! So the only reasonable way to approach a wedding is with a sense of humor, to realize that something probably will go awry, and, when that happens, to smile about it.

Jesus tells this funny story to encourage us to be watchful, yes; to be ready, yes. But he doesn't tell it to make us dour and somber. The heavy-hearted tremble, waver, lose sight of their place and purpose, and fall asleep. The lighthearted know that the unexpected will happen—is bound to happen—so they are awake in their place and ready in their purpose when it comes.





40 Days for Life fall campaign ended November 1st. It was another record-breaking campaign with 588 cities worldwide taking part. Even Covid-19 could not stop the faithful Pro-Life prayer warriors from coming out to pray, witness, and offer help to those mothers and fathers to save their babies lives. Thank you to all who came out to pray. Remember Planned Parenthood in Aurora is open six days a week, and prayer warriors are encouraged to come whenever possible. Seeing someone outside praying can be the sign mothers are looking for to change their minds and keep their baby.

Plenary Indulgences - In the month of November, the Church has two traditional means of obtaining a plenary indulgence for the souls in Purgatory.

The first is to visit a cemetery and pray for the dead during the Octave of All Saints' Day, which is Nov. 1-8. This year, the Vatican decreed that this plenary indulgence can be obtained on any day in November.

The second plenary indulgence is connected to the Feast of All Souls' Day, Nov. 2 and can be received by those who piously visit a church or oratory on that day and recite the Our Father and the Creed. As a means of reducing crowds, the Vatican has said this plenary indulgence has also been extended and is available to Catholics throughout the month of November.

Plenary indulgences, which remit all temporal punishment due to sin, whose guilt has already been forgiven must be accompanied by full detachment from sin, even venial. Both indulgences must include the three ordinary conditions and full detachment from sin: 1) sacramental confession, 2) Eucharistic Communion, and 3) prayer for the intention of the Pope.

The Vatican has also said that, because of the health emergency, the elderly, the sick, and others who cannot leave the house for serious reasons can participate in the indulgence from home by reciting prayers for the deceased before an image of Jesus or the Virgin Mary. They must also spiritually unite themselves to other Catholics, be completely detached from sin, and have the intention of fulfilling the ordinary conditions as soon as possible.

May the Holy Spirit watch over all of us and guide us.

Come Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful and kindle in them the fire of your love. Send forth your Spirit, and they shall be created, and You shall renew the face of the earth. Let us pray. O, God, who by the light of the Holy Spirit, did instruct the hearts of the faithful, grant that by the same Holy Spirit we may be truly wise and ever enjoy His consolations. Through Christ Our Lord. Amen.




