

### THE PRIESTS' PAGE/LA PÁGINA DE LOS PADRES

A lot of people have asked whether we have been able to visit the hospital in the recent months due to the pandemic. Visitors were prohibited for a while, but now the hospital is allowing priests to come to pray with Catholics at CDH. We won't enter the rooms of a COVID positive patient, but we can pray with them from outside of their room, with the airtight seal separating us. Visiting the hospital has been one of the highlights of my time here thus far, as offering the sacrament of the anointing of the sick is one of the great privileges of priesthood. But there are a few misconceptions around the sacrament that I want to clear up. First and foremost, the sacrament is not only for those about to die. Sometimes people are freaked out when Father shows up because they think that their end is near. No, the anointing of the sick is for anyone with a serious illness. Now the logical follow up question: What exactly does "serious" mean? I think that we can say that a serious illness is one that could cause death. That doesn't mean that death is imminent, but it does mean that it isn't just a cold or a stomach bug. Also, anytime one is going in for an operation which requires anesthesia, that would be an appropriate time for anointing too. So I want to encourage you, for yourself or for a loved one, to err on the side of anointing early rather than waiting until it's too late. Sacraments are for the living, and once someone has passed, they cannot be anointed. Also, to receive the fullness of grace with the sacrament, making a good confession before being anointed is definitely beneficial. This great sacrament of healing doesn't guarantee physical healing, though occasionally the Lord will work in that way. Ultimately, it gives us the grace to go forward with hope, knowing that Christ will take care of us no matter what may come. Please never hesitate to ask Fr. Chris or myself to receive the sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick.


Mucha gente ha preguntado si hemos visitado el hospital en los últimos meses debido a la pandemia. Los visitantes estuvieron prohibidos por un tiempo, pero ahora el hospital permite que los sacerdotes vengan a rezar con los católicos en el CDH. No entraremos a los cuartos de un paciente con COVID, pero podemos orar con ellos desde fuera de su habitación, con el sello hermético separándonos. Visitar el hospital ha sido uno de las bendiciones de mi tiempo aquí hasta ahora, ya que ofrecer el sacramento de la unción de los enfermos es uno de los grandes privilegios del sacerdocio. Pero hay algunos conceptos erróneos sobre este sacramento que quiero aclarar. En primer lugar, el sacramento no es solo para quienes están a punto de morir. A veces, la gente se asusta cuando el padre aparece porque piensan que su fin está cerca. No, la unción de los enfermos es para cualquiera que tenga una enfermedad grave. Ahora la pregunta lógica de seguimiento: ¿Qué significa exactamente "grave"? Creo que podemos decir que una enfermedad grave es aquella que puede provocar la muerte. Eso no significa que la muerte sea inmanente, pero sí significa que no es solo un resfriado o un virus estomacal. Además, cada vez que uno va a someterse a una operación que requiera anestesia, ese también sería un momento apropiado para la unción. Así que quiero animarte, para ti o para un ser querido, a errar por el lado de la unción temprano en lugar de esperar hasta que sea demasiado tarde. Los sacramentos son para los vivos, y cuando alguien ha fallecido, no puede ser ungido. Además, para recibir la plenitud de la gracia con el sacramento, es definitivamente mejor confesarse antes de ser ungido. Este gran sacramento de curación no garantiza la curación física, aunque ocasionalmente el Señor trabaja de esa manera. En realidad, nos da la gracia de seguir adelante con esperanza, sabiendo que Cristo cuidará de nosotros sin importar lo que venga. No dude en preguntarle al Padre Chris o yo para recibir el sacramento de la Unción de los Enfermos.






### SAINT PIUS OF PIETRELCINA (1887-1968) September 23

Did the World War II American flyer really see Padre Pio in midair, preventing the bombing of his village below? Did Pio actually "bilocate" in Italy, the Holy Land, even America, as countless witnesses testified? Or "read hearts" before penitents spoke? What of the *stigmata*, Christ's wounds imprinted on Padre Pio's hands, feet, and side? John Paul II, who as a young man visited Pio, never mentioned these extraordinary elements at the canonization. Instead, the pope spoke of "trials accepted with love," referring perhaps to sanctions restricting Pio's faculties for hearing confessions and celebrating public Mass, imposed because of criticism, later discredited, sent to the Vatican; of Pio's offering his sufferings in union with Jesus' passion for a suffering world; of his continual availability to sinners seeking direction and absolution; of Padre Pio's prayer that blossomed in charity, especially through his House for the Relief of Suffering, a healthcare facility that anticipated by decades today's holistic partnering of medical science and spirituality. Finally, how comforting for us ordinary Christians, this extraordinary saint's most frequent advice: "Pray, hope, and don't worry!"

# WHY IS A TAX CREDIT BETTER THAN A DEDUCTION?

A tax credit is always better than a tax deduction because a credit lovers your tax bill directly. A deduction lowers your adjusted gross income on your IRS Form 1040, so the amount you get reduced off your tax bill is directly tied to your tax bracket.

Example: Tax Credit vs. Tax Deduction

For example, if you make a \$1,000 Tax Credit Scholarship donation you receive a \$750 tax credit which lowers your tax owed to Illinois by \$750. Simple as that. If your tax bill was going to be \$3,000, you just reduced it to \$2,250.

However, what would happen if that was a deduction on your IRS Form 1040 and not a tax credit? A \$1,000 deduction, if you are in the 22% tax bracket, will lower your adjusted gross income by \$1,000, thereby lowering your tax bill by about \$220. In this scenario, we also assume that the taxpayer is itemizing their deductions. If the taxpayer takes the standard deduction (\$12,400 if filing single or \$24,800 if married filing jointly), then the \$1,000 donation would not provide any tax

### EMAIL RECEIVED FROM OUR DIOCESE OF JOLIET: TARGETED CYBER SECURITY ATTACK

A St. John's parishioner called the parish office recently to let us know he received a "scam" text from our pastor requesting eBay gift certificates. Please know our priests will never text you and request money or gift cards. The day following the phone call we received the email below from our diocese regarding fraudulent contacts from clergy:

"Recently there has been an increase in fraudulent emails targeting church members and staff. A common version of the scam seen is an email appearing to be from the Bishop sent to Conference staff members, pastors or church members asking them to send money or purchase gift cards for an emergency situation. On careful inspection of these spoofed emails, the receiver can notice several red flags including, odd wording and strange formatting. One such recent email with the subject "Bishop Council" included a fraudulent link.

There are several steps you can take if you think you have received a scam email.

- **Double-check the sender's email address.** A spoofed email address often has an extension similar to the legitimate email address.
- Look for clues. Does the email contain weird indents, maybe comprised of just sentence fragments? Does the sender usually send short emails or odd requests? These are telltale signs that the email is not legitimate.


Always verify in person/telephone before sending money or sensitive data. Be suspicious! Make it standard operating procedure to confirm email requests for wire transfer, debit cards, account information or confidential information.

Please stay vigilant when checking email and to follow the steps above to avoid falling victim to an email impersonation attempt or spoofed email scam."

### **SEVENTH MONTH**

The infant listens intently for His mother's recognizable voice. A child of seven months would survive birth. Four to 20 couples wait to adopt each available child. The average abortion takes 5-10 minutes. The average wait for adoption is 2-10 years.

Pray for all adoptive parents who provide the loving care and nourishing environment which every child deserves, and for foster parents who lend their hearts and homes to those whose fates hang in the balance.


