Our Pastoral Plan is One Year Old!

In June 2017, Cardinal Sean O'Malley approved the *Holy Redeemer - Immaculate Conception Collaborative (HRIC) Pastoral Plan*. The Plan was developed by a committed group of HRIC parishioners and included feedback from parishioners who participated in facilitated discussions and multiple town halls. The Plan outlines the purpose, vision, values, and priorities of the Collaborative of Merrimac, Newbury, Newburyport, and West Newbury.

The foundational work of implementing the Plan is underway. This work is focused on our four priorities: **Welcoming Community**, **Forming Intentional Disciples**, **Discerning Vocations**, and **Commitment to Service and Ministry**. These priorities were developed in response to the comments provided by parishioners who completed the Archdiocese's Disciple Maker Index survey in 2016.



For those of you who have not had a chance to read the Plan, you can find it in its entirety on the HRIC website, www.hriccatholic.org.

We have an active Collaborative with many vibrant ministries. But there is more to be done. In his book, *Everyone Leads: How to Revitalize the Catholic Church*, author Chris Lowney calls upon all Catholics to become "holy entrepreneurs," taking a leadership role in the future of their parishes and the Church at large.

The work of our Plan represents the future of our Collaborative. I encourage each of you to stop by and chat with volunteers after each Mass this weekend to explore those areas where your "time and talents" can help us bring to life our Collaborative purpose, vision, values, and priorities.

From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

This weekend, we are taking a moment to mark the completion of our first year working with the Pastoral Plan that was approved by Cardinal O'Malley in 2017. At each mass this weekend, a member of one of our "Priority Teams" will share



a brief update on what has been accomplished and what we hope to achieve in the months to come. I can tell you, it has been a very exciting process to be a part of!

Just to recap, back in 2015, Cardinal O'Malley formed the Holy Redeemer - Immaculate Conception Collaborative as part of Phase III of the Archdiocesan pastoral planning process called, "Disciples in Mission." At that time, I was named as Pastor of both parishes, and Fr. George Morin was named as the Parochial Vicar. Together with our Collaborative Staff, we have been tasked with serving both parishes simultaneously and in such a way as to best serve and most efficiently utilize the clergy and lay resources of each parish within the Collaborative. The parishes retain their individual identity and finances, but share priests, staff, and resources wherever possible. At the heart of this process, we were asked to draw together parishioners from both parishes to draft a Local Pastoral Plan that would serve as a guiding document for many of our pastoral efforts moving forward. Over the course of a year, approximately 30 parishioners and myself met at various times with facilitators from the Archdiocese to draft our Local Pastoral Plan and highlight a number of "Priorities" that we wanted to work on in greater depth. This Plan was ultimately approved last summer, and since then even more parishioners have been coming together in "Teams" to support and implement the ideas contained within each of these Priorities. As the result of much thought and prayer, our Plan Writing Team lifted up the following areas as the Priorities for our Collaborative to work on in the next three years:

- 1. To become more **welcoming** parishes
- 2. To strengthen our own commitment to discipleship
- 3. To better support **vocations** to the priesthood, religious life, marriage, and the single life within our communities
- 4. To strengthen the ways that we reach out to and **serve** those in need within our area.

Although in some ways, our Plan is very ambitious, it is meant to be implemented organically as we move forward. Here are a few ways that we have begun to make this real for each Priority so far, and a few initiatives we hope to embrace in the months ahead:

To become more welcoming: we have introduced greeters at Masses—present on Palm Sunday, Easter, and Pentecost; developed and distributed a Welcoming Outreach brochure, Pentecost prayer cards, and Mass schedule cards for the Chamber of Commerce, local Hotels, and B&Bs; and organized a Father's Day Coffee Social—after the 9am Mass at IC. Still to come: offer a Yankee Homecoming Ice Cream Sundae Social and monthly IC Coffee Hour, organize Newcomer Gatherings, produce a Welcome Information Packet and plan "High Tea" gatherings with outreach to seniors in the Collaborative and community.

To strengthen our commitment to discipleship: we have introduced Lectio Divina to Collaborative parishioners and various ministries, designed and hosted introductory Lectio Divina Information and Prayer Services, developed Lectio Divina Information Sheets—available at the churches and online, and have assessed external Faith Formation Programs—for future Collaborative participation. Still to come: host ongoing Lectio Divina training exercises across Collaborative ministries, the rollout of varied external Faith Formation Program(s), and create small faith-sharing communities throughout the Collaborative.

To better support vocations within our Collaborative: we have established a better relationship with the Archdiocese and better access to resources available to parishes, attended a Vocations workshop sponsored by the Archdiocese and reviewed benchmarked Best Practices which support the encouragement of those considering vocations. Still to come: a rollout of a Vocations Banner to raise awareness and promote vocations in each church and offer a variety of Vocations Prayer Cards corresponding to the interests of different audiences.

To better serve those in need in our communities: we have collected over 400 "Care Packs for our Homeless" and distributed them to those in need in Lynn and Boston, involved youth from Boy Scout Troop 41 of HR Merrimac/ West Newbury and Troop 21 of IC Newburyport/Newbury to sort, build, and deliver the "Care Packs," met Priority Goal #1 (from the Plan) of increasing ministry participation by over 50 people, introduced an Adult Altar Server Pilot program and included 15 new adults and youth trained to serve throughout the Collaborative. Still to come: development of a Ministry Catalog-group listing of all Collaborative ministries with contacts, offer a Mission Week—support Religious Ed. in developing a service/study program for teens/adults as well as create liaisons/teams to support community agencies, and Collaborative ministries for outreach to the homeless.

As I hope you can see from all of the above, a lot has been happening and even more is still in the works. This a very

exciting time to get involved in one of the many different opportunities that our Local Pastoral Plan is providing for our parishioners and those in the wider communities of which we are a part. Following Mass today, representatives from the Priority Implementation Teams will be available to answer questions as well as invite you to participate in any number of upcoming initiatives that will be taking place in both of our Collaborative parishes in the months ahead. I would strongly encourage everyone to consider at least one way to become involved in a ministry, activity, or outreach that is the fruit of our Local Plan. This is a wonderful moment in time to be Catholic and to share our faith with As Isaiah proclaimed in our First Reading this weekend: "I will make you a light to the nations, that my salvation may reach to the ends of the earth." (Is 49:6). So, too, will God work through us if we open our hearts to do His will.

May God bless us all in the months ahead!




