### From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

Recently, I was sorting through some old papers, trying to tidy up my office that had become overgrown with too much stuff. There was a great temptation to just "toss it all" and



be done with it. And yet, there were a few valuable pieces of paperwork mingled in with all of the refuse that were worth saving. There was my receipt for serving on Jury Duty this past year. Gotta save that one! Then there was last year's tax return. Better hold onto that one as well. And then a picture a friend had sent me of a mutual friend who had died this past year. Priceless. But all of these were buried in with so much useless ads, receipts and junk mail that I never got around to throwing away. I know, I know... gotta get a better filing system. But there is always that little voice in the back of my mind that says, "Wait, you might need that..."

Maybe God has that same little voice, too. This weekend's Gospel with its parable of the weeds and the wheat is a reminder of the great depth of God's patience and compassion. We all see evil mingled in with the goodness of life. Sometimes these are obvious things like acts of terrorism, mass shootings, and genocide. But more often than not, life is lived in various shades of gray, without a clear distinction between what is whiter and what is darker. Truthfully, when we are dealing with people, the jury is most often out on whether a person, even with struggles or challenges, will overcome them and blossom into a productive and loving member of society...or whether they will spiral ever downward into sin and malfeasance.

The image of the weeds and the wheat is so potent as it reflects the reality that when growing, wheat sprouts and weeds often look an awful lot alike. So much so, if an attempt was made to sort them out too early, it would be easy to pull up the good with the bad, and then there would

be no harvest at all. Wisdom invites us to let them grow until their fruit ripens, then it will be obvious whether they are bearing a rich harvest of love and goodness, or something that works against it.

God is patient. God will wait until His own appointed time to do the harvesting and sorting. In God's own good time, all will be made right. Not on our time, though. If anything, this Gospel challenges us to refrain from judgment of others while at the same time calling us to examine what kind of fruit I am bearing for the Kingdom. It is an encouraging Word that tells us that there is still time, that the harvest or judgment is not yet. But it is coming, we must make ourselves ready.

So, looking over the files of our lives, do we see more wheat than weeds? And what might we do to ensure that we bear the fruit in our lives that God craves?



Pope Francis released the Exhortation on the Family. We continue to review the various statements from the Holy Father.

Love is not irritable or resentful. In #106: When we have been offended or let down, forgiveness is possible and desirable, but no one can say that it is easy. The truth is that "family communion can only be preserved and

perfected through a great spirit of sacrifice. It requires, in fact, a ready and generous openness of each and all to understanding, to forbearance, to pardon, to reconciliation. There is no family that does not know how selfishness, discord, tension and conflict violently attack and at times mortally wound its own communion: hence there arise the many and varied forms of division in family life."
