

From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

"NEW!"

Even without the capitals or exclamation mark, the word "new" catches our attention, doesn't it? We see it everywhere—newspaper ads, on our computers and mobile devices, in store



windows, and in the supermarket. Something "new" is something different, something we haven't seen before, evoking the hope and promise that our life will be better by purchasing or embracing it. I recently tried a "new" product, that I saw in a convenience store, called "Pocket Coffee." It was a small pack of chocolate-espresso candies that promised to give you everything that a proper cup of coffee would offer: a caffeine and sugar boost to your day. Boy, did it ever deliver! Several hours of jitters and racing heart palpitations later, I finally crashed and came back to some semblance of normal. Sometimes "new" isn't always better. Note to self: do not eat one of these any later than early afternoon or sleep will be elusive!

This weekend we begin once again our short Advent Season, which celebrates the promise of God doing something new in our world. Although God is always the same and unchanging, God is not limited in the number of ways that God can express divine love for us. In a sense, everything is always new, fresh, and invigorating when it comes to God's initiatives. Advent celebrates this joyful movement of God's earnest desire for our salvation by marking the fulfillment of that promise in Jesus Christ and our ever-enduring hope of His Second Coming at the end of time. Advent always has this twofold character: a proximate preparation for the celebration of Christ's First Coming at Christmas as well as the expectation and anticipation that Christ will come again. What started in the musings of the prophets, came to reality in the birth of Christ, matured in His earthly ministry, climaxed in His Passion, Death and Resurrection, His Ascension to the Father and the sending of the Holy Spirit, and will be made complete when He returns in Glory. Advent helps place us in the midst of the new event that God begins and ends in the Lord Jesus.

Many years ago, there was a great commercial on TV for Heinz ketchup that emphasized how thick their sauce was by having actors holding a bottle upside down, waiting expectantly for the first blob to plop on their hot dogs while humming Carly Simon's, "Anticipation" in the background. Although Advent has nothing to do with BBQs or pop music, it has everything to do with joyful, hopeful waiting for the fulfillment of God's promise of something new in the person of Jesus Christ.

May we open our hearts to experience the fullness of His love for us in the weeks ahead.

Holiday Fair Roundup


What a wonderful turnout for our Parish Fair. The Activities Committee would like to thank everyone who donated and attended our "Little Church Fair." We broke records!
