For many of us, we're drawn to a particular saint. In this saint, we find something about his or her life or patronage that has important meaning for us. There are several saints who have such meaning for me. These saints I affectionately call my posse, or my "peeps," (short for my people). Saint Padre Pio is one of my peeps. We celebrate his memorial this week, Saturday, September 23.

Padre Pio might be best known for the stigmata that he endured. Stigmata are marks that appear on the hands, feet, torso or head of some very holy people. These marks, or 'wounds' correspond to the ones Jesus received during his passion and crucifixion. For some, there is controversy about these marks on Padre Pio. That doesn't concern me, because that's not what draws me to him. I'm drawn to his holiness, and his natural sensitivity to the presence of saints and angels, and to his honesty.

While Padre Pio preached the proper value of redemptive suffering, he, at the same time, was committed to relieving the sufferings of those afflicted with illness or injury. That's why he was instrumental in the opening of a hospital in San Giovanni Rotondo in Italy. He was also known for his ability to sense the honesty of those whose confessions he heard. He seemed to know when they were withholding, and he would press them to be complete and forthright in their confessions.

We're all called to be holy, and it is Padre Pio who I ask to pray for me so that I might build a holy life by living one holy moment to the next. Of course, there are many other holy saints, but for some reason it is Padre Pio's holiness that draws me. I also pray to him that I might be honest, especially honest to myself.

Padre Pio is the patron of: civil defense volunteers; adolescents; Pietrelcina; stress relief; and January blues. Remember those last two in about four months from now. Until then, in the words of Saint Padre Pio, "Pray, hope and don't worry."
