FIRST STATION

Jesus is Condemned to Death

V. We adore You, O Christ, and we praise You.

O Jesus, You are standing all alone. No friends are with You — nobody to speak up for You — no one to help defend You. You spent all Your life in helping others, in performing miracles and curing and doing good things for everybody. And now they are going to kill You for it. When I am scolded by my parents or superiors for something I didn't do, help me to remember what You did for me — how You accepted criticism and scolding and didn't complain.

Let us Pray. O God, many times people don't seem to understand. They jump to conclusions and yell at me for something I didn't do, or didn't mean. Help me to accept their mistakes as You accept the mistakes I make in this life. Through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

SECOND STATION

Jesus Accepts His Cross

- V. We adore You, O Christ, and we praise You.
- R. Because by Your Holy Cross You have redeemed the world.



As You place the cross over Your shoulder, You know for certain that it will not be taken away until You are nailed to it on Calvary. But You take it just the same. Crosses are problems and nobody likes them. Crosses are not happy things but they are a part of our human life. I don't think I can promise You that I will look for them during my life, but I do promise that I will try to carry them when You send them to me.

- R. And with your spirit.

Let us pray. O God, my problems may seem small to a lot of grown-ups, but You know that they are big as far



as I'm concerned. These crosses aren't easy but when I'm about to complain about them, help me to remember Christ and His Cross. Through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

THIRD STATION

Jesus Falls

V. We adore You, O Christ, and we praise You.

R. Because by Your Holy Cross You have redeemed the world.



You've lost a lot of blood, Christ, because of the mean treatment You received. You are weak and almost ready to faint from the pain You have — and You fall. Nobody seems ready to help You, either. The soldiers push You, and kick You, and yell at You to get up and keep going. You fall from weakness but somehow You do find the strength to get up and keep going. You continue what You started.

- V. The Lord be with you.
- R. And with your spirit.

Let us pray. O God, I know there are a lot of times that I begin to do things and then get tired of them. Or else, I don't do them too well and I want to forget about them. Sometimes, I get hollered at in school because I don't pay attention to what I should



be doing. Help me, God, to be like Your Son — help me to keep at the things I started and to complete them as best I can. Through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

FOURTH STATION

Jesus Meets His Mother

- V. We adore You, O Christ, and we praise You.
- R. Because by Your Holy Cross You have redeemed the world.



With all the yelling and screaming going on, and with all the hateful and dirty words they are shouting at You, You finally find someone who loves You and feels for You. It is Your Mother. She can't do much for You to stop the suffering, but she gives You a look that tells You she is suffering with You, and You are helped by this. Someone does understand.

- R. And with your spirit.



Let us pray. O God, you gave me my parents. No one else in the whole world could be my mother or father. Thank You God for that gift. No matter how hard things seem for me, I know that they are there and that they really do love me. Help me to show them I love them. Through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

FIFTH STATION

Simon Takes the Cross

- V. We adore You, O Christ, and we praise You.
- R. Because by Your Holy Cross You have redeemed the world.



The soldiers are afraid that You may not make the hill to Your crucifixion. You are getting weaker and weaker. So they grab a man out of the crowd, a man named Simon, and they force him to carry Your cross for awhile. He doesn't want to, but they make him do it. He'd rather just stand there and watch what is going on. He didn't come to help You, but here he is carrying Your cross.

Let us pray. O God, I guess I would have to say that I am a lot like this man Simon. How many times I



could have helped someone else. Maybe by watching my younger brother or sister; maybe by helping a classmate with her studies; maybe by offering to go to the store or help with the dishes. Help me to do more than just stand by and watch. Help me to be a doer. Through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

SIXTH STATION

Veronica Wipes the Face of Jesus


- V. We adore You, O Christ, and we praise You.

Let us pray. O God, teach me to give a little of myself to someone who needs me. Teach me to go





SEVENTH STATION


Jesus Falls Again

EIGHTH STATION Jesus Meets the Women



V. We adore You, O Christ, and we praise You.R. Because by Your Holy Cross You have redeemed the world.

On the side of the road You are traveling, there is a group of women who are watching. As You pass them, You see they are crying. You stop for just a moment to talk to them. You try to offer them some comfort for their sorrow. How like You, my God. They are crying for You and Your sufferings, and in turn You stop and try to make them feel better.

Let us pray. O God, many times I get so wound up in myself I forget about others. Many times I don't think about anybody but myself. Help me be aware that others have problems also, and that others need help besides myself. Help me to give them whatever help I can. Through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

NINTH STATION

Jesus Falls the Third and Last Time

- V. We adore You, O Christ, and we praise You.
- R. Because by Your Holy Cross You have redeemed the world.



You are nearing the Hill of Calvary. And once more You fall beneath Your cross. The top of that hill means the end of Your human life — but it is also the place where You can save the world and do Your Father's Will. Despite the weakness that overcomes Your body, the sight of that hill gives You the added strength to get up once more and continue on. You rise. You lift Yourself up. You continue.

- R. And with your spirit.



Let us pray. O God, these three falls are an example to me. You are telling me that no matter how often I have fallen by disobedience, by carelessness, by lying or cheating, that all I really need to do is lift myself up and try again. If I try, You will help—and when we work together like that, I can be the person You want me to be. Through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

TENTH STATION

Jesus is Stripped of His Clothes

V. We adore You, O Christ, and we praise You.

R. Because by Your Holy Cross You have redeemed the world.



The soldiers rip off the cloak they threw on You after Your beating at Pilate's Palace. All the wounds are torn open once more and Your whole body is a mess of blood and sores. Some of the people make jokes or laugh at You or spit at You. They tell You to perform a miracle and they will believe You — and little do they know that You are about to perform the greatest of all miracles — the salvation of the whole world.

Let us pray. O God, as Jesus is stripped of His clothes, let me always be aware of the need to keep my body and soul pure and clean. Help me to overcome worldly desires and be more like Christ. Help me to share in this great miracle of salvation by always being pure in my thoughts, in my words, and in my actions. Through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

ELEVENTH STATION Jesus is Nailed to the Cross




V. We adore You, O Christ, and we praise You.R. Because by Your Holy Cross You have redeemed the world.


V. The Lord be with you.


R. And with your spirit.

THIRTEENTH STATION


Jesus is Removed From the Cross
