





From the Pastor

Collaborative Pastoral Plan Update 2017–2019

Dear Parishioners,

In 2015, the **Holy Redeemer / Immaculate Conception (HRIC) Collaborative** was established as part of the broader initiative within the Archdiocese of Boston called, "Disciples in Mission." The Collaborative was created to share certain clergy and lay staffing resources among the two parishes to enable their continuation until financial and human resources will hopefully allow for their eventual return to independence. The Archdiocese charged the parishes with developing a Pastoral Plan to provide a vision for the parishes over the coming 3 years.



As we advance the calendar to 2020, we move into the third year of implementing our HRIC Pastoral Plan. For the last two years, the focus has been on the Plan's four priorities:

- **Welcoming**—to create a more inviting and welcoming environment and to provide fellowship opportunities and visibility within HRIC and our surrounding communities
- **Intentional Disciples**—to enhance and enrich our faith life and to help us become more intentional and confident in sharing our faith and in following Christ
- **Vocations**—to raise awareness of the need for priestly vocations and to create an environment which fosters all vocations including religious life and laity
- **Service & Ministry**—to encourage active participation in ministries and community initiatives and to foster a culture of service and outreach

Thanks to the diligence of the priority teams and all of you, we are advancing our goals. In sharing this update, you will get a sense of only a small example of the "fruits of this labor," which supplements the work of the many ministries at both Holy Redeemer and Immaculate Conception.

Welcoming Outreach: A welcoming brochure was developed for all churches, and a new parishioner welcoming packet is underway to introduce new parishioners and visitors to the offerings of our parishes.

Engagement & Fellowship: The new Ministry Directory is a standing invitation to each parishioner to participate in our 30+ ministries. Parishioners enjoy fellowship at IC monthly coffee hours, as well as at the ongoing Nativity coffee hours.

Community Outreach and Service: Local hotels and inns are stocked with welcoming brochures and Mass schedules, inviting guests to worship with us. We are engaged with the community during Newburyport's Yankee Homecoming celebration through the annual berry festival, houseboat raffle, and parade viewing stand and Pennies for Poverty collection.

Building Faith Sharing Communities: Encouraging a renewed focus on Scripture to enrich our prayer lives, a

guide to daily Scripture Readings is published in the weekly bulletin. Parishioners have been introduced to Lectio Divina to help reflect on Scripture individually and in small groups.

Lifelong Faith Formation: The three-part *Christlife* series was introduced to invite participants to deepen their relationship with the Lord. To date, *Discovering Christ* and *Following Christ* continue to enjoy robust participation. Parishioners also have access to *FORMED*, an online gateway to Catholic content in movies, books, videos, and articles.

Increasing Vocation Awareness: The YOLO banners “you only live once, make it holy,” installed in each of the Churches, remind us of the importance of answering our personal vocation call. The fall bulletin insert for National Vocation Awareness week urges us to create environments within our parishes and homes which foster vocations, particularly to the priesthood.

Serving our Churches: A call was initiated for adult altar servers and saw a significant response. Serving at the Table of the Lord is a privilege for both youth and adults and ensures clergy have the full complement of assistance at each Mass.

Increase in Ministry Volunteers: Our ministries are all fueled by the time, energy, and talents of volunteers. Your work has been instrumental in attracting over 50 new volunteers as lectors, extraordinary ministers, and music! The monthly bulletin column, “*Meet the Ministry*,” highlights the work of all the HRIC ministries to introduce and encourage participation.

Community Collaboration: HRIC parishioners once again took part in the annual care packs for the homeless program. Over 350 supply packages were delivered for distribution through the YWCA, Community Service, the Pelican Fund, Lazarus House, St. Vincent de Paul, and Pettengill House.

These efforts are works in progress. They have motivated us to be intentional about service within our parishes and the greater community, as well as individual discipleship and personal vocation discernment—all within an environment where “All Are Welcome.”

Looking forward, I am filled with hope that the Holy Spirit is leading us toward fulfilling our Collaborative Purpose: “... to become ever more intentional disciples of Christ by using our diverse talents and shared love for God to enliven our faith community and enrich those we are called to serve.”

As we come to the close of the first term of the Plan, I will be asking for input on how to “refresh” these priorities to respond to our continuing needs. I encourage you to become familiar with the details of the Pastoral Plan on our website (www.hriccatholic.org). As you discern where God is calling you on your own faith journey, I hope you will consider joining in this work to enliven and enrich our parish communities with your time and talent.

Putting on the Mind of Christ

Putting on the mind of Christ requires spending time with Christ, getting to know him, learning from him, and letting him lead and change you. During retreat time, through prayer, reading, reflection, group sharing, and individual spiritual direction you will explore following Christ's path of self-giving love as a way to share the mind of Christ.

This nearby, five week retreat is designed to be both affordable and convenient for you. It will begin with a group meeting Thursday, February 20 to discuss the retreat's theme and prepare participants for a Lenten journey with Christ.

The group will meet again during the third week to share reflections and responses to material read and support each other as the retreat continues.

As we approach Holy Week, the closing meeting, during the fifth week, will provide an opportunity for you and others to share the fruits of retreat, continued desires, and your response to Christ's invitation to follow his path of self-giving love.

During the five weeks of retreat you will have opportunities for four individual one-hour sessions of spiritual direction scheduled at your convenience.

Exploring Jesus' path of self-giving love during Lent may encourage you to follow Christ to his death on the cross, his salvific act of self-giving love, enter into the Paschal Mystery, and celebrate your own rebirth in Christ on Easter.
