

Transfiguration Of The Lord, August 6, 2023

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Dear Friends In Christ,

Sometimes I feel like there are not enough chances for me to address all of the issues and stories I would like to share with you. There just never seems to be enough time or weeks in the year, which it's so hard to believe it's already August! So, today I'm going to talk about two subjects – one is liturgical, and one is not.



Let's start with the more important one first – sacred scripture. Liturgically, today is the feast of the Transfiguration of our Lord Jesus Christ. It's an important event in Jesus' life and the life of the Church. On this day, we celebrate that Jesus took three of His disciples, Peter, James and John, and went with them high up on a mountain. During this trek, He became dazzling white in front of the three apostles present, and was Transfigured before them.

What I love about the Transfiguration is that it shows Jesus in His glory. The glory to come in Heaven. It really is the feast day of our parish mission statement, leading souls to Heaven! It is also a feast of Hope, as we all, I hope, no pun intended, desire to be in that Glory of Heaven one day.

And, now for subject number two. As everybody here is aware, we have struggled with our air conditioning system in the church for well over a month now. We have now had two outages over that time period, and with the brutal heat and humidity at the end of July the church was just downright uncomfortable. Fortunately, we were able to accommodate everybody inside the chapel, where the air, thanks be to God, is working fine.

However, this is only a short-term solution. Mass attendance in the summer is typically lower due to summer vacations. Soon, we will need to be returning to the church for Mass. Our church has served us very well over the years, but in the fall it turns forty years old, and some of its infrastructure has outlived its useful life.

As you know, I believe I am truly blessed to be part of St. John's. I have always received an outpouring of support in prayer, administratively, and with the financial generosity of our community. Because of that, you also know that I try to focus on only two large special collections a year– the diocese annual appeal fund which supports our deacons and seminarians, and our 53rd Sunday collection which helps us meet our fiscal year operations shortfall.

However, the replacement of the major components of the air conditioning system is going to be a very significant expense. North of \$100k. I've prayed hard about this, given it a lot of thought, and also taken into consideration a lot of feedback I have already received from many of you. Given our circumstances, I am asking you to consider making a donation to help St. John's replace this old and failing equipment.

I already have received commitments from a number of generous donors to contribute towards the replacement of the system, and one donor is even willing to match donations specifically targeted for the replacement of the air conditioning equipment, up to a certain limit. Once I receive their permission, I will make that matching number known to you. To get this accomplished, and to see where we stand realistically on funding this project, I would like to hold a special second collection each of the next two weeks, August 13th and August 20th. Any contributions will help us replace the failing system, and I ask that you pray and consider with this effort.

Obviously, more information is to follow. We will be securing multiple bids for the project to ensure that we are the best stewards with resources we have for St. John's. In the meantime, as always, I am humbled by your past and continued prayers, support and generosity. I wish you a blessed and safe week.

Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

The Illinois tax credit scholarship program has proven to be a beacon of hope and a guiding force toward a better life for thousands of Illinois students and their families. However, that light may be snuffed out unless the Illinois General Assembly acts to continue the law that provides for this program. Therefore, we are writing to ask you to contact your Illinois state representative and state senator to express your desire to retain the tax credit scholarship program.

Since its inception six years ago, the tax credit scholarship program has generated overwhelmingly positive results. Nearly 40,000 scholarships have been awarded to students attending private schools in the state. These scholarships are funded through contributions from donors who receive a 75% tax credit for their donation on their Illinois state income tax. All of the scholarships are need-based. Without this program, Illinois families may be unable to send their loved ones to the school of their choice. Demand for scholarships is high - for every scholarship granted, three students were turned down due to lack of funds.

Allowing the tax credit scholarship program to sunset would not only be a life altering disservice to the families it is designed to help, but would also create long-term consequences by weakening the state's educational choices and placing additional roadblocks in front of thousands of Illinois students on the path to a brighter future.


