What is a "good steward"?

"All power in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go, therefore, and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son, and of the holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age." -Matthew 28:18-2

Where your treasure is, there also will your heart be. Matthew 6:21

A GOOD STEWARD IS...

In the time of Jesus, wealthy landowners relied on "stewards" to mange their properties. A good steward was one who could manage all the resources in such a way that the land would yield a great harvest and the landowner make a good profit. The Steward did not own the land or what it produced; the Steward simply managed it. A landowner was very happy to have talented stewards.

When Jesus ascended, His work was entrusted to the Church: now we are all stewards of the riches given us in Christ Jesus. Our FAITH is to bear fruit: we are to pull from the "storehouse" what is needed for our own faith, for the faith of those close to us, and for persons who have never heard of Jesus.

A Christian steward is one makes all that he is and has available for Kingdom of God. How will you manage your life & your gifts so that the good news of God's love and mercy given to us in Christ Jesus will grow in you and all around you?
