Vineyard 19

The last couple of weeks we've been diving into the parables of Jesus, in particular the many parables of Jesus that focus on vineyards. We read about the master of the vineyard that never stops calling more workers. Last weekend we read the parable of the son who at first refuses to work in God's vineyard but later accepts the call. Now this Sunday we read about a vineyard run by wicked tenants who kill the master's beloved son. Each of these parables has its own unique lesson for us, but if I may, let's take a step back and look at what God has been saying to us over the past several weeks.

Here in Pastorate 19 we are well on our way undertaking the Set Ablaze initiative. Over the last few weeks we've held two parish town halls, thinking and aspiring how God is calling us to:

- 1. Elevate our celebration of the Mass.
- 2. Revitalize our call to evangelize.

In other words, we as a Church - united and fed by our weekly worship - are being called by the master to work in his vineyard for the salvation of souls. Will we accept the call or will we refuse like so many in the parables of Jesus? Look at how actively God has been speaking to us this past month!

And let me add one more layer to this vineyard imagery. Throughout the Old Testament human beings are compared to trees. God's first commandment to humanity is to "be fruitful." Israelites who reject God are said to be "cut off" from the tree of life. Look at how Psalm 1 talks about a faithful man:

He is like a tree

planted by streams of water

that yields its fruit in its season,

and its leaf does not wither.

In all that he does, he prospers. (Psalm 1:3)

So we are called to work in the vineyard but we are also trees in the vineyard. Now look at how Jesus talks about his followers:

"I am the true vine, and my Father is the vinedresser. Every branch in me that does not bear fruit he takes away, and every branch that does bear fruit he prunes, that it may bear more fruit. (John 15:1-2)

If we are going to have any chance of laboring in the vineyard and winning new disciples for Christ, then we have to be willing to be pruned in his vineyard as well. God has clearly been speaking to us this month. Is there anything in our lives that God is calling us to prune so that we may be fruitful in his vineyard?
