From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

Even Jesus took a day off. Or at least he tried to. Or at least he got a nice boat ride, until the pressures of the crowd met him at the opposite shore. Given that the Sea of Galilee is really more of a large lake, it is not that hard to imagine the people watching his boat leave one lakeside village and head part way across towards a "deserted area" along the shore and be able to make it there on foot ahead of him. The human need must have been profound.

Human needs are front and center in this weekend's Scriptures, with a strong focus on rest as a vital portion of one's life with God. Sometimes we have this view of Christ as a one-man miracle machine, churning out healings and cures left and right by the wave of his hand. As God, there was nothing that Jesus could not have accomplished. Our theology tells us that Jesus was co-creator of the entire universe and in our Creed we are reminded that, "Through Him all things were made." But Jesus was also fully human, with all of the limits and frailty that any of us may encounter.

The need to take a break, to "Come away by yourselves to a deserted place and rest a while," (Mk 6:31) is a most human of statements about not only the disciples, but also Jesus himself. Rest is necessary for our bodies to heal and recover from the days' exertions. Muscles need to regenerate. Food and water are required to replenish the energy that was lost. Our brains need to rest and function differently for a while. We need to sleep to maintain our sanity and good cheer. Even Jesus needed to "chill and refill" on a regular basis so he could be everything that the Father called him to be for us and others. This doesn't mean that Jesus didn't put in a full day of ministry and then some. But while the Gospels don't document every

Too much or too little of any of these (even prayer) can send us spinning off into directions that can be unhealthy or can prevent us from fully recognizing or responding to what God's will is for us in our lives. When there is proper balance and harmony in our lives, we are best-suited as the Lord's servants to do and be everything God calls us to. It is the primary way of discipleship: offering a balanced life to the Lord.

So, this summer, how are we taking the Lord's words seriously? What needs to change? What blessings come from rest that the Lord can use for his own purposes? When we take a bit of a break from anything, do we find a fresh and more effective way to move forward that God will bless? Sometimes less is more!



IC Haiti Board of Directors Report of the President

The Father Marc Piché School finished up another successful school year, which graduated 21 sixth graders and 22 kindergarteners. Our partner at St. Boniface Haiti Foundation (SBHF) has reported that the faculty and staff remain energized and the Puit Chacha community is very appreciative of the positive impact of the school. The school is well established after completing its sixth academic year.

The student dental program started this past quarter and given the annual cost, we should be able to support this program for many years. I have provided some photos and facts about the program this spring.



IC Haiti Dental Program



204 FMP School students and staff were examined and received a dental kit.

156 students from the Fond-des-Blancs' St. Francois School received preventative care.

67 students and staff from the Etzer Vilair School were examined.

The recent political protests in Haiti are a reminder that the country is unstable, and our efforts could be hindered at any time through road blockades, curfews, or political transition. The protests have subsided and were mostly focused in and around Port-au-Prince and not evident in the Fond-des-Blancs catchment. According to SBHF, fuel and supply trucks are being cancelled so some food supplies may be reduced but hopefully, our school food program won't be affected as most of the supplies are grown locally.



Amoris Laetitia...Pope Francis



Pope Francis released the Exhortation on the Family. We continue to review the various statements from the Holy Father.

Proclaiming the Gospel of the Family Today: In # 202: "The main contribution to the pastoral care of families is offered by the parish, which is the family of families, where small communities, ecclesial movements and associations live in harmony." Along with a pastoral outreach aimed specifically at families, this shows the need for "a more adequate formation...of priests, deacons, men and women religious, catechists, and other pastoral workers". In the replies given to the worldwide consultation, it became clear that ordained ministers often lack the training needed to deal with the complex problems currently facing families. The experience of the broad oriental tradition of a married clergy could also be drawn upon.
