Celebrating the Sacraments

Sacraments of Healing

Anointing of the Sick is given by a priest representing Jesus, with the hope that, if it be God's will, the person will be physically and spiritually healed of illness.

Reconciliation frees us from our sins, but it also challenges us to have the same kind of compassion and forgiveness for those who sin against us. We are liberated to be forgivers. We obtain new insight into the words of the Prayer of St. Francis: "It is in pardoning that we are pardoned."

Sacraments at the Service of Communion

Matrimony is the sacrament by which a baptized man and a baptized woman bind themselves for life in a lawful marriage. It is a covenant that establishes a partnership of the whole of life, ordered to the good of the spouses and the procreation and education of offspring.

Holy Orders along with the Sacrament of Marriage, belongs to a special group of sacraments known as the Sacraments of Commitment. These two sacraments are sacraments at the service of communion, directed toward the salvation of others. A call to a vocation in the priesthood begins with God, not the person.

Sacraments of Initiation

Baptism is a sacrament of initiation (which you can only receive one time), meaning once you received it, you officially enter into the body of Christ, the Catholic Church. The recipient receives justifying and sanctifying grace when baptized, and the Holy Spirit begins to dwell within them.

This policy requires that education and training in the recognition and prevention of sexual abuse towards minor children be given to all Diocesan employees and volunteers who come in contact with children.
