The Jewish Feast of Pentecost

The coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost, which we read about in our first reading, fell on one of three major pilgrimages on the Jewish calendar. These were feasts where every Jewish male who was able would travel to Jerusalem to offer prayers and praise to God. This feast’s colloquial name was Pentecost or “fiftieth,” as in the fiftieth day since the feast of Passover. However, its actual name is Shavuot (השבועות) or the “feast of weeks.” This festival marked the beginning of the wheat harvest, with prayers that God would make the harvest bountiful.

As the Disciples receive the Holy Spirit, Jews from all corners of the world who are present for the festival begin to approach and listen to the disciples. Notice how Luke takes the time to list 15 different cultures that these Jewish pilgrims come from. It is as if God is gathering his divided people, harvesting these once scattered seeds.

Today as we gather to ask for a greater share of the Holy Spirit’s power and unity, listen to the words of Jesus and answer his call:

“The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few; therefore pray earnestly to the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest.”
Mt 9:37-38
