

THE PRIESTS' PAGE/LA PÁGINA DE LOS PADRES

Today, as we celebrate Palm Sunday, we begin the holiest week of the year. We are so grateful that we are in a better place with the pandemic so that we can celebrate these liturgies together. We all remember the empty churches. The livestreamed Masses. No real celebrations of the Lord's death and Resurrection. I even remember a parishioner who went on Amazon, bought his own palms, had them blessed, and passed them out to friends and family. Who knew you could buy palms on Amazon! Obviously, things are not totally "back to normal," but given the choice, I know that I would rather do what we are able to do now, with limitations, rather than having to go through what we went through last year. So we thank God for the progress that has been made and pray that things might continue to improve as we fight against this virus.

As I reflect on the days ahead, I want to offer you a simple invitation this week: Don't just show up to the empty tomb! I think it is easy to go from Sunday to Sunday, and forget all of the drama and beauty of what happens in the next few days. If you just show up to the empty tomb, you miss Christ's act of humility, as He loves His apostles to the end by washing their feet. You miss the Institution of the Eucharist, Christ's self-gift as he nourishes us with His Body and Blood. You miss the loving faithfulness with which He carried His cross. You miss the witness of the Blessed Mother, who never leaves Christ's side in the midst of His suffering. And you miss the greatest act of love the universe has ever seen: Christ's death on the Cross. The Creator, subjecting Himself to the wicked hands of His creation, so that He might redeem us and live in communion with us forever. All of this, and more, is celebrated throughout this week. I encourage you to pray all throughout Holy Week and the Paschal Triduum, allowing these days of holiness and grace to prepare your hearts for the joy of the Empty Tomb.

Mientras reflexiono sobre los días venideros, quiero ofrecerles una invitación simple esta semana: ¡No se presenten a la tumba vacía! Creo que es fácil pasar de domingo a domingo y olvidar todo el drama y la belleza de lo que sucede en los próximos días. Si simplemente vas a la tumba vacía, extrañas el acto de humildad de Cristo, ya que ama a sus apóstoles hasta el fin cuando lavó sus pies. Extrañas la Institución de la Eucaristía, el don de Cristo mismo cuando nos alimenta con Su Cuerpo y Su Sangre. Extrañas la fidelidad amorosa con la que llevó Su Santa Cruz. Extrañas el testimonio de la Santísima Virgen María, que nunca se aparta del lado de Cristo en medio de su sufrimiento. extrañas el mayor acto de amor que el universo ha visto: la muerte de Cristo en la Cruz. El Creador, sometiéndose a las manos malvadas de su creación, para redimirnos y vivir en comunión con nosotros para siempre. Todo esto y más se celebra durante de esta semana. Les animo a rezar durante toda la Semana Santa y el Triduo Pascual, permitiendo que estos días de santidad y gracia preparen sus corazones para la alegría de la Tumba Vacía.

From the Chancellor, Diocese of Joliet LENTEN REGULATIONS

- 1. Everyone 14 years of age or over is bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent.
 2. All from the age of 18 years up to the beginning of their 60th year are bound to fast on Ash Wednesday & Good Friday.
- 3. On these two days of fast and abstinence, only one full meatless meal is allowed. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted on these two days, but liquids, including milk and fruit juices are allowed. When health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige.
- 4. To disregard completely the law of fast and abstinence is seriously sinful.
- 5. Lent is the principal season of penance in the Church year. All of the faithful are strongly urged to develop and follow a program of voluntary self-denial (in addition to following the Lenten regulations), serious prayer, and a performance of works of charity and mercy.
- 6. Those who are sick, pregnant, nursing, or whose health would adversely be affected by fasting or abstinence, should not consider themselves bound by these norms.

The best day of preparation for 1st Eucharist is the First Eucharist Workshop, which normally is held on the first Saturday in March. - Decorated a paper mache box to house their prayer inten-
- Make a bread, similar to the unleavened bread used by Jesus at the last Supper. (Okay, so maybe we tweaked the recipe adding a wee bit of honey and baking soda) Normally, we bake it here and they are to take it home to share with their family at a meal! (That never happens, for I am sure it is eaten in the car on the way home.) This year, the family baked it, asked God to bless it and shared it with one another, just like Jesus did so many years ago.

The Sacred Triduum

Holy Thursday - Easter Sunday

The Triduum is a three-day special period that commemorates the final three days of Christ's life. It begins in the evening of Holy Thursday with the Mass of the Lord's Supper, continues with the celebration of the Passion of our Lord on Holy Friday, culminates with the Mass of the Easter Vigil after sundown on Holy Saturday, and ends the evening of Easter Sunday.

The days of the Triduum are central to our faith because they lead us into the heart of our identity as Catholics. Jesus' life, death, and Resurrection are the foundation of our Christian life. The Triduum is more than just an historical reenactment. It is important to keep our minds and hearts focused on our own dying and rising in Jesus Christ. We are challenged, with the catechumens, as they are baptized into the life, death, and resurrection of Christ, to re-enter Christ's paschal mystery every year, renew our baptismal promises, and to die to ourselves so that we may experience new life in Christ. Our sharing in the paschal mystery characterizes what it means to be a Christian and a life-giving member of the Catholic community.

We hope you are able to attend at least part of this beautiful liturgy.

Explanation of Holy Oils

Every year on Monday during Holy Week, there is a Chrism Mass at the Cathedral in Joliet and in dioceses all over the world. The oils we use in our faith community are consecrated by the Bishop during this Chrism Mass and are placed in the ambry before the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday.

These oils are:

The Oil of the Sick, which is used to anoint the sick.

The Oil of Catechumens, which is used to anoint those preparing for Baptism.

The Chrism Oil, which is used to anoint infants in baptism, those being confirmed, priests and bishops during their ordination and also altars and churches at the time of their dedication.

Palm Sunday

Due to the pandemic, there will not be a procession on Palm Sunday. Palms will be blessed in the



narthex at the beginning of Mass, but not distributed to the congregation until after Mass as they are leaving.

HOLY WEEK

For the Palm Sunday Gospel, we return to the Gospel according to Mark. The account of the Passion takes up nearly one-third of Mark's entire Gospel and, of all the evangelists, he is the one who presents the details most graphically. He depicts the humanity of Jesus most intensely, describing his sufferings thoroughly. Mark portrays Jesus as a complete fulfillment of the "Suffering Servant" of Isaiah, the obedient, humble slave dying on a cross of whom Paul speaks in Philippians. But it is important to remember that we call this "Holy Week" and not "sad week" or "suffering week," for each of the readings today, even the lamentations of the psalm, end in the promise of the strength and hope that is granted by God to those who faithfully give of themselves in love. As we enter into this week through these readings, we must reflect deeply on the sufferings of Jesus, but still be confident in the joy of risen, eternal life that awaits all of us who faithfully walk with him through these days.

Have a Blessed Palm Sunday.




