From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners.

In an obscure moment in time, in a backwater arm of a very average galaxy, in a very mundane solar system, on a planet remarkable only for its many forms of life, in a tiny, unassuming village that was at



the center of nothing important, in a crude stable used to house and feed livestock...the God of the Universe was born into our world, taking on our human flesh, and became like us in all things but sin. In utter poverty, frailty, and dependence, God chose to enter into our human history to bring about Salvation for us all. This gift would be made manifest in Christ's resurrection from the dead and will be fully realized in all of Creation when He returns beyond the limits of time and space to judge the living and the dead.

The cosmic nature of what we celebrate and cherish this Christmas is profound when we stop and consider the vastness of our universe and our place within it. Through the wizardry of the latest space telescopes and technology, when we peer into the night sky, we estimate that there are several hundred billion galaxies out there, each containing several hundred billion stars, most of which are likely to have planets of their own. All of this has been going on for more than 13 billion years since our universe first came into existence. Formed from the residual dust of Creation, the earth has only been around for less than half of this time. Our universe is so vast, that it takes light itself years to reach earth from even the closest stars, never mind the unfathomably distant galaxies that are barely a twinkle in the night sky. Feel a little small and insignificant?

And yet, we believe that God created us in His own image, setting us over the whole world with the purpose of reflecting back to Him the goodness and love in which we were created. Along the way, however, we freely chose a different path than the one God had wanted for us, rebelling against God's love and allowing sin and death to enter our experience. It was for precisely this reason that Jesus Christ was born among us, so that the present alienation we have from God would not be the final word. Jesus was born, so that we could ultimately live as God willed—in

Just so you'll know what I am talking about . . . A few weeks ago the Gospel passage at Mass was taken from Matthew 25: 14-30, The Parable of the Talents. Inspired by the Gospel and the challenge that comes with it. I asked the people at Mass to accept a talent (\$5.00) from me. 80 parishioners/families accepted a talent and have been very busy doing all kinds of things to increase their talent in order to bring great increase to benefit the important work of the Saint Vincent de Paul Societies of our Collaborative. To date \$3,435.00 has been received! This is amazing! Thank you and well done. Here are some great stories. Our beloved teacher, Father Broderick, not only explains the meaning of the Scripture passages, but also presents rich description of the period and places cited, as well as the culture and practices of the people involved. He connects the events in the New Testament to Old Testament prophecies and events, as well as to our own time. This is a worthwhile way to spend an hour and fifteen minutes on a Sunday afternoon. All are invited to attend these sessions and grow in knowledge and faith.
