#### **Board of Directors President's Report**

I am pleased to report on the recent communications we've received concerning the Fr. Marc Piché elementary school in Puit Chacha, Haiti. Our representative from Heath Equity International (formerly St. Boniface Haiti Foundation), Michelle Rosenberg, visited the school in September. She and Dr. Miliane Clermont, Deputy Director General of the hospital in Fond des Blancs, sent photos of students and teachers (coming soon to the display case at the back of the church); shared enrollment figures (163 in Chacha and 41 in Fond des Blancs); and advised me that the school building in Chacha is in good condition for the current academic year. Subsequently, Dr. Miliane forwarded me the following update:

Even with the trouble in our country, the schools continue to operate in Chacha and Fond des Blancs. We had time to repaint the school in Chacha. Unfortunately, 2 teachers from the community left, but this allowed us the opportunity to hire 2 other teachers who are more prepared to work with kids. It was difficult to find these new teachers. Although they are not from the community, we hope to keep them for some time. We need to do more advocacy to show people how education is important for the new generation.

As you know the distance from Chacha to Fond des Blancs is quite long and the trip is always a challenge for the kids who have moved on to 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grade. I want to share with you that someone in the Fond des Blancs community has a bus to make transportation available for kids around the village. It will cost \$170/month for the round trip to Chacha every morning and afternoon. I choose to inform you to see if it is a new activity that we can implement through your support. Please express our gratitude to all.

In response to Dr. Miliane's request, the IC Haiti Board of Directors has approved payment for the transportation needs of students traveling to attend  $7^{\text{th}}$  and  $8^{\text{th}}$  grade classes in Fond des Blancs for the 2019–2020 school year.

In regards to our September 11 "Bending the Arc" event at the Newburyport Senior Center, the attendees were deeply impressed by the courageous efforts of the doctors who brought their talents to bear in Haiti with its broken health care system. Attendees were also truly appreciative to hear more about the school and enjoyed having a forum to ask questions. The Board will arrange to schedule additional showings of this powerful documentary for a variety of parish groups throughout the coming months. If your parish organization, ministry, or group would like to schedule a showing of "Bending the Arc," please contact me.

Finally, I want to thank you all for your support of the IC Haiti mission. If you have any questions or want to further discuss ways to support our organization, please email me.
