From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

Having returned just a few days ago from the Footsteps of St. Paul Pilgrimage, I am still working to get my body back in the correct time zone. International travel is wonderful, but it wreaks havoc with one's sense of time and place. In some ways, this is a particularly Christian plight—to always be a bit out-of-sync with the world around us, as we are called to be continuously focused on the world yet-to-come.



In our journey to retrace many of St. Paul's travels and relive his preaching and teaching in a number of the ancient cities surrounding the Aegean Sea, one of the things that impressed me was his deep passion for spreading the Gospel message, no matter the obstacles in his way. Paul lived in the various cities and communities to which he went, but he also lived with a heart and mind that were fixed on the prize yet to come. He writes in his Letter to the Church he founded in Philippi:

"But our citizenship is in heaven, and from it we also await a savior, the Lord Jesus Christ. He will change our lowly body to conform with his glorified body by the power that enables him also to bring all things into subjection to himself." (Phil 3:20-21)

St. Paul cared so deeply about sharing his love for Christ with others, he embraced whatever methods were necessary or effective to make it happen. In Philippi, he connected with an upper middle class household that gave him access to a number of citizens who were receptive to the Gospel message and had the time to listen to his words. In Thessalonica, he labored day and night among working class tradesmen just to earn enough to live on, using every waking moment and every spare opportunity to share the Good News with whomever he met. In Athens, the seat of Greek wisdom and learning, he debated at the foot of the Acropolis with philosophers and scholars. In Corinth, he engaged the merchants and business owners involved in the vibrant trade of the region and spread his message there.

For all of his efforts, he was often ridiculed, manhandled, expelled from synagogue and the theatre alike, he was stripped naked in public, beaten with rods, flogged, shipwrecked, and ultimately beheaded for his fledgling witness to Christ. And yet, his words, because they were inspired by God and because the Love of God burned in his heart, echoed in the early Church and would go on to





Amoris Laetitia...Pope Francis

Pope Francis released the Exhortation on the Family. In the weeks to come, you will be introduced to various statements from the Holy Father.



Jesus Restores and Fulfills God's Plan—In #65—The incarnation of the Word in a human family, in Nazareth, by its very newness changed the history of the world. We need to enter into the mystery of Jesus' birth, into that 'yes' given by Mary to the message of the angel, when the Word was conceived in her womb, as well as the 'yes' of Joseph, who gave a name to Jesus and watched over Mary. We need to contemplate the joy of the shepherds before the manger, the adoration of the Magi and the flight into Egypt, in which Jesus shares his people's experience of exile, persecution and humiliation. We need to contemplate the religious expectation of Zechariah and his joy at the birth of John the Baptist, the fulfilment of the promise made known to Simeon and Anna in the Temple and the marvel of the teachers of the Law who listened to the wisdom of the child Jesus. We then need to peer into those thirty long years when Jesus earned his keep by the work of his hands, reciting the traditional prayers and expressions of his people's faith and coming to know that ancestral faith until he made it bear fruit in the mystery of the Kingdom. This is the mystery of Christmas and the secret of Nazareth, exuding the beauty of family life! It was this that so fascinated Francis of Assisi, Theresa of the Child Jesus, and Charles de Foucauld, and continues to fill Christian families with hope and joy.


