From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners,



In the past 50 years or so, we have seen collectively many dramatic changes in our society and in the Church as well. Technologically speaking, the internet and the connectivity of things has offered an explosion of new ways to communicate and live. Self-driving cars already prowl our streets. Amazon is

promising to deliver our packages by drone. Your toaster can now talk to the refrigerator! "Alexa, time to order more bread!" Who knew progress would be so profound! Of course, not all changes are helpful or produce the results we hope for. While our internet-connected devices offer many forms of assistance to our daily lives, they also can have the effect of dis-connecting us from one another.

Within the life of the Church, over these years we have seen the liturgy transformed from Latin into English, many new and exciting forms of lay ministry taking hold in our parishes and an ever-greater prevalence of the importance of Sacred Scripture brought to bear in living our faith commitment. We have also seen a dramatic decrease in Mass attendance and sacramental participation, along with a significant reduction in those responding to religious vocations. There are many contributing ingredients that have come together to produce these effects, and no single reason will explain it completely.

For more than a generation, there has existed a phenomenon where parents drop their children off at the parish for "CCD classes" but never make the time as a family to worship together at Sunday Mass. Many multiple incentives over the years for families to try and include worship with religious instruction have failed. Now this generation that was dropped-off is considering what their options are for their children's religious education... and many are opting out of even this minimalist approach. In the increasingly secular world in which we live, more and more families are choosing sports and other activities over Mass and a commitment to traditional parish religious education programs. If this trend continues, there will be no one left in the next generation to hand on our most sacred and important traditions. It is no secret that when many of our young people finish with their formal religious education classes and celebrate Confirmation, we practically never see them again. This is the exact opposite of what we intend as the fruit of any religious education or faith formation experience!



The parishes of our Collaborative are no exception to this wider trend that is affecting dioceses all over our country. Below is a graph of recent enrollment figures for the religious education programs of both of our parishes:

Religious Education Enrollment within Our Collaborative



As you can see, this graph shows an almost 30% decline in enrollment between both parishes from 2015 to 2018. While changing local demographics can account for a small portion of this, actual census information lists an increase in the population of our Collaborative communities. It is clear that we need to consider a new approach moving forward. A famous quote that has often been repeated is that "insanity is doing the same thing over and over again, expecting a different result."

While I believe that we have been offering excellent programming in both of our parishes for many years and have certainly benefitted from good and faithful leadership, I also believe that it is time for us to embrace new models of forming people in our faith-the old and young alike-so that they might become lifelong, committed disciples of the Lord. In concert with our Local Pastoral Plan that has called for new initiatives in Faith Formation for our parishes and in response to these wider trends in our area. I have decided to make some changes in how both of our parishes approach religious education and faith formation. This summer we will be reorganizing the religious education programs in both of our Collaborative parishes. This is being done to utilize our limited resources in the most effective way possible while at the same time seeking new models to reach out and serve the people and families of our local communities.

To this end, three existing positions are ending:

Director of Religious Education, Immaculate Conception Parish

Religious Education Secretary, Immaculate Conception Parish

Director of Religious Education, Holy Redeemer Parish And two new positions are being created:

Director of Lifelong Faith Formation Administrative Assistant to Lifelong Faith Formation

These new positions will be for the whole Collaborative and will be responsible for adult, youth, and children's Faith Formation initiatives within both parishes and on all three campuses.

This spring, in consultation with the Office of Lifelong Faith Formation and Parish Support from the Archdiocese of Boston, new job descriptions were drafted and a hiring process was followed for these openings that included the participation of a local Interview Team made up of parishioners from both parish communities. Working with the Archdiocese. Ms. Melinda Burrell was hired to be the new Administrative Assistant and Mr. Aaron Giard has been hired to be the new Director of Lifelong Faith Formation for our Collaborative. I am very grateful for the support from the Archdiocese in helping to make this possible and took great confidence in the work of the Interview Team that led to Aaron's hiring. The Interview Team members were drawn from people who have already been deeply involved in various aspects of faith formation within our Collaborative. It is my hope that many of them will continue on as an advisory and resource group in the months ahead.

I am very pleased to welcome Aaron and Melinda to these new positions and look forward to working with them and introducing (or re-introducing!) them at weekend Masses in the weeks to come. I am also very grateful for the many years of faithful service and hard work that Dr. Margaret McKinnon and Mrs. Doreen O'Leary have offered in service to our parishes and the wider Church. I am very grateful as well to Melinda Burrell who helped to continue Immaculate Conception's program this past year when Dr. McKinnon left the Collaborative this past September to pursue a position in another parish. In the weeks to come, there will be an opportunity to offer any personal notes of gratitude to Doreen O'Leary you may wish to share with her. Please consult the bulletin next week for more information.

Finally, I would ask each of you to pray for the success of our new Collaborative programs and help us together as a community discover the best way to hand on the gift of faith that we have been given to the next generation as we move deeper into the 21st century. We can all take encouragement from the example of St. Paul who used every technological and cultural advantage of his time: Roman roads, Greek "arenas" of public debate and the mail system, to reach people and further the Gospel message. He wasn't afraid to try new things and use any advantage (his own Roman citizenship, for instance) to spread the Good News and promote the Kingdom of God. While I am not sure that St. Paul would be all that amused with his appliances conversing with one another through the "internet of things," I am quite certain his Twitter account would be epic!

May the Lord work powerfully through our collective effort to spread the Gospel in our time and place! May God bring to fulfillment the good work that He has begun in our midst.

Say No to Roe

Many people may not be informed of this latest bill being proposed by Massachusetts lawmakers. This bill, The Roe Act S1902/H 3320 is due to be voted upon soon. "The Roe Act" overhauls the abortion code contained in Massachusetts General Law thus creating a right to unrestricted abortion. (*Dr. David Franks of masscitizensforlife.org*)

What does this mean? Why should we be concerned?

- Eliminates parental consent requirements for minor girls seeking an abortion
- Expands taxpayer funding of abortion
- Refuses legal protection to infants who survive an abortion thereby allowing for passive infanticide
- Eliminates the requirements that abortions after the first trimester be performed in the hospital
- Allows for late-term and full-term abortions (from masscitizensforlife.org)
