From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

As we Christians celebrate our most sacred holy days of the year, our Jewish brothers and sisters are also engaged in their traditional celebration of Passover. During the Seder Supper, the ritual meal is marked by what is



called the "Ma Nistana" or four questions, traditionally asked by the youngest child. These begin with "Why is tonight different from all other nights?" For the Jews, these are directed at various peculiarities about what makes this meal so special and different from other meals. Focusing on the ritual actions of dipping and reclining, sharing matzos and roasted meats or vegetables, the great story of Passover—of God's deliverance of the Israelites from slavery to freedom—is told and retold with passion and reverence each year.

This Easter, we might ask ourselves the same question: Why is this day / night different from all others? In years past, our answers might well have delved deep into theology and liturgy, expressing in our own ritual moments the saving actions of Jesus Christ's Passion, Death, and Resurrection. have a whole library in our Pastoral Center full of books that will explore every aspect of this central mystery of our faith. There are even two books on the shelf entitled *Jesus* and *Christ* respectively. Big, thick books. That's how deep you can go, if you wish. Any parishioner from our Collaborative is welcome to explore them, take them home, digest them, ponder their words, and consider their meaning.

But I suspect most will approach the answer to the question of why is this day or night different from any other with the fact that we are sitting home considering these most sacred days, rather than gathering in our churches and joyfully celebrating our ancient rituals. If all goes well, we can livestream a Mass from our computer or device. But this year, this is just so different! Our theology will remind us that as a Christian community we offer together the "Sacrifice of the Mass," meaning that when we come together to celebrate the Eucharist we come into communion with the actual, singular sacrifice that Christ offered on the Cross. That one, ultimate, sacrifice becomes real and true for us in the present moment. When we share the fruits of that Mass, namely in Holy Communion, our sins are forgiven. This is why a "live" Mass is always better than a Communion service or other prayer moment. How ironic, then, on this night and day which are different from all others, which is our ultimate moment of celebrating and

basking in the joy of our salvation in Christ, we can neither gather with one another nor share in the Bread of Life or the Chalice of Salvation. This year we hunger and thirst unlike any other!

You might wonder how we priests are trying to make sense of all of this. We wonder that too! The other night, however, I was sitting with Fr. George, when he began to offer a quote from the Book of Esther when Esther, as queen, was challenged by her stepfather to lead the Israelite people in a time of great persecution: "Who knows but that it was for a time like this that you obtained the royal dignity?" (Esther 4:14) We pondered whether it was for a time like this-a pandemic-that each of us: priest and layperson alike, were baptized and welcomed into the royal priesthood of Jesus Christ to weather this viral storm and remain faithful in the midst of being deprived of the very heart of our external devotions to the Lord. Is our faith strong enough to endure during a few months of desert and privation? Are we confident enough in our relationship to Christ that absence makes our hearts only grow more devoted to seeking the holy? Is a time of crisis not a waking call to serve the Lord even more faithfully in our love for neighbor? Is it not for exactly like a time such as this that each of us were sealed in the Holy Spirit for the sacrificial acts of love that have been the hallmark of the Christian Church from the very beginning?

Maybe it is for exactly a moment like this that God has brought us to this time and place to give witness to our faith!

In times of great suffering, there is great love, because love comes from the presence of Christ in our midst. Look for Him in our brothers and sisters who have been infected. Look for Him in those who cower in fear. Look for Him in those who have no hope. Look for Him in those who mourn. Look for Him in the absence of what has been so familiar. He is there. You will find Him alive and well in those who believe. Because Church is not about a building or flowers or banners or music or all the finery that we cling to and long for on this Easter day...it is first and foremost about those who persistently and obstinately believe that Jesus rose from the dead and all who believe in Him might find life in the midst of death.

We could gather by the hundreds, we could gather by the thousands, we could gather by the thousands and even millions to proclaim this truth to the world. We have and we will. But tonight, today, gathered around our devices, physically-distanced from one another, segregated into our homes...let us remind each other why this moment is different from all others. Remind your family, your spouse, your children or simply just remind yourself: that Jesus rose from the dead and that we have new life in His name. Because on this holy day, nothing else will make more of a difference in our lives and world than this simple truth. On it hinges everything else that we do in love and service to our God and those around us. Let us rejoice and be glad that God has saved us!

weeks worth of work was gathered and cued up to be ready to go at a moment's notice. The Technology Team scheduled additional training sessions with students and teachers for review sessions and introduced log on procedures for digital tools that would be beneficial for an at-home learning dynamic. Families were asked to think about the stress that home computers and devices would endure if everyone were at home working and learning. When the decision was made to close the IC, the teachers didn't miss a beat and rolled right into posting online assignments which included video messages of daily prayer. The first week was amazing, exhausting, impressive, and a total team effort by our entire IC community. We adjusted with every new day and supported each other through positive communication.
