From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

An encounter with John the Baptist was never a particularly pleasant event. Aside from hygiene issues and a diet of locusts and wild honey (can you even imagine?!), John was a controversial figure no matter how you approached him. Welcomed by the crowds of ordinary people, he



preached something that was largely unaccessible to them: a simple path to forgiveness and reconciliation with God. John didn't accomplish this on his own, but rather pointed to the One who is to come to make all things right. Acknowledging your sins and making a firm commitment to turn away from the things that block God's love in our lives will make ready our hearts to receive the great gift of Salvation in Christ. His words are as true today as they were several millennia ago.

What John wouldn't tolerate, what he had no time for, was falsity and pretend. There were two reasons for this. First, God knows what is in people's hearts long before they ever get around to approaching Him. There is no fooling God! So let's not waste time dancing around the harsh reality of sin and death in our lives. If you want to live, name your sins and be done with them. Otherwise, get out of the way of those who do! The second reason is that time was precious. John knew he had only a short amount of time to herald the coming of the Savior. He knew he was offending those who thought themselves to be righteous and in no need of conversion. He also knew that the moment of Christ's coming was imminent. So, he had to reach as many people as possible, try and touch as many hearts as he could so that the Son of Man would find a welcome upon His arrival...their hearts docile to His Word.

In many ways, Advent is our time to embrace John's message and take up his efforts to prepare the way of the Lord. I cannot recommend a strict diet of locusts and wild honey and in these winter days definitely suggest wearing more than camel's hair and leather belt...but we must make John's mission our own. No one likes to be reminded of their own sinfulness. No one likes to be called-out by another or challenged to re-think how they are living their lives. Yet if we don't engage the demanding persona and mission of the Baptist, will we truly be ready to greet the Lord when He comes? If we have patterns of un-repented sin in our lives, it will block our ability to see and be part of what God is doing in our midst. If we constantly fail to see our need for on-going conversion and repentance, can we really hope to be part of the fullness of God's Kingdom?

Advent reminds us that we still have time, but that there is an urgency to make things ready. Just look at all the preparations we go through to celebrate "the holidays" with all of our human guests. What might we need to do to welcome the Divine?

Father Broderick's Scripture Study will **not** meet on December 17 on the regular scheduled third Sunday of the month but will resume its regular schedule on January 7, 2018 at 2:00pm in the IC Parish Center. This would be an ideal time for interested members of the Collaborative to join the study group as we begin reading St. Paul's *Epistle to the Romans*. This letter was probably written in Corinth several years prior to Paul's actual arduous voyage to Rome as a prisoner. This is Paul's longest letter and widely considered to be his masterpiece. We will read and discuss Chapters 1 through 3.

Our beloved teacher, Father Broderick, not only explains the meaning of the Scripture passages, but also presents rich description of the period and places cited, as well as the culture and practices of the people involved. He connects the events in the New Testament to Old Testament prophecies and events, as well as to our own time. This is a worthwhile way to spend an hour and fifteen minutes on a Sunday afternoon. All are invited to attend these sessions and grow in knowledge and faith.

A celestial notion of earthly love forgets that the best is yet to come, that fine wine matures with age. As the Bishops of Chile have pointed out, "the perfect families proposed by deceptive consumerist propaganda do not exist. In those families, no one grows old, there is no sickness, sorrow or death.... Consumerist propaganda presents a fantasy that has nothing to do with the reality which must daily be faced by the heads of families". It is much healthier to be realistic about our limits, defects, and imperfections, and to respond to the call to grow together, to bring love to maturity, and to strengthen the union, come what may.
