From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

As we celebrate our annual Independence Day holiday this weekend, I think back to many July 4th holidays of years' past. I recall spending one moment on a boat anchored in the Charles River right off of the Hatch Shell enjoying the traditional July 4th concert by the Boston Pops. It was memorable not only because of the fireworks and the thrill of being part of such a beloved Boston celebration, but also because a B-2 stealth bomber flew right over us, barely higher than the city skyline. It was big and loud and looked so cumbersome in the evening sky. There was nothing stealthy about it at all, at least on that evening: big, dark, fat, bat-like thing that it was. I remember praying never to be on the "business end" of the ugly thing! Years ago, I have spent this holiday in uniform while I was part of a Chaplain's program in the Navy, enjoying the rows upon rows of pennant-flying ships at anchor, plenty of fireworks and delightful evening concerts on various military bases. The military does July 4th so well!



I have also spent this holiday on the beach at Cape Cod with friends, enjoying numerous small-town parades and, of course, at many backyard barbecues throughout New England over the years. It is all good. One of the things that I do every year is spend time reading the Declaration of Independence, which is usually printed somewhere in the local paper. It is good to ponder the reasons for and roots of our nation's existence. In the sober light of history, we know that no nation has ever achieved perfection in its system of government, nor should we look with rose-colored glasses on our own country's past. A time-honored hymn that we often sing in church on this weekend captures the dynamic tension that our republic sometimes embodies:

"America! America! God shed his grace on thee, And crown thy good with brotherhood From sea to shining sea," the hymn beckons to us, but also continues with a lament and a prayer: "America! America! God mend thine ev'ry flaw," and, "America! America! May God thy gold refine, Till all success be nobleness, And ev'ry gain divine."

It is a gentle but potent reminder that we are a work-in-progress, that what we love and celebrate about our country must never be taken for granted nor ever presumed to be enjoyed by all. This holiday calls us, I think, to be grateful for the blessings of liberty and freedom and at the very same time, to be vigilant and proactive in protecting these gifts among us and promoting them for those who do not yet enjoy their fullness. Our nation is at its best when we recognize our dependency on God's goodness and His providence. When we see our country's life lived in concert with God's love for all, we achieve our greatest good. From the Collect prayer of the Mass for a Nation (from the Roman Missal), which is often celebrated on this holiday when it does not fall on a weekend, the Church prays: "O God, who arrange all things according to a wonderful

Holy Communion in the Hand

Although most of the COVID-related restrictions at Mass have been lifted in recent weeks, one thing we are still being asked to do by the Archdiocese is to *receive Holy Communion only in the hand*. When Holy Communion is received on the tongue, it is very likely that the communicant will breathe on the hands of the priest or minister. It is very possible that small droplets of saliva or mucus from the mouth or lungs (which could contain COVID) could be transferred onto the hands of those distributing Communion and possibly passed on to others.

It is for this reason that those distributing Communion would be required to stop and sanitize their hands after every person whom they gave Communion to on the tongue. If we had to do this for everyone, the Communion procession would take an inordinate amount of time and become hopelessly cumbersome. So at this time everyone is being asked to only receive Communion in the hand. This is a temporary restriction that likely will be lifted in the months to come. Thank you for your patience and cooperation as we continue to recover from the pandemic.

design, graciously receive the prayers we pour out to you for our country, that, through the wisdom of its leaders and the integrity of its citizens, harmony and justice may be assured and lasting prosperity come with peace." It is a beautiful vision of cooperation with the Divine and a profound respect for dignity of human life as brought forth by our Creator.

While we have gone to great lengths from the writing of our Constitution forward to ensure that no particular religion be established above another nor enshrined in our government, our nation has never been envisioned to be devoid of citizens of faith nor seen to be without a healthy partnership with God, even if God is defined only as a higher power or First-Mover. Our nation exists and persists because of God's goodness. Therefore our duty as citizens of faith is to do everything within our power to make America the best she can be, for everyone.

The Declaration of Independence contains these famous words: "We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty and the pursuit of Happiness." As faith-filled citizens, how do we work to promote true equality among one another? Whose voices dominate our many national conversations...and whose are never heard? Who holds the reins of power and who are the powerless? Who are the privileged among us and who are at a disadvantage when compared to the whole? What can be done about it? How do we protect and defend the dignity of human life in our land and abroad? Where is human life in jeopardy and what can be done to eliminate those threats when and where they are found? How do we use our words and what categories do we place others in when we think of what constitutes human life? What does it mean to be free? How do we best exercise our individual liberty in relationship to the needs of others? What does it mean to pursue happiness in this modern age? How are we truly happy? Do we believe the words of St. Paul, who writes: "But our citizenship is in heaven, and from it we also await a savior, the Lord Jesus Christ." (Phil 3:20)? How do we balance our ultimate happiness with God in Heaven with that pursuit of happiness in this present age?

So many questions...sometimes not enough answers! But it is good to ask the questions and to continue to do so for the benefit of our nation and world. If others before us had not questioned the established order, had not pushed-back against injustice...our country may never have come to birth and our world, I think, would be the lesser for it. This weekend, let us pray that we may work together in communion with the Lord that these United States of America may be everything it can be before God and the world. Whether that is celebrated with fireworks, concerts and great fanfare or simply with the inner joy that comes from doing what is right and just, may we mark this national anniversary in peace. (OK, and maybe with a little BBQ as well!)


