

From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

When was the last time you were at a festival? They can come in all kinds of shapes and sizes from smaller, more intimate gatherings to arena-sized vastness. Joy and a surrender of everyday cares are hallmarks of the celebrations, as are singing, dancing,



and spontaneous merriment. Some years ago I was able to take in a Red Sox game at Fenway Park when they came from behind to beat the Yankees in the ALCS. Now talk about festivity?! "Sweet Caroline" was never sweeter!

This weekend is known as Gaudete Sunday from the Latin translation of Phil. 4:4–5—meaning "Rejoice" and sets a joyful tone as we make ever more proximate preparations to celebrate the Lord's coming. Certainly there is much for us to rejoice over. God sent his only son to be our Savior, born to us in the person of Jesus. We have been joyfully giving thanks for this greatest of all gifts ever since.

But do we ever think of God rejoicing over us? The first reading from the prophet Zephaniah tells us, "The LORD, your God, is in your midst, a mighty savior; he will rejoice over you with gladness, and renew you in his love, he will sing joyfully because of you, as one sings at festivals." (Zeph. 3: 17–18) God rejoicing over us? After all the mess we have made of our world and after all of the times we have sinned collectively and transgressed God's laws? And God still wants to rejoice over us? So much so, that God Himself will break into song and dance. . .all because God is so happy about us?! Really?

Yes!

This is an amazing truth: God's love for us can never be diminished by our failures. It is with an overwhelming love that we have been created in God's image, brought into reality and sustained in being by God's continuous and sustained love for us. Nothing can take away from that fundamental, underlying reality. Even when we sin and turn away from God, God does not turn away from us. His response, always, is: Jesus. The salvific love of God is so

The 215 students of the Fr. Marc Piché School in Puit Chacha, Haiti, are almost halfway through another successful year of learning and growing. This school year we gave out 21 scholarships for students, which has allowed them to attend a regional high school for grades 7–13. Similar to this year, we hope to support our entire 6th grade graduating class with scholarships so they can continue on to high school next year.

In addition to academic learning, IC Haiti continues to support lunch, dental, and community outreach programs. The outreach is particularly important right now as the community is addressing an outbreak of malaria in the region. Education and awareness are the keys to addressing life-threatening issues. With our own IC community's generous support, we are making a huge

impact on the Chacha community, and we know that providing education to the youth is a way to make long-term change in Haiti.

12 Days of Christmas Float

Holy Redeemer's float was ready for Merrimac's Santa Parade but the parade was cancelled because of the weather.

Our float was the 12 Days Of Christmas. Are you aware: The Partridge in a pear tree was Jesus Christ. Two turtledoves were the Old and New Testaments. Three French hens stood for faith, hope, and love. The four calling birds were the four Gospels of Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John. Five golden rings recalled the Torah or Law, the first five books of the Old Testament. The six geese a-laying stood for the six days of creation. Seven swans a swimming represented the seven gifts of The Holy Spirit. Eight maids a-milking were the Beatitudes.
