

This is a big deal for our family because this is the first of the "next generation." So my parents are now grandparents, I am an uncle, my other sister is an aunt, and Thomas will soon learn that he will be rather spoiled! I was able to go over to visit Thomas earlier this week, keeping my distance because I am pretty out and about in my life as a priest. There were a few things that struck me that I wanted to share with all of you. First of all, my nephew has an awesome name: Thomas Francis. Sometimes, there is a desire to get super creative naming children. But there is a beauty in picking saint names, so that the child can have some holy role models to look to through their life. So St. Thomas the Apostle and St. Francis of Assisi will be special intercessors for little Thomas. And in terms of creativity, there are so many great saint names that you can choose from that would definitely let your child stand out! Secondly, my sister asked me to help her find a good crucifix for his nursery. I was happy to help because I believe that every bedroom in a house should have a crucifix. It is a beautiful reminder that the Lord is always with us, teaching us how

to love with all that we have. So if you don't have a crucifix in your bedroom, think about putting one up where you can see it. And lastly, we have already been talking about setting a date for Thomas' baptism! It is so important to baptize children shortly after they are born because we want the Lord to be working in their lives from the very beginning. In baptism, we become beloved sons and daughters of God, and this identity is foundational in the Christian life. 





Help a child receive a Catholic education at St. John the Baptist, and you can receive a 75% tax credit on your state income taxes.

WHY IS A TAX CREDIT BETTER THAN A DEDUCTION?

A tax credit is always better than a tax deduction because a credit lovers your tax bill directly. A deduction lowers your adjusted gross income on your IRS Form 1040, so the amount you get reduced off your tax bill is directly tied to your tax bracket.

Example: Tax Credit vs. Tax Deduction

For example, if you make a \$1,000 Tax Credit Scholarship donation you receive a \$750 tax credit which lowers your tax owed to Illinois by \$750. Simple as that. If your tax bill was going to be \$3,000, you just reduced it to \$2,250.


However, what would happen if that was a deduction on your IRS Form 1040 and not a tax credit? A \$1,000 deduction, if you are in the 22% tax bracket, will lower your adjusted gross income by \$1,000, thereby lowering your tax bill by about \$220. In this scenario, we also assume that the taxpayer is itemizing their deductions. If the taxpayer takes the standard deduction (\$12,400 if filing single or \$24,800 if married filing jointly), then the \$1,000 donation would not provide any tax

Bishop Pates Announces the Fall Re-Opening of Catholic Schools in the Diocese of Joliet

June 16, 2020

JOLIET, IL-- Bishop Richard Pates, Apostolic Administrator of the Diocese of Joliet, announced today that the 52 Catholic schools in the diocese will open this Fall.

The bishop has appointed a task force headed by Fr. Burke Masters to prepare the schools so that each will fully comply with necessary provisions to make the particular school safe in the face of the coronavirus pandemic.

"The stakeholders of our schools – parents and children, administrators and teachers, priests and parishioners – very much desire to see our schools fully functioning this Fall," Bishop Pates said.

He also noted that the re-opening of diocesan parishes has gone very well, with the vast majority of parishes now celebrating Mass again. In order to open, each of the parishes had to be certified that certain, defined safety measures were in place. A similar certification process will be developed for our schools.

"All connected with our Catholic schools eagerly await the new school year to once again benefit from the academic excellence and Catholic identity that characterize these schools."

NEWS FROM OUR ST. JOHN THE BAPTIST CATHOLIC SCHOOL

Below is a letter our St. John's School Principal, Joanne Policht, sent to School Parents:

UPDATE ON BACK TO SCHOOL PLAN THIS FALL

July 14, 2020

Good evening, SJB (School) Families,

I know that this is a stressful time for everybody, and I'm sure that there are a lot of questions from all of you in regards to SJB's back to school plan this fall. We are working hard to make sure that everyone can safely return to school as scheduled on August 19th. In order to do that, we were required to submit a plan to the Catholic Schools Office by June 30th. I worked with a group of teachers, our facilities manager, and school board members to develop the plan. It is currently under review with the Diocese. On Friday afternoon, our new superintendent, Dr. Boyle, communicated the re-opening plan review process. From the Catholic Schools Office, the re-opening plan is going to the re-entry committees, which are multi-disciplinary in nature and are comprised of medical professionals, school and legal professionals; and parent representatives. Each approved plan will be returned to the school along with a certification form. Until it has been approved and certified, the Catholic Schools Office has specifically asked us to hold off on any type of formal communication as it relates to the return to school. I know that they are working to turn the plans around as quickly as possible, and I should have it back by the end of July.

With that being said, I can share that what we submitted was detailed and well thought out. As with many of the public school plans, we are recommending that classes stay together in their classrooms for the day, with limited interaction outside of their rooms. Specials (art, tech, etc.) will take place in the classrooms to limit the amount of children in the hallways. We will have different doors for arrival and dismissal, lanes in the hallways, and temperature checks each morning. This is just a small portion of what we have laid out in the plan.

As soon as we have an approved plan, I will communicate it to all of you. In early August, I will then reconvene the School Reopening Team to further discuss the implementation of the plan as well as review Bishop Pates' and Governor Pritzker's recommendations, information from the healthcare community, and school opening guidelines of the CDC and other agencies. We will also review the school plan and revise it in terms of lessons learned from the parish re-opening plan. I will continue discussions with Fr. Chris, our new pastor, and adjust as needed to ensure the safety of all.

I know that masks are a hot topic, but until we have the diocesan guidelines on masks; unfortunately, I cannot give a definitive answer on them. We will be the following the current guidelines established by the various health and governing agencies.

I want to reiterate that unless we receive different guidance from the Diocese, we plan to be back in person, full-time, starting on August 19th.


I appreciate your patience as we all navigate these new, uncharted waters, and can't tell you how excited I am to see all those smiling faces on August 19th!


