What’s Paul Getting At?

Reading Paul’s letters from the New Testament can be a little intimidating. Especially when I listen to his words at Mass, I often find myself getting lost in his long, run-on sentences. It takes time to carefully parse out exactly what he’s saying. So, allow me to take a minute and break down something interesting in our second reading from Paul’s letter to the Romans.

God proves his love for us in that while we were still sinners Christ died for us. **How much more then**, since we are now justified by his blood, will we be saved through him from the wrath. Indeed, if, while we were enemies, we were reconciled to God through the death of his Son, **how much more**, once reconciled, will we be saved by his life. **Not only that, but** we also boast of God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have now received reconciliation. (Rm 5:8-11)

Now, I wouldn’t blame you if you got lost somewhere in there. But If we look at these bolded phrases we begin to see a pattern. Paul starts with the fact that Jesus died for us even though we didn’t deserve it, and then unpacks what that means for us. Each of these “how much more” phrases is like one domino knocking over the next. What do we get if we put it all together?

Jesus died for us. Domino. By doing this he saved us. Domino. But not just saved us, he brought us back into a loving relationship with God. Domino. But not just that, he invites us to celebrate and boast in this reconciliation!

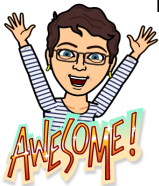
