Deacon's Digest:

November....

There is now no doubt that we have entered the fall season. Those unseasonably warm temperatures have gone away and the current forecast even includes a slight chance of snow. Many of my friends and acquaintances tell me that fall is their favorite season and I concur. The beautiful changing of the colors, the cooler temperatures, and the "shorter" days all remind us that we are in a new season.

In a couple of days, it will be November and our church celebrates it in a different way than October. October is Respect Life Month in our church - a reminder to be pro-life throughout the year. We work and pray that all persons be respected with dignity and honor from conception to natural death. November is a time to celebrate the Saints and our blessed dead. We begin the month with All Saints Day, a day to remember all of those thousands of recognized saints who don't have a special day during the year. Our Church has Canonized over 10,000 saints over its history and all deserve the recognition of this special day.

November 2nd is All Souls Day - a day to remember all of those who have gone before us in life. I personally love the way our Church honors the deceased and their family in the Liturgy. This begins even prior to death in many cases when the person near death receives the Anointing of the Sick and some other special prayers and blessings. If possible, one of our priests or deacons is present with the family at the end of the person's life. Once arrangements have been made, we offer a Wake Service (Vigil) the evening prior to the funeral. This allows many people to come and support the family and pray with them. Then the Funeral Mass is offered and the deceased and the family can participate in the highest prayer that the Church can offer. The prayers of the Mass are directed at assisting the deceased in their journey from here to heaven and consoling the family in this time of grief. Then we go to the cemetery and offer the burial prayers. In and through this process we hope to help the family say their goodbyes. A good friend of mine who is not Catholic just loves the way we "bury the dead".

At the Wake Service, in the Opening Prayer, there is a line that says "We believe that all the bonds of friendship and affection which knit us together as one in this life do not unravel with death." In other words, our relationship with the person, although changed, goes on in our memories and in our hearts. Whenever my brothers and my sister get together we talk about our parents and share our memories. A lot of the stories are the same ones we tell over and over again but we love telling them. We keep the memory of our loved ones alive by the way we continue to talk about them, remember them and especially when we pray for them. Be sure to write the names of your loved ones in our "Book of the Dead" located in front of the Statue of the Sacred Heart.


