COME ENCOUNTER JESUS AT ST. JOHN!

Eucharistic Adoration is held every Thursday from 6:00 p.m.-9:00 p.m. in the Chapel. There is no signup required.

WHAT IS EUCHARISTIC ADORATION?

Eucharistic adoration is the act of worshipping God as He is present in the consecrated Eucharist. Since the Last Supper, when Jesus broke the bread and distributed the

wine, saying, "This is my Body" and "This is my Blood", Catholics have believed that the bread and wine are no longer merely baked wheat and fermented grape juice, but the actual living presence of the Second Person of the Trinity. Spending time before the Blessed Sacrament, in prayer and devotion, is exactly the same as spending time before the living God. Adoration occurs whenever someone kneels in front of a tabernacle that contains the Blessed Sacrament, genuflects towards a tabernacle, bows before receiving the Blessed Sacrament at Mass, or, in a more focused way, when the Blessed Sacrament is exposed for adoration. 






Your prayers DO matter...

The lives of two babies were saved outside Planned Parenthood in Aurora during the early days of this **40 Days for Life** campaign. Here are the stories:

A sidewalk counselor spoke to a couple in the street as they were pulling into the Planned Parenthood parking lot on Sept 30th. They appeared to be very unsure of what they wanted to do. The sidewalk counselor explained that



there were better alternatives than aborting the child as the Planned Parenthood escort tried to get them to pull into Planned Parenthood's parking lot. He explained to them that Waterleaf would offer them **Hope and Help.** The 40 Days for Life Day captain at the time was an off duty nurse who works at Waterleaf. She was able to go down and explain in more detail the help Waterleaf could offer to this couple. She took the couple to Waterleaf and introduced them to the staff. We have **learned that this couple chose life for their child!!**

A story from one of the prayer warriors that was praying on the hill on Oct. 2: "The driver rolled down his window and motioned me to come over, he wanted to talk to me. It was an older man in the car with his daughter in the back seat. I went over, and asked him what can I do to help you. He asked me if I was there with the others praying. I said yes. He motioned to the young lady with him and said - when she saw you all there, she couldn't go through with it."

Pray for the protection of the Illinois Parental Notification of Abortion Act. There is a concerted effort to repeal this Illinois law which requires an abortion provider to notify the parent or guardian of a minor girl 48 hours prior to the abortion she is seeking. The law has been in effect since 2013 and has seen a drop in abortions in Illinois by 1,100 per year. Currently, abortion clinics in Illinois do not have to be licensed or inspected, and coroners are not required to investigate maternal deaths due to abortions! This is a commonsense law which allows for parents to be involved in medical decisions of their minor daughters and protects young girls from human trafficking. Veto for this law begins October 19 and is scheduled to end October 28. Please pray, contact your state legislators, and inform others.
