**Religious Education**

*Dear Friends in Christ,*

*There is in place in every parish in the Diocese of Pittsburgh, a Catechetical Curriculum for preschool through grade eight in the Parish Religious Education Programs. Every catechetical administrator and catechist follows this program. The overall program builds upon the previous year and is based on the student's age level of understanding.*

*Although each student is provided with the materials needed to learn the basic concepts of the catholic religion, the primary responsibility is focused in the home by the parents. Let us work together to accomplish our primary goal, which is to teach what the catechism of the catholic church teaches:*

*“the transmission of the Christian faith consists primarily in proclaiming Jesus Christ in order to lead others to the faith in him” (CCC 425).*

*To Catechize {teach} is “to reveal in the Person of Christ the whole of God's eternal design reaching fulfillment in that Person. It is to seek to understand the meaning of Christ's actions and word and the signs worked by him.” Catechesis aims at putting “people ....in communion....with Jesus Christ: only he can lead us to the love of the Father in the Spirit and make us share in the life of the Holy Trinity.” (CCC 426).*



STUDENT BEHAVIOR POLICY: We expect children to behave in a Christ-like manner toward each other and toward the catechists.

Students are expected to:

- Attend class regularly and on time.
- Participate in discussions and activities planned.
- Be prepared for weekly classes.
- Complete any assignments given and bring back to class each week.

When classroom behavior becomes a problem, the following procedure will take place:

- The teacher will speak to the student about his/her behavior.
- If the behavior problem persists, a conference will be held with the student and the coordinator of the religious education program.
- If the student continues to behave in an undesirable manner, the parent(s) or guardian(s) will meet with the teacher, the coordinator, and the student.
- If all the above measures fail, the child and parent will meet with the pastor and the coordinator.

**WE RESERVE THE RIGHT TO DISMISS A CHILD FROM THE RELIGIOUS EDUCATION PROGRAM IF THE PREVIOUS STATED MEASURES ARE NOT SUCCESSFUL.**

MISSION STATEMENT: The Saint Titus and Our Lady of Fatima Parish Schools of Religious Education exist in order to instruct our children in the Catholic faith.

**PARENTS AND GUARDIANS ARE THE PRIMARY EDUCATORS OF THEIR CHILDREN.** The diocesan policy in regards to our religious education programs at St. Titus and Our Lady of Fatima is that the Catechetical Administrator, the Parish staff and the catechists exist to support and assist the primary caregivers in being faithful to the vow they took at their child's baptism.

...Religious education is a lifelong process.

...Religious education is a concerted pastoral activity of the Christian community.

...The parents/guardians are the foundations of religious education and together we build on that foundation.

...Jesus is present in every person we teach.

...Jesus is the focus in every aspect of our teaching and activity in the classroom.

**\*RELIGIOUS CLASSES DO NOT TAKE THE PLACE OF ATTENDANCE AT MASS EACH WEEKEND.** Please see to it that your children attend Mass regularly.

## CLASS REGULATIONS:

- Classes for kindergarten through grade 8 will be held on Sunday mornings. St. Titus classes begin promptly at 8:30 a.m. and end at 9:45 a.m. Our Lady of Fatima classes begin promptly at 9:30 a.m. and end at 10:45 a.m.
- Please be on time picking up your children. Staff leaves St. Titus at 10:00 a.m. to attend the 10:00 a.m. Mass. Our Lady of Fatima staff leaves at 11:00 a.m. in order to attend the 11:00 a.m. Mass.
- If an unexpected situation arises concerning your child's pick up, call the religious education office to make alternate arrangements. No child will be excused from class early unless a **written request** is sent or a **phone call** is made to the office.

- Students may bring a guest to class with permission of the coordinator. Guests must observe class regulations and dress code.

## DROP OFF AND PICK UP POLICY:

St. Titus: Parents and guardians of children in Kindergarten through 1<sup>st</sup> grade are asked to:

- > Take your child directly to the classroom before class begins.
- > At dismissal, go directly to the classroom to receive your child.

Our Lady of Fatima:

- > All children will be directed to the School Cafeteria for the beginning of class.
- > Children in Kindergarten through grade 3 will not be dismissed from the classroom unless parent, guardian or other authorized person is present. Please inform the office when someone other than the parent will pick up your child.

SCHOOL ATTIRE:

- Only clothes appropriate for school may be worn to class.
- No one will be allowed in the classroom without shirts or shoes.
- Girls may not wear halter tops, bathing suits or very short or tight-fitting clothing.
- T-shirts with anti-Christian slogans are not permitted.

CANCELLATION OF CLASSES: In case of inclement weather, please listen to KDKA 1020 radio or watch KDKA Channel 2 or WPXI Channel 11 for cancellation information.

MEDICATIONS: No medications will be given to students during class time.
