From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

Over the years, I have enjoyed cooking, particularly when I have family or friends to entertain. I find the meal planning, foodprep, and actual cooking time to be relaxing, and prefer to do it with a good glass of wine poured and some gentle



music playing in the background. I rarely, however, venture into the world of baking. Maybe it's the whole exactness of measurements that intimidates me, as I am much more of a "dash of this and smidgen of that" kind of guy. I'll make you beef stew or chicken enchiladas, but don't ask me to bake a cake.

I do recall, in one of my few baking ventures from years-past, coming across a measurement of flour that confounded me a bit: The recipe called for a cup of flour, pressed. Apparently, what it was looking for was flour that had been scooped into a measuring cup, then compacted down, to make room for more flour that was to be added; this process was to be repeated until no more flour could be added physically to the measuring cup. What I realized is that "pressed flour" was easily 1 1/2 times the original scoop. That's a big difference! That's the difference between tall, fluffy pancakes and thin-as-crepe blintzes. Depending on what you are in the mood for, getting this measure wrong will make or break the meal.

In today's Gospel passage, we are given many different sayings of Jesus that have all been collected into one long teaching. But at the end, it offers this image: that of God giving to us a "good measure," that is, one that has been pressed-down, shaken, and is overflowing. In other words, we will receive from the Lord that which we have given, but when God gives, He just can't help but being overgenerous and complete.

Ever buy a box of cereal or potato chips, only to open the container to find the package half empty? Tiny, legalistic print informs us that the product is sold by weight, not

volume and that some settling of the contents may have occurred during shipping....Some settling indeed! Want some chips with that air? But not so with God. God fully fills the space, and then, once it has settled, goes back to add more, and then some more again...all until we can't possibly conceive of there being room for anything else, and then God adds even more so it overflows. All this just underscores how persistent and generous our God is in blessing us and calling us to new life.

God will not be outdone in generosity.

So, in the kitchen or not, here are a few questions that this weekend's Scriptures offer for us to ponder this week: What do I offer to the Lord? How generous am I in serving God? Where might I be tempted to "cut corners" or offer a short measure? What difference can it make if my service to God and others is done freely and without counting the cost, without holding anything back? What short-term advantages do I forgo in order to better serve the Lord in the long run? What difference does integrity and consistency make in my life?

God is the ultimate Master Chef and can work with whatever is in our "pantry" at any given moment. However, the quality of the ingredients that we offer Him to cook with can make a big difference in the final outcome of what ends up on the plate and how it nourishes those we are called to serve.

May the Lord's abundant blessings be with us all this week.


