Can I Get A Witness!

Our Gospel this weekend comes from John where **Testimony** is a major theme. This theme comes to a head during Jesus' trial before the Sanhedren:

The high priest then questioned Jesus about his disciples and his teaching. Jesus answered him, "I have spoken openly to the world. I have always taught in synagogues and in the temple, where all Jews come together. I have said nothing in secret. Why do you ask me? (John 18:19-20)

That question is important: Why do you ask me? In the rules of the Sanhedren, the accused cannot be asked to give testimony against himself. Think of it like pleading the fifth. Rather the court must provide witnesses whose testimonies agree. In other Gospels we see that witnesses are brought forward but they all contradict one another. Here in John's Gospel we never even hear about the witnesses. In short, according to their own rules Jesus' trial is a sham.

Contrast this with John's Gospel. Does Jesus have witnesses whose testimonies agree? First we find John the Baptist:

And this is the testimony of John, when the Jews sent priests and Levites from Jerusalem to ask him, "Who are you?" He confessed, and did not deny, but confessed, "I am not the Christ."

The next day he saw Jesus coming toward him, and said, "Behold, the Lamb of God...And John bore witness: "I saw the Spirit descend from heaven like a dove, and it remained on him. (John 1:19-32)

And the entire Gospel closes with this:

This is the disciple who is bearing witness about these things, and who has written these things, and we know that his testimony is true. (John 21:24)

John the Evangelist steps forward and offers his entire Gospel as an eyewitness testimony. It seems Jesus has two witnesses, both named John, who agree that he is the Christ. ~Fr Andy

This year, the fourth Sunday of Advent and Christmas are both days of obligation. These are two distinct obligations. There is an obligation to attend Mass for the Sunday, which can be

fulfilled either Saturday evening after 4 pm or Sunday during the day before 4 pm. The obligation to attend Mass for Christmas can be fulfilled either Christmas Eve after 4 pm (Sunday evening) or on Christmas Day at any time. One must go to Mass twice--meaning, you could go to Sunday Mass in the morning and Christmas Eve Mass later that same day.

Liturgical ministry sign up for Christmas Eve and Christmas Day is located in the foyer. Mass times for Christmas Eve are 4pm and 10pm and Christmas Day at 9:30am.

The Solemnity of Mary, January 1st, is NOT a holy day of obligation this year. However, Mass will be held at 9am on January 1st for anyone who wishes to attend.


