### **Mustard Seed Principle**

This week I thought I'd share an excerpt from one of my favorite sermons from Bishop Barron:

What does the building up of a kingdom typically look like? The answer: from the very small to the very great and usually by a slow gradual process. God it seems tends to operate under the radar on the edges of things, quietly, clandestinely, not drawing attention to himself. As the great empires come and go, as the dominant personalities rise and fall, as the waves of history crash noisily against the shore, God's kingdom is quietly advancing, unnoticed usually, but inevitable.

How is European Christianity established? When St. Paul steps across from Asia Minor to Greece, it's a transit that no historian would have noticed. But Paul setting foot on the European continent led in time to the conversion of Europe and through Europe to the rest of the world.

How did the mighty Franciscan movement begin? This religious movement which has endured now for 800 years and exists across the globe. Well, it started with one kind of odd mystical kid who heard a voice coming from a crucifix: "Francis rebuild my church, which is falling into ruin." A handful of followers joined him, then dozens, then hundreds, then thousands.

How did the missionaries of charity commence? One little lady in Calcutta, hearing, literally hearing the voice of Jesus, and moving out to the worst slum in the poorest city in the world and caring for the sick and dying. In the beginning, at that mustard seed moment, Mother Teresa had no money, nobody with her, no institutional support, and yet she started.

See friends, this is the **Mustard Seed Principle**. God tends to begin small, under the radar, off the screen, out of sight, out of mind, in that quiet way and from these quiet beginnings great things emerge. Don't be afraid, everybody, to do small things at the prompting of God. You might feel powerless, useless, people might not notice you, or if they do they might think you're an unrealistic dreamer or crazy as they clearly thought Francis was. Who cares? That's the point. Who cares? Plant the seed. Make the Risk. Take even the smallest step. Don't worry about who notices or how much attention you're getting. See, that's the great mustard seed principle which has guided the graced figures in our tradition. May it guide you today.
